# **I.**

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that it had come to his knowledge that the University had taken a legal opinion regarding reservation of a single post.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the single post would be reserved wherever possible.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that single post could not be reserved.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that in 1995 the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India gave a judgement in the case of PGI that single post cannot be reserved. But later on in 1997, a 5-Judge Bench of the Hon'ble Supreme Court overruled the aforementioned decision and said that even the single post could also be reserved.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that probably 2-3 persons had gone to the court and the court has perhaps passed orders, but in spite of court order, the interviews have not been held because the court had said that they should call the general category candidates for the interviews.

Continuing, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that since an irregularity had been committed, justice has to be done to those, who in fact are the applicant and belonged to general category. He said that some of the posts of Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital have been advertised. He pleaded that the remaining vacant posts should also be advertised and interviews conducted.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that the Vice-Chancellor had constituted a Committee, under the chairmanship of Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath, but since a copy of the report had not been supplied to them, they did not know the outcome of the case.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.**

The Vice-Chancellor said that there existed a provision for re-employment of teaching staff of the University, whereas there is no provision for re-employment of non-teaching staff.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that though there is no provision for re-employment of teachers under the Regulations/Rules of the Punjab Government/U.G.C., the University had made provision for their re-employment. Since a large number of non-teaching



employees had retired and there is an acute shortage of staff in the University, the provision should be made for their re-employment.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that the Regulations of the University did not forbid re-employment of non-teaching staff. They had already given re-employment as per requirement to the teaching as well as non-teaching staff.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.**

**RESOLVED:** That the information contained in **Items R-1 to R-11** on the agenda, be ratified.

**NOTE:** The Colleges will pay salary as per University Grants Commission norms to NET cleared candidates and ₹25,800/- to those who have not cleared NET, where NET qualified candidates are not available.

Referring to **Sub-Item C-2.1**, Principal Narinder Singh Sidhu stated that funds for running Add-On Courses in the Colleges were provided by the U.G.C. The University is asking the Colleges to pay salary as per University Grants Commission norms to NET cleared candidates and ₹25,800/- to those who have not cleared NET, where NET qualified candidates are not available. He said that, under the U.G.C. norms, there is

also a provision for appointment of guest faculty for teaching these courses. He pleaded that the Colleges should be allowed to appoint guest faculty as per the U.G.C. norms.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that the U.G.C., through its letter dated 10.3.2010, had revised the rates of qualified guest faculty from Rs.250/- per lecture to Rs.1000/- per lecture.

The Vice-Chancellor said that a Committee had already been constituted by him to look into all these aspects and the report of the Committee is still awaited.

Dr. P.S. Gill said that most of the affiliated Colleges are not paying full salaries to the teachers.

The Vice-Chancellor said that most of the problems regarding payment of less salary to the teachers had been solved. About 35 affiliated Colleges had submitted affidavits with the University that they are paying salaries to the teachers as per U.G.C. norms.

Referring to the recommendation of the Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 regarding qualifications for the post of Principals in the Colleges of Education, Principal S.S. Sangha said that a condition had been laid down that the candidate should have 10 years teaching experience out of which at least 5 years teaching experience should be in a Secondary Teacher Education Institution. The recommendation is silent about from where the rest of the experience is required to be obtained. Referring to page 48 of the Appendix, he said that the University had adopted the NCTE norms in toto.

**RESOLVED:** That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in Item C-2.1 on the agenda, be approved.

**VII.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-2.1** on the agenda was read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

**C-2.2** That since the decision of the Syndicate dated 23.5.2003 (Para 8) and Senate dated 12.10.2003 (Para XV) was only for the University Teaching Departments, the cases which had been received/are to be received in future from the affiliated Colleges in the office, where single person has been interviewed and recommended by the Selection Committees for the posts of Principal/Lecturer in the Colleges, be processed for approval.

**VIII.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-2.1** on the agenda was read out, viz. –

**C-2.3** That the recommendations of the Committee dated 15.11.2010 with regard to granting affiliation/extension of affiliation 'for the session' instead of 'with effect from the session' as was decided by the Syndicate at its meeting held on 2.8.2009 and the Colleges of Education have challenged this decision in the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, be approved.

**(Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 Para 28)**

**Referring to Sub-Item C-2.3**, Principal S.S. Sangha said that, in fact, the Colleges had challenged in the Court the decision of the University that affiliation be granted for the session only instead of w.e.f. the session and the Committee has

recommended adoption of the orders of the Court. He further said that there is a provision in the University Calendar that after running a course for 3 years, the College should apply for permanent affiliation.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that University could grant permanent affiliation only if the College/s asked for the same. If the College pay the fee prescribed for grant of permanent affiliation, the College concerned should be evaluated for grant of permanent affiliation and if fulfilled the condition, permanent affiliation should be granted.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that time and again he had said that the Panjab University Act as well as Regulations are clear about the procedure for grant of affiliation to the Colleges. But he was sorry to point out that neither the provisions of the Act nor of the Regulations were being followed. Everybody would agree with him that Regulation/s could not be enacted contrary to the Act and similarly Rules could not be framed inconsistent with the Regulations. Regulations clearly specify that the last date for receipt of application from the Colleges for grant of affiliation and extension of affiliation is 1<sup>st</sup> October and 1<sup>st</sup> November, respectively, of the year preceding the one in which it is proposed to start the classes. There is a provision that the Syndicate might, for special reasons, entertain such application after the last date, if it is late not more than 15 days. After this, no application could be entertained. Further, the application for grant of affiliation and the recommendations of the Syndicate thereon shall be placed before the Senate by the 31<sup>st</sup> of March in accordance with Section 27 of the Panjab University Act. After these dates, no application could be entertained, whereas the University had entertained several applications beyond these dates. Now, under the garb of orders of the Court, certain other dates for receipt of application from the Colleges have been fixed. Instead of fixing other dates for receipt of application for affiliation from the Colleges violating the Regulations, University should amend the Regulations.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that if it is written in the Act that application/s received after the specified date/s should be rejected, they could not entertain those applications.

Principal Tejinder Kaur said that the University constitutes the Inspection Committees either in the month of February or March or even April, whereas the Colleges were required to apply by 31<sup>st</sup> of October, which is much earlier.

Principal Gurdip Sharma suggested that the Inspection Committees should be appointed by 15<sup>th</sup> of January so that the reports are submitted and considered by the Senate by 31<sup>st</sup> March.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the Inspection Committees should submit their reports in the University office by 30<sup>th</sup> April 2011, under all circumstances. However, from next year, they would strictly follow the Calendar. In case any College did not invite/give date for inspection, the matter should be reported to him.**

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that as per Act, the power to grant affiliation is not vested with the Senate. In fact, the Act says that –

- “(2) On receipt of a letter of application under Sub-Section (1), the Syndicate shall –
  - (a) Direct a local inquiry to be made by a competent person authorized by the Syndicate in this behalf;
  - (b) Make such further inquiry as may appear to them to be necessary; and

- (c) Report to the Senate on the question whether the application should be granted or refused, either in whole or in part, embodying in such report the results of any inquiry under clauses (a) and (b).

And the Senate shall, after such further inquiry (if any) as may appear to them to be necessary record their opinion on the matter.

- (3) The Registrar shall submit the application and all proceedings of the Syndicate and Senate relating thereto to the Government, who, after such further inquiry as may appear to them to be necessary, shall grant or refuse the application or any part thereof.”

Meaning thereby, the Senate had no authority to grant affiliation/extension of affiliation to the College and authority is vested with the Government of India. If any change is desired, the Act and Regulations should be got amended from the Government of India.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that this was the reason for getting NOC from the Government.

Shri Jarnail Singh clarified that when a College has applied for grant of affiliation/extension of affiliation, it means that it is ready for inspection at any time. Therefore, there is no need to seek date from the College for inspection by the Committee.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Chairman of the Inspection Committee should fix the date of visit in consultation with the other members of the Committee and convey the same to the College.

Shri Gurdip Singh remarked that a Clerk of D.A.V. College for Women, Ferozepur, had committed suicide due to over workload. He pleaded that an enquiry should be conducted and the Colleges be asked to appoint sufficient number of non-teaching staff.

Dr. Rabinder Nath Sharma said that the University had constituted a Committee to look into the issue of removal of Dr. Dinesh Sharma from the duty of Centre Superintendent. As far as he knew, till date no meeting of the Committee has been held. This has come to his knowledge when he, along with Professor Sudesh Khanduja, visited D.A.V. College for Women, Ferozepur City, for grant of affiliation for M.Sc. Mathematics.

**RESOLVED:** That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-2.3** on the agenda, be approved.

Shri Harpreet Singh Dua said that in the last meeting of the Senate, he had raised the issue of Shree Atam Vallabh Jain College, which did not have requisite land for running a College.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the issue regarding grant of affiliation to Shree Atam Vallabh Jain College, which did not have requisite land, was a scandalous one as the College had already got affiliation from Punjab Technical University on the basis of same land and infrastructure which is being shown to the Panjab University. The College is running M.B.A., B.C.A. & B.B.A. courses, which according to AICTE norms require at least 2.5 acre land and the remaining land with the College is about 3.86 acre and the University could not grant affiliation to the College with such less land. He was of the view that there is no need to send a Committee to take assessment of the whole situation, as the information about on what basis the College had been granted affiliation could be had from the Punjab Technical University, under RTI Act.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar pointed out that it had been passed by the Senate that D.P.Es. would be designated as Lecturers, but till date no College has designated the D.P.E. as Lecturer.

₹25,800/- to those where NET qualified candidates are not available.

2. The Vice-Chancellor, while considering the extension of affiliation to the above College has sternly warned the College to follow the University Rules/ Regulations in letter and spirit. Any action on the part of the College, if taken, in violation of the Rules/Regulations shall be deemed to be illegal and arbitrary finding no favour with the University in future.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 Para 43(xvi))**

**R-2.7** That the Vice-Chancellor, subject to and in anticipation approval of the Syndicate/Senate has granted provisional extension of affiliation to Government Postgraduate College, Sector-11, Chandigarh for (i) M.A.-II (Punjabi)-25, (ii) M.P.Ed.-II-30 seats and (iii) B.Sc.-II (Bio-Technology) and Microbiology)-Elective for the session 2010-2011, subject to fulfilment of the condition (if any) as listed in the Inspection Report and with the condition that the College will follow the other Instructions/ guidelines of the Panjab University/U.T. Administration, Chandigarh.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 Para 43(xvii))**

Referring to **Sub-Item R-2.5**, Shri Harpreet Singh Dua pointed out that there were certain irregularities in the grant of affiliation to Swami Ganga Giri Janta Girls College, Raekot, District Ludhiana. In fact, the first Inspection Committee headed by Principal Ravinder Kaur did not recommend grant of affiliation to this College for B.Com. 100 seats. Whereas, the College had already admitted 200 students to B.Com. course. There are only two teachers against the sanctioned provision of 14 teachers. He was pained to point out that the first Inspection Committee submitted its report after a period of one year, whereas the validity of the Committee is for six months only.

Dr. Ravinder Kaur said that she along with two nominees of the D.P.I. (Colleges), Punjab, inspected the Sadbhawana College of Education, Raikot, but the College Management made a complaint against the Inspection Committee. Thereafter, another Inspection Committee was constituted which visited the College. She felt pained as her credibility had been doubted.

Principal S.S. Sangha said that he was also one of the members of the Inspection Committee which went to Sadbhawana College of Education, Raikot, for providing permanent affiliation. First of all, the College Management did not give them time for the visit. He wondered when the Committee visited the College, there were signatures of three different persons as the Principals on record, but actually there was no Principal in the College. He said that only twenty students were there and when they questioned them as to how much fee was being charged from them, they informed that they were



being charged Rs.60,000/- against actual fee of Rs.40,000/-. They also gathered information that about 50 per cent of the students were not attending classes and their proxy attendance was being marked by the College by charging a sum between Rs.80,000/- and Rs.85,000/-. An F.I.R. in this regard had also been lodged against the College Management in Jalaldiwala Police Station.

Principal Surjit Singh Randhawa informed that the College was given affiliation by the orders of the Hon'ble Punjab and Haryana High Court.

Ms. Jasvir Kaur Chahal said that since this College is habitual offender, the N.C.T.E. had already disaffiliated it.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu said that Vice-Chancellor should himself visit the College to verify the actual position.

Principal Hardiljit Singh Gosal said that there were signatures of three different Principals in the College on record but actually there was no Principal. One person, who went there as a member of the Inspection Committee, had also marked his/her attendance as Principal in the College.

Principal Tejinder Kaur wanted to know, when the post of Principal has been advertised, how the Principal was present there?

Shri Ashok Goyal said that if it is true then it is a very serious matter. Dean, College Development Council, should clarify the issue as it had serious reflection on the functioning of the University.

Professor Naval Kishore, Dean College Development Council, informed that two Inspection Committees were formed. One Inspection Committee submitted its report on 7.01.2011 and the other on 15.1.2011 after a period of one year. The Committees visited Sadhbhavna College of Education, Raikot and Tagore College on 29.5.2009. The Committee had reported that Provident Fund was being deducted as per University Rules/Regulations. There is a Principal and 7 Lecturers in Sadhbhavna College of Education and a Principal & 14 Lecturers in Tagore College. These Colleges were not paying salary to the staff as per U.G.C. norms, but the Committee is silent about this. The Inspection Committee had recommended grant of affiliation to Sadhbhavna College of Education with certain conditions, that too, w.e.f. new academic session. In fact, there was no Principal in Sadhbhavna College of Education, whereas the College is saying that Shri Surinder Kumar Arora is their regular approved Principal. Shri Mishra, who was also a member of the Committee, joined as Principal (on Sunday) without the approval of the management of the College. It is pertinent to mention here that the Inspection Committee had remarked that the College could not be granted affiliation for B.Ed. course. He clarified that the 2<sup>nd</sup> Inspection Committee was constituted after taking note of the observations made by the office.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu suggested that the College should be disaffiliated.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the entire case is before the Senate and a uniform decision should be taken.

Shri Jarnail Singh suggested that the functioning of all the Colleges of Education should be got assessed.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that it is a matter of concern as to how the complainant got the copies of the Inspection Reports of the above-said two different Colleges and different dates? The Inspection Reports of these Colleges got together only in the office of the Panjab University. Only one member is common in both the Inspection Committees and unfortunately she happens to be the member of the Senate. When the Inspection Committee was constituted she was a member of the Syndicate. As far as Calendar of

the University is concerned, there is a procedure for applying for grant of affiliation/extension of affiliation to the Colleges, including where the Inspection Report is to be submitted. Whether the Inspection Reports had reached the Registrar or the Syndicate? But as per his information, the Inspection Reports had neither reached the Registrar nor the Syndicate. On the basis of the complaint, even without verifying the facts as told by the Dean, College Development Council, there were 14 lecturers in a College. The members of the Syndicate and Senate had taken a conscious decision that for 100 seats, the College is required to have one Principal and three approved lecturers or four approved lecturers and for 200 seats, one Principal and seven approved lecturers. Since the College did not have requisite number of lecturers, the Inspection Committee had not done anything wrong by not recommending the affiliation. Last year only, the N.C.T.E. had withdrawn its approval for 100 seats or may be 200 seats but the College got stay orders from Punjab & Haryana High Court and made admissions. Since the N.C.T.E. had withdrawn affiliation, how the University sent its Inspection Committee to such a College? Despite all this, a letter was written by the D.R. (Colleges) to a member of the Senate, who happens to be a member of the Inspection Committee for both the Colleges. The letter says,

“.....The first Inspection Committee has unanimously recommended that grant of extension of affiliation for the session 2010-11 to Sadhbhavna College of Education for Women, Raikot, be **not** granted. The second Committee unanimously recommended that grant of extension of affiliation for the session 2010-11 to Tagore College of Education, Fatehgarh, be granted with the following conditions to be implemented before the start of the new academic session 2011-12:

- (i) Salary be given as per U.G.C./PU norms.
- (ii) Provident Fund be deducted from the salaries of the teaching and non-teaching staff.
- (iii) Appointment of faculty as per NCTE norms.

Dr. Ravinder Kaur (Fellow) is convener in the first Inspection Committee and subject expert in the second Inspection Committee. On going through the Inspection Reports, it has been observed that deficiencies pointed out by both the Committees to be complied with by the said two Colleges are almost same, whereas different parameters have been followed while giving recommendations. Letters were issued to conduct the inspection at Sadhbhavna College of Education for Women, Raikot, in the month of January 2010 whereas the inspections have been conducted in the month of January 2011, i.e. after one year when the admissions had already been made by the Colleges in July/August. The recommendations have been made not to grant extension of affiliation for B.Ed. course which is being run since 2006-2007 on the contrary grant of extension of affiliation has been recommended to Tagore College of Education, Fatehgar, with the same deficiencies to be complied by the College before the start of next academic session, i.e. 2011-12.

You are, therefore, requested to justify within 7 days the different parameters taken into consideration with the deficiencies to be almost the same sidelining the NCTE rules and not making recommendations as per NCTE rules (adopted by the University). Your comments must be signed by all the other members of the Inspection Committee who visited the College under reference on 07.01.2011.”

While going through the report it could be observed that different parameters had been followed, ignoring the N.C.T.E. rules adopted by the University, while giving recommendations though the deficiencies on the part of both the Colleges were almost the same. The Deputy Registrar (Colleges) had desired that the comments of Principal (Dr.) Ravinder Kaur, signed by all other members of the Inspection Committee which visited the College on 7<sup>th</sup> January 2011 be submitted as if her reply would not be relied upon. In fact, the Deputy Registrar (Colleges) had doubted the integrity of a member of the Syndicate and Senate. See the greatness of Principal Ravinder Kaur that she approached all the members of the Committee and visited different places to get the signatures of the Committee members. Had the Syndicate/Senate allowed the Deputy Registrars to seek explanation of the members of the Senate? Since their integrity has been doubted, he was sure that none of the members would go to any College as member of the Inspection Committee. What he could get is that there is one major differences: for one College the Inspection Committee was for grant of affiliation for 200 seats and in case of other College, it was for 100 seats. To justify their position, the Colleges showed copy of the advertisement. In fact, the credentials of the Chairman of the Management Committee needed to be checked. He pleaded that another Committee should be constituted to review the case in totality. He further stated that the University should enquire whether all the affiliated Colleges, including Colleges of Education, are deducting provident fund from the salary of their staff as per University regulations/rules. Similarly, it should also be enquired whether the persons appointed as Principals and teachers fulfilled the requisite qualifications for their respective course as per U.G.C. norms. The Management Committee of one of the College had gone to the extent that if the member is able to convince the Inspection Committee and the Committee submitted positive recommendations for grant of affiliation to the College, he/she would be appointed as Principal of the College. But he knew that though the demand of the member concerned was met, still the Committee made negative recommendations. Saying of the Principal that the Inspection Committee should seek his permission before visiting his College, was not appropriate because the Inspection Committee worked under the directions of the Vice-Chancellor and not under the Principal/ Management of the Colleges. The University took action by listening only to the one party and did not bother to listen to the members of the Inspection Committee. He has filed a complaint and to prove his point he got nomination of the same very person for election to the Postgraduate Board of Studies. Just to prove that the Principal was there. He requested a member of the Senate to nominate that Principal and when the member of the Senate refused to put his signature on the proposal in the absence of the signature of the candidate, he said that don't worry the person concerned would reach there by 4.30 p.m. Sir, you would be surprised to know that in spite of the fact that he did not sign his nomination form his name was there in the final list of nomination. It was a matter of serious concern that how the copies of the two Inspection Reports reached the habitual complainant and how such an action was initiated against the Hon'ble Member of the Senate. He pleaded that a Committee should be constituted to enquire into as to how that man has played fraud with the University without getting approval from N.C.T.E./getting an Inspection Committee appointed by the University.

Continuing, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that one of the Principals has complained to the Controller of Examinations about certain irregularities being committed by a particular person, who had acted as Superintendent of an Examination Centre. When a member of the Syndicate raised the issue in the meeting, though the item was not on the agenda, the Vice-Chancellor assured that a Committee would be constituted to enquire into the matter. The Committee constituted for the purpose had visited the College but report is yet to be submitted. A member of the Senate had been written to that he/she is directed to appear before the Committee to explain his/her position. They should see how the branches of the University are functioning, examinations are conducted and how decisions, which are not within the rules/regulations of the University, are being taken by the Syndicate/Senate deliberately. He proposed that if the College had been disaffiliated by the N.C.T.E. or not granted affiliation by the N.C.T.E., the College should be disaffiliated by the University and an enquiry should be instituted to enquire into as to how he has levelled such allegations against a member of the Inspection Committee. An

enquiry should also be conducted as under what authority the Deputy Registrar (College) had sought explanation from a member of the Senate.

Principal S.S. Sangha pointed out that attendance of three different Principals are in the records of the College, though not even a single notice regarding officiating arrangement of the Principal had been issued by the College Management.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that, in fact, last year admissions in the College were made by the order of the Court. He did not know whether the University had filed reply in the Court, what mechanism existed in the University regarding the court cases; what for a long panel of advocates was there in the University; and what for a huge payment was being made to them? He, however, observed that the University failed to file reply in majority of the cases as it did not have proper legal system. Introspection is required to be carried out as to why majority of the cases of the University fall flat in the court. The University did not have any specific information regarding hearing of the University cases in the court. As such, the University is very weak as far as legal system is concerned.

Referring to suspension of approval by the N.C.T.E. to the College, Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that they must be informed about the orders of the Court as they did not know whether the Court had stayed the orders of the N.C.T.E. or the admission by the College. It has been reported that seven approved lecturers are there in the College, which are in accordance with the norms laid down by the University. If any fraud has been committed by the College, action should be taken against it.

Shri V.K. Sibal observed that since the matter is not on the agenda and he was not aware of the matter at all, he could not participate in the discussion and give his valuable suggestions. He, therefore, suggested that their deliberations should restrict only to the agenda. However if there is any serious matter, the same should be looked into by the Vice-Chancellor himself and brought to the notice of the Syndicate and later on to the Senate, if necessary.

Principal Ravinder Kaur stated that both the Colleges were inspected by the Committee which included Professor Shakeel Mohammad Khan. In the case of one College, the representative of the Government did not turn up. She said that in case such a treatment is to be meted out to the members of the Senate, the University should not send them as members of the Inspection Committees to the Colleges.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that he would look into the file personally and thereafter the matter would be placed before the Syndicate.**

Dr. Mukesh Arora observed that in the case of Government Colleges only the D.P.I (Colleges) could seek explanation rather than the University.

**RESOLVED:** That the information contained in **Items R-2.1 to R-2.7**, on the agenda, be ratified.

## **XII.**

The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-3.1** on the agenda was read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

**C-3.1** That the recommendation of the Board of Studies in Microbiology dated 18.5.2010 approved by the Dean, Faculty of Science, regarding Rules/Regulations, number of seats, fee structure, etc. of M.Sc. (Microbial & Food Technology) effective from the admission 2010, be approved.

**(Syndicate dated 31.8.2010 Para 13)**

**XIII.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-3.2** on the agenda were read out, viz. –

**C-3.2** That the recommendation/s of the Committee dated 27.10.2010 constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to workout the modalities regarding proposal of Dr. Gurmeet Singh, Fellow to allow the regular candidates, who left the course, after marriage or a job or any other reason, to appear for the Semester Examination, even from the University School of Open Learning or as a private candidates, be approved.

**(Syndicate dated 13.12.2010 Para 5)**

Dr. Dharinder Tayal said that the students, who left the course, after marriage or on getting a job or any other reason, should be allowed to appear in the examination through the University School of Open Learning or as a private candidate, but according to which syllabus they have to appear in the examination?

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that the University had decided that anybody, who had left the course in between, could complete the course through University School of Open Learning, but he/she had to appear in the examination under latest syllabus. The University School of Open Learning would conduct PCPs and arrange notes, etc. from the concerned Department and a Cell for the purpose would be created there. Similarly, improvement has also been allowed to the students irrespective of years he/she has passed the examination provided the course was being offered by the University, but the question paper would be set as per the latest syllabus. The feasibility of the improvement under the changed/modified syllabus would also be taken into consideration. A special chance has also been given to all those students, who could not clear their reappear/compartament in permissible chances/ special chance/s earlier granted by the University, to clear their reappear/ compartament in September 2011. The fee and other modalities would be worked out later on.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal said that whatever the Vice-Chancellor has said, did not exit in Item C-3.2.

Dr. Gurmeet Singh said that earlier the students used to appear in the examination under the annual system. Now, since the semester system has been introduced and if the student appeared in the 1<sup>st</sup> year under annual system and left the course due to one reason or the other, he/she should be allowed to appear in 2<sup>nd</sup> year under Semester System.

Principal Gurdip Sharma said that it would be difficult to implement semester system in the affiliated Colleges, since most of the Colleges relieved more than 40% of the faculty by 31<sup>st</sup> of March.

**RESOLVED:** That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-3.2** on the agenda, be approved.

**XIV.** The recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Items C-3.3 to C-3.8** on the agenda were read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

**C-3.3** That Regulations for Four Year B.E. and Five Year Integrated B.E.-MBA courses being offered in UICET, UIET, SSGPURC and CCET for the session 2010-2011 and Regulations for Two Year (Four Semester) M.E. and M.Tech. courses being offered under Panjab University (Faculty of Engineering & Technology) w.e.f. academic session 2010-2011, be approved.

**(Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 Para 48)**

- C-3.4** That Regulation 28.1 (c)(i) for BDS at page 21 of Panjab University Calendar, Volume II, 2007 be amended as under and given effect to from the batch admitted in 2010 onwards, in anticipation of approval of various University bodies/Government of India/ Publication of Government of India Gazette:

	EXISTING REGULATION	PROPOSED REGULATION
28.1 (c) (i)	In the case of BDS examination, however, the grace marks shall be given up to one percent of the total marks of each subject and not up to one percent of the aggregate of all the subjects. In other words, each subject will be, for this purpose, a separate unit, and a candidate who fails in a subject by not more than one per cent of the aggregate marks of that subject may be given the required number of marks in order to pass in that subject. - (ii) the duration of the course be 4 years (3 Academic Years + 1 Year Compulsory Internship) instead of three years.
- (iii) Rules/Regulations for the course effective from the admission 2011, be approved.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 Para 13)**

- C-3.6** That a lump sum honorarium @ 1,000/- be sanctioned and paid to each of the Co-ordinator of twelve zones created for the conduct of Undergraduate Practical Examinations, March, 2011 out of the Budget head “Conduct of Exams”.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 Para 34)**

- C-3.7** That a mercy/special chance be given to the students of B.Pharm. 1<sup>st</sup> year and University Institute of Engineering & Technology to clear their re-appear examinations.

**NOTE:** 1. The Board of Control of University Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences dated 28.1.2011 has considered the request of the students and resolved that the request is not covered under the Rules/Regulations of the Panjab University.

- 2. The Dean students Welfare has recommended that a special chance to the students be given to

maintain the parity and uniformity in the University, deviation may be avoided in the best interest of the campus students and particularly the students of Department of Pharmaceutical Sciences.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 Para 35)**

**C-3.8** That the recommendations of the Committee dated 1.3.2011 with regard to cases of those candidates who appeared in one semester examination and their result is declared late original or re-evaluated.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 Para 39)**

**XV.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-3.9** on the agenda was read out, viz. –

**C-3.9** That letter No.16/2/103-IH(10)-2010/4760 dated 16.3.2010 received from Chandigarh Administration, Home Department, with regard to inclusion of all those students, who pass the qualifying examination (+2) from Union Territory, Chandigarh, for the 85% quota of the UT Pool and the necessity of having passed one lower qualifying examination and having studied for two years at Chandigarh has been removed from the policy, be adopted.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 Para 40)**

Dr. Dharinder Tayal observed that if the students, who had studied up to 10+1 anywhere in the country, but have passed +2 examination from the Union Territory of Chandigarh, are made eligible for the reserved quota of Chandigarh seats, it would be an injustice to the Chandigarh students as they would be deprived of their genuine right.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that the background of the case is that there are certain medical coaching centres in the State of Punjab, especially in Bathinda and Ludhiana. They in collaboration with the political bosses got a decision taken that only those students, who have not studied in Punjab up to +1 level, but had passed +2 examination from a School situated in Punjab, would be eligible for Punjab quota. The children of employees of Punjab & Haryana High Court are eligible for admission under Punjab quota, Haryana quota and Chandigarh quota as well. But the children of the employees of Panjab University, if they have not studied up to +2 level from schools of Punjab, are not eligible for Punjab quota. He added that more than 5000 students belonging to Chandigarh are studying in the schools situated in S.A.S. Nagar, Mohali, so that they could avail the benefit of quota reserved for Punjab students.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Panjab University has a national character and the students from all over India could take admission in it. He, however, said that the change in reserved quota for Chandigarh students had been made by the Chandigarh Administration and it would be implemented in the Institutions of the Chandigarh Administration only.

**RESOLVED:** That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-3.9** on the agenda, be approved.

At this stage, Shri Jarnail Singh said that the teachers, who had opted for examination duty in specified outside places, should only be put on examination duty in those outside places only; otherwise, there would be a lot of inconvenience to them.

**XVI.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-3.10** on the agenda was read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

**C-3.10** That the amendment in the Guidelines for admission to the Reserved Category of Sports, approved and printed in the Handbook of Information 2011 and CET prospectus.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 Para 27)**

**XVII.** The information contained in **Item I-3.1** on the agenda was read out, viz. –

**I-3.1** That –

- (i) a special chance be given to all those students, who could not clear their reappear/compartments in permissible chances/special chance/s earlier granted by the University, to clear their reappear/compartments in September 2011. The fee and other modalities would be worked out by the Vice-Chancellor later on.
- (ii) Improvement be allowed to the students at any time irrespective of years he/she passed the examination provided the course was being offered by the University, but the question paper would be set as per the latest syllabus. The modalities for the same would be worked out later on.
- (iii) The student/s, who had left the course, including Science and Professional courses, in between due to one reason or the other, be allowed to complete their course/s through University School of Open Learning and the lessons/notes for the same would be provided by the concerned department. This work would be looked after by a Cell in the USOL. The practicals, etc. of such students would be conducted by the main department. A Committee would be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to work out the modalities for the purpose.
- (iv) Any student who missed a semester examination due to shortage of lectures or other reasons, he/she should be allowed to be promoted to the next semester with the condition that he/she fulfills the condition of clearing the lower semester and appear & clear that semester when it comes.

**(Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 General Discussion (1))**

Shri Munish Verma thanked the Vice-Chancellor for giving a special chance to all those students, who could not clear their reappear/compartments in permissible chances/special chance/s earlier granted by the University, to clear their reappear/compartments in September 2011.

**Referring to recommendation (iv),** Shri Ashok Goyal enquired whether the Syndicate or the Vice-Chancellor had power to regularize the admission of Ms. Taranjit



Gill, who did not fulfil the eligibility conditions for admission to B.A. Part I, but Guru Gobind Singh College for Women, Chandigarh, had admitted her. The R&S Branch had written to the College to strike off her name from the rolls of the College and she should not be allowed to sit in the University examination in the absence of acceptance of her return (Student Return in her case). When her return was not accepted by the University, how she was allotted PUPIN. Secondly, in spite of writing a specific letter by the University, how the College allowed her to sit in the examination? How the result of the candidate was declared by the University, especially when she was not eligible for admission? Similarly, she appeared in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> year examinations and her result was also declared. After passing B.A. Part III, she got admission in a College of Education affiliated to Punjabi University, Patiala. When she applied for Migration Certificate, the University realized the fact that she was not eligible for admission to even B.A. Part I. The office note reveals that since the University had written to the College to strike off the name of the candidate, the R&S Branch is not at fault. He enquired whether information about confirmation of admission of the students is acquired from the R&S Branch before declaration of result by the Examination Branch. If information about confirmation of admission of the student in question was not sought, the responsibility lay with the Examination Branch. However, if information is sought by the Examination Branch and the R&S Branch did not provide or provide wrong information, the responsibility lay with the R&S Branch and the R&S Branch could not deny it. The Registrar had written that since the College is at fault, the matter may please be referred to the Syndicate. Firstly, the Vice-Chancellor marked the case for the Syndicate, but on second thought, he referred to the Dean, College Development Council. Over and above the remarks given by the Registrar, the Dean, College Development Council wrote that 'C' at page (N-2 – "In view of the facts given in the note and also to avoid hardship to the candidate and legal complications at the later stage, it is requested that admission of Ms. Taranjeet Kaur Gill for B.A.-I class, session 2007-08 may be allowed to be confirmed"), is purely a humanitarian ground & has got no legal sanctity as per the University rules and Regulations, which therefore needs consideration. However, 'B' on page (N-2 – "The R&S Branch is not at fault in this case as the Principal, Guru Gobind Singh College for Women, Sector 26, Chandigarh, was informed well before start of Annual Examination held in April, 2008 to struck-off her name from the roll of College under intimation to this office. It is relevant to add here that Ms. Taranjeet Kaur Gill has passed +2 examination in September 2008 (**3<sup>rd</sup> chance**")), is vital for effective administrative functioning of the University viz-a-viz the affiliated Colleges and needs to be discussed & resolved in the Syndicate. But nowhere has it been written that her admission be regularized and what action needed to be taken against the College. He stated that his submission in the regard is that they should not keep on leaving these things and an enquiry should be conducted by a Retired High Court Judge.

Continuing, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the cases where the Colleges have admitted students illegally without obtaining affiliation from the University, but the University had declared the result, an enquiry should be conducted to unearth as to who is responsible for that and what action should be taken against the guilty.

The Vice-Chancellor said that he is open for holding an enquiry into the case referred to by Shri Ashok Goyal. He further said that 8 Colleges are defaulters for not sending the CDs of Students' Returns to the University. The University had already taken a decision that the Colleges would have to submit an affidavit to the effect that whatever decision would be taken by the University, would be followed by them in letter and spirit and only on this condition the Roll Numbers of the students would be issued.

Professor Naval Kishore said that the decision referred to by the Vice-Chancellor was taken in the interest of students in particular and academics in general.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the University had taken the decision in the interest of the students. But why can't such an action be not taken in the case of other affiliated Colleges, though contrary to the regulations. It is the Vice-Chancellor, who has passed order in the case of one College that half-half of the students be transferred to nearby two

Colleges. Why were the orders of the Vice-Chancellor not obeyed? The affiliated Colleges neither care for the orders of the Vice-Chancellor nor of the University. He further said that over and above the orders of the Vice-Chancellor, a Committee has been constituted, which had recommended that Roll Numbers be issued to the students. He enquired where the interest of the students has been affected, if they were shifted to nearby College. What about the fees charged by the Colleges from the students?

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that the University is an Academic Institution. Without students, what for it is?

The Vice-Chancellor said that there are 188 Colleges affiliated with the University and out of these only 8 are defaulters, which is minor percentage. He assured that from next year onward, no College would remain defaulter.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that last year also G.G.N. Khalsa College, Ludhiana, had made admissions without having affiliation from the University and the same mistake is committed again. The College had already conducted practicals of the students and the students had also been issued PUPIN by the University.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that a five-member Committee of Syndics had already been constituted to find out ways and means for granting affiliation to the Colleges as different affiliated Colleges have different type of problems. He was also a member of the said Committee. The Committee had made certain recommendations and decided that the proceedings be got signed from each member of the Committee. Neither the minutes of the Committee had been got signed from him nor a copy of the same was provided to him.

The Vice-Chancellor said that let the report of the Committee came to him.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that a meeting of the Committee was held three days before but the report of the Committee neither placed before the Syndicate nor the Senate.

Principal S.S. Sangha deplored that he as a Chairman of the Inspection Committee submitted a report in the University Office, but the same has not been placed before the Syndicate so far.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that he would look into the report of the Committee and take appropriate action against the College/s depending upon the gravity of the fault.**

Shri Dayal Pratap Singh Randhawa said that they should not impose any fine on the College rather additional seats should be granted.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the College should have asked for additional seats, which they did not. Rather the College created seats at their own according to their requirements. When the College did not apply for grant of additional seats, how could the University sanction it additional seats?

**NOTE:** Refund bill of Sh. Gurpreet Sidhu, Department of UBS amounting to Rs.1,75,237/-after deducting 25% administrative charges was admitted under objection for want of sanction of Board of Finance to settle the Audit Para.

### Item 33

That the action taken by the Vice-Chancellor in approving that the arrears of revised pay-scales, be paid to daily wage Clerks, Helpers, Attendants or temporary Teachers, Demonstrators and other similar placed categories who were appointed in the minimum of scales against the substantive posts on whole time basis with effect from 1.1.2006 to 30.11.2009, be noted.

**NOTE:** The Board of Finance in its meeting held on 15.1.2010 vide item No. 18 has already revised the pay-scale of all Daily Wage Workers/ Teachers i.e. Lecturers/ Demonstrators who are appointed in the regular scale on purely temporary basis/other similar categories who are being paid minimum of the scale with effect from December 2009 paid in January, 2010.

**NOTE:** The Board of Finance, Syndicate and Senate dated 15.1.2010, 27.2.2010 and 4.4.2010 respectively has already revised the pay of Teachers/Demonstrator who are appointed in the regular scale on purely temporary basis for the academic session and paid new scale w.e.f. December 2009 paid in January 2010 but the category of Programmer was left inadvertently.

Dr. P.S. Gill said that the limit for incurring 'Sumptuary Expenses' by Dean of University Instruction is Rs.5,000/- p.m., whereas for Registrar and Controller of Examinations the limit for incurring 'Sumptuary Expenses' is Rs.4,000/- and Rs.2,000/- respectively. As such, there is a lot of disparity. He, therefore, pleaded that the limit for incurring 'Sumptuary Expenses' by the Registrar and Controller of Examinations should be enhanced to Rs.5,000/- p.m.

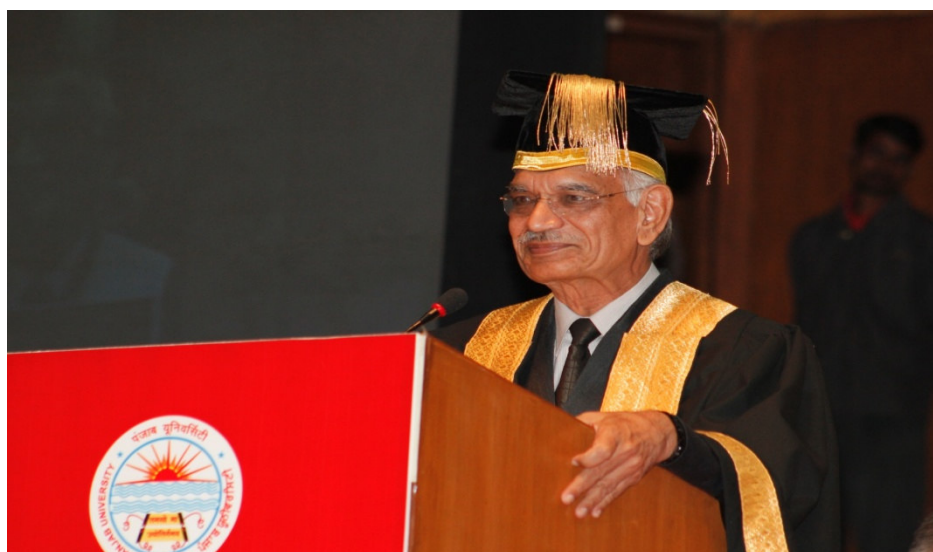

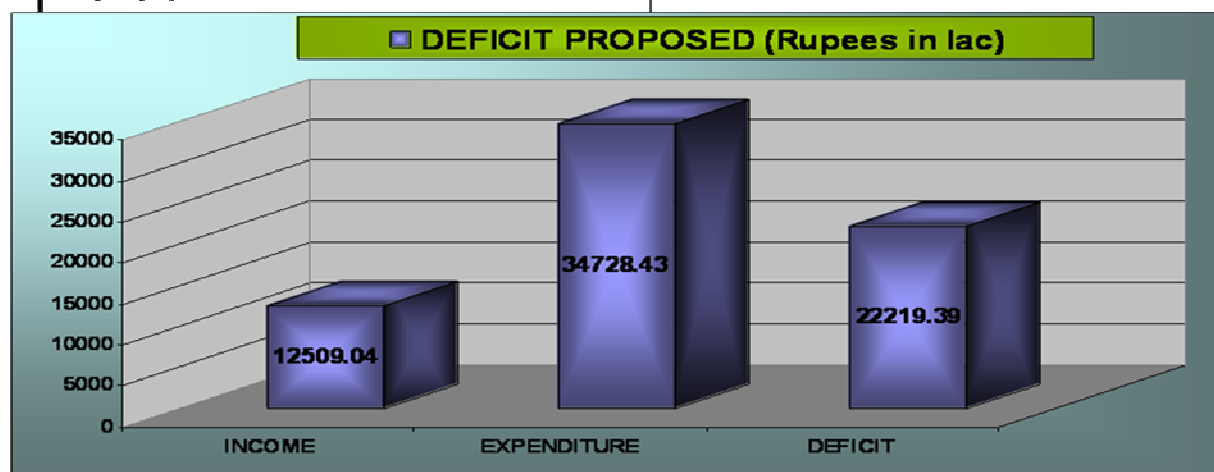

**Grant-in-Aid 2010-11**

**As against the approved original estimated deficit of Rs.33940.20 lac for 2010-11.**

**MHRD/UGC**

An additional grant received from the Government of India through UGC of Rs.150.00 crore to meet the deficit of Non-Plan and other current requirement.

**UT Administration Chandigarh**

The maintenance Grant-in-Aid received from the UT Administration Chandigarh of Rs.2465.19 lac for the year 2010-2011 and Rs.25.00 crore carried over from the last financial year 2009-2010 to 2010-2011.

**Punjab Govt.**

The Punjab Govt. has released Rs.14.00 crore for the financial year 2010-2011 against the fixed Grant-in-Aid of Rs. 21.00 crore the till date and the balance Rs.7.00 crore is awaited.

Deep gratitude and thanks to all of you for the kind co-operation, valuable advice and exceptional support to me in the conduct of activities of the university since my joining as a Vice-Chancellor.

Sincere thanks for the all out co-operation and help extended by the Punjab Govt and Chandigarh Administration through Shri V.K. Singh, Finance Secretary, UT, and Shri Sanjay Kumar (Former Finance Secretary U.T.), particularly in making payment in advance, in respect of installments of grant-in-aid as and when request was made to them to enable us to make the payment of salaries to the staff.

This was one of the factors which helped the university to a large extent, during the last many financial years in not resorting to the usual practice of taking overdraft/loan and consequently we were able to effect considerable saving on account of interest, earlier used to be paid to the bank on account of such overdraft/loans.

I once again propose that the house may kindly pass the revised Estimated Expenditure of Rs. 41385.57 lac for the year 2010-2011 and budget Estimated Expenditure of Rs 34728.43 lac & NSD of Rs. 2711.72 lac liabilities of BOF items for the year 2011-2012.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that Freeship in each course for yellow card holder has been doubled from 10 to 20% except in self financing courses. This meant, no tuition fee would be charged from the students admitted against freeship seats. Each hostel would have its own Library as due to heritage status consideration the University could not expand the building of A.C. Joshi Library. This would facilitate the students in getting books easily and resultantly the rush at the A.C. Joshi Library would be minimized. The University had taken certain measures to ensure that the students are awarded Ph.D. degrees within 120 days of the submission of Ph.D. thesis. The University had doubled the amount of sports scholarship as well as the subsidy on food had also been doubled from the year 2010-2011. Though the Placement Cell of the University is also working satisfactorily, they had taken certain steps to improve the same. The Companies were coming forward to the University for placement of students. Now, the students can deposit their fees in State Bank of India anywhere in the country. This should be given wide publicity so that every student could make use of this facility. The mind set of the students needed to be changed as they converge on the Fee Counter of the SBI at the University Campus. These are students' friendly measures, which the University had taken.

Dr. Dayal Pratap Singh Randhawa suggested that the decision that the students can deposit their fees in State Bank of India anywhere in the country, should be printed on each and every form.



Continuing, the Vice-Chancellor stated that when he took up the charge as Vice-Chancellor, there were 690 sanctioned faculty positions and now the same had been raised to 1510. All the vacant teaching and non-teaching posts would be filled up at the earliest. The Vice-Chancellor of the Panjab University was only one who had written 11 papers in Drug Metabolism with 1499 citations.

Continuing further, the Vice-Chancellor stated that a Polymer Science Research Centre is being set up with a seed money of Rs.5 lac which would be increased to Rs.15 lac. The Departments of Community Education & Disability Studies, Life Long Learning & Extension, Public Health, etc. had been asked to adopt eight villages. They would visit the villages for getting information and educating the people so that they are actively involved in this societal work. Now, the Academic Staff College of the University had been evaluated as a Model by the NAAC. Panjab University and Mysore University had been identified for carrying out pilot study. This year, the University is going to have its own Tech. Fest. The students to be admitted against reserved quota for sports seats would be asked to submit an affidavit that they would report in the sports ground and participation in the games.

The Vice-Chancellor proposed that, in addition to the new and special demands as recommended by the Board of Finance and Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 for the year 2011-12, the following additional provisions may also be considered for approval by the Senate.

1. Setting up of Polymer Research Centre for focused research with a provision of seed money of Rs.5 lacs.
2. As part of Community Development Programme, the University has adopted eight villages. Hence, to carry out the activities relating to this programme, Budget provisions of Rs.10 lacs, under the General Administration, be approved.
3. Establishment of a Tele Call Centre, to facilitate the students, with the following new Budget provision, under the main Head, "General Administration":
 

(i)	Salary of three executives on contract basis (Recurring)	: Rs.4 lac
(ii)	Office and general expenses, Including contingency (Recurring)	: Rs.2 lac
(iii)	Purchase of equipments, furniture, etc. (Non-Recurring)	: Rs.5 lac

The Vice-Chancellor further stated that the provision of payment of arrear has been proposed for Rs.105.00 crore in the Revised Estimates for 2010-11 and Rs.5.00 crore in the Budget Estimates for 2011-12. However, as reported by the office, there are certain stray cases or due to pay anomalies the payment of arrear of some cases may spill over to the next financial year. Hence, it was proposed that the Budget provision for payment of arrear in the Revised Estimates for 2010-11 may be reduced by Rs. 15.00 crore, i.e. from Rs. 105.00 crore to Rs.90.00 crore and in the Budget Estimates for 2011-12 it may be increased by Rs. 15.00 crore i.e. from 5.00 crore to Rs.20.00 crore keeping the total provision of arrears at the same level.

Referring to Item 21 of the Board of Finance dated 23.2.2011 for utilization of additional grant of Rs.80.00 crore, the Vice-Chancellor explained that as per the decision of Board of Finance a written clarification was sought from U.T. Administration, Chandigarh vide letter No. 969 dated 4.3.2011. The Finance Department, Chandigarh Administration vide its letter dated 15.3.2011 clarified that University may take action in connection with the utilization of Rs.80.00 crore as per its requirement. Accordingly, it is

proposed that the additional grant may be utilized as follows by classifying it under Plan Grants:

Dr. Dinesh Talwar pointed out that the sportspersons, who were honoured by the University, were invited very late for the sports function. Though certain students were given award, but in certain cases, students who won medals in Common Wealth Games, were left out. The students had been asked to submit an affidavit attested by a First Class Magistrate that they would submit the original certificates.

Professor Naval Kishore clarified that a representation had been received from Dr. Dinesh Talwar. Earlier, there was a practice of submission of original certificate by the sportspersons for getting cash prize. But this year with the orders of the Vice-Chancellor, that practice had been discontinued and sportspersons had been awarded without taking original certificates.

Principal S.S. Sangha said that an international shooter (3<sup>rd</sup> in the World University), who was not granted special chance to appear in the examination, had left the Panjab University and had taken admission in Punjabi University, Patiala.

The Vice-Chancellor said that in order to encourage Punjabi Language they are going to institute Professor Satinder Singh Noor Medal in the Panjab University with a prize of Rs.1 lac. The Vice-Chancellor further said that this year he had attended Convocation of two affiliated Colleges and one of the Colleges (Guru Nanak College for Girls, Muktsar) had the best Campus and most disciplined students due to which about 850 degrees were awarded within one hour.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that on the direction of P.M.O., U.T. Administration had already released a sum of Rs.80 crore to the University as an interim measure. In the meantime, the University got a sum of Rs.150 crore from the U.G.C., on the recommendation of MHRD, to pay arrears to the University staff. On a clarification sought by the University, the U.T. Administration, Chandigarh, had allowed the University to spend Rs.80 crore for the purpose of construction. A Committee of the Government had deliberated and unanimously approved that the Panjab University should be paid through the U.G.C. Secondly, the 60:40 ratio of sharing the deficit of the University between Central Government and the Punjab Government had become obsolete. Now the Panjab University might be given grant by the Central Government on need basis, i.e. total budgetary requirement minus the grant to be given by the Punjab Government and the income generated by the University itself. After the approval of the above arrangement by the appropriate authority, the University may have to implement 27% reservation for the OBCs.

Continuing, the Vice-Chancellor said that the University had now no option but to eventually adopt Semester System of examination in the University and its affiliated Colleges.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that the Vice-Chancellor had presented a good zero deficit Budget. He pleaded that the University should get full share of deficit from the

Punjab Government. If the Punjab Government did not give its share to the University, the University should get the same by approaching the Court as had been done by certain aided Colleges of Punjab. If the Punjab Government did not give its share to the University and the University ignored it, it would have a bad affect on the aided Colleges. If the Senate did not agree to his proposal his dissent be recorded.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu enquired as to what steps the University was taking to get grants from the State Government. He stressed that the University should not forfeit its share of the deficit from the Punjab Government.

The Vice-Chancellor said that he had never said that the Panjab University would not claim grant from the Punjab Government. As usual, the University would claim grant from the Punjab Government. However, if the Punjab Government did not release the grant, the Central Government would be requested to pay the same.

Dr. Virander Kumar Tewari stated that the University should not write-off the amount of grant on account of arrears under any circumstances due on the part of the Punjab Government. Rather the University should request and persuade the Punjab Government to release the grant to the University, which is due on account of payment of arrears towards revision of pay-scales w.e.f. 1.1.2006. He suggested that the all the Departments of Languages, i.e. the proposal School of Languages, should be housed in a single building.

The Vice-Chancellor said that all the Punjabi language relating Departments, including Department of Punjabi, School of Punjabi, Department of Guru Nanak Sikh Studies, etc. would be shifted and housed in the up-coming Guru Teg Bahadur Bhavan. Resultantly, the Departments of Russian, Urdu, etc. would be shifted to the building presently occupied by School of Punjabi, etc. Similarly, they were going to re-arrange the allocation of buildings.

Appreciating the Vice-Chancellor, Professor R.P. Bambah stated that he was really astonished to see that the Vice-Chancellor has created so much infrastructure and doing several other things for the betterment of the University, that too, in such a short period. Even Professor A.C. Joshi, the former Vice-Chancellor, who was a great Administrator, could not create so much infrastructure for the University. For creating such a infrastructure, a lot of efforts were required, which Professor R.C. Sobti alone has been putting in. The Board of Finance, which comprised of representatives of Central Government as well as Punjab Government, fixed the deficit of the University. Meaning thereby, it is not the University, including the Senate, that fixes the ratio for sharing the deficit of the Budget, rather it is the Central Government, which is empowered to do so. Due to non-payment of 40% of the deficit by the Punjab Government, the Panjab University was facing the financial crunch. Now, the Government of India had come to the rescue of the University by assuring to share most of the deficit, i.e. total expenditure minus the grant given by the Punjab Government and the income generated by the University. He asked the Members to be realistic. They must be happy that the University has got the resources to do what it wanted. The University had been making efforts since long time and now has achieved its goal.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Punjab Government had already fixed its grants to be given to the three Universities of the States, i.e. Panjab, Punjabi & Guru Nanak Dev Universities at the level of grants given to them in the year 2010-11 and under no circumstances they are going to enhance it.

Dr. Ronki Ram stated that that he did not think that the provision being made by the Central Government would affect the pattern of grants by the Central and Punjab Governments to the Colleges. The Panjab University was being given grant by the Central and Punjab Governments in the ratio of 60:40, whereas they were requesting the Punjab Government time and again to release the grant. He did not know how the provision of the Central Government that in case the Punjab Government did not release

the grant due to the Panjab University, the same would be given by it, would impinge the Colleges.

On a point of order, Principal Gurdip Sharma said that the Punjab Government's Scheme for aided Colleges was a totally different one.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for presenting a good Budget. He stated that the a sum of Rs.40 crore, which is due from the Punjab Government, should not be written off rather the same should be transferred to a separate Account, i.e. Sundry Account as was being done by the Corporate Sector. He further said that during the year 2009-10, the University had received a sum of Rs.14.67 crore instead of Rs.16 crore.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Punjab Government has now agreed to give a sum of Rs.5 crore for the P.U. Rural Centre, Kauni.

Continuing, Dr. Dharinder Tayal stated that the University had done a very good work by reserving two seats for 'Single Girl Child' in each course being offered by the University and its affiliated Colleges. If they go by the proposed estimates, the net revenue would be up by 9% and the net expenditure would fall by 11.5%. Hence, there is a gap of 20%. The Gross Revenue had risen by 46% and the Gross Expenditure is down by 13% and the accumulated difference is 13%. According to him, these are excellent figures for any private institution. The shortage of faculty is the one serious area which they needed to take care of. However, they are still not appointing the faculty against the vacant posts. He, therefore, pleaded that the vacant posts should be filled up very urgently.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the University had got money only in the months of October/November 2010. Secondly, the latest U.G.C. guidelines for filling up various faculty positions came on 30<sup>th</sup> January 2011. The University had advertised the faculty positions accordingly and from 15<sup>th</sup> of April 2011 they would start the process for making the appointments. However, the imparting of education to the students did not suffer because they are provided guest faculty and they should not be apprehensive for that purpose.

Principal Hardiljit Singh Gosal appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for presenting a very good budget. Referring to Item No.4 of the Board of Finance, he pointed out that 533 teaching posts and 533 non-teaching posts would be more created with the implementation of O.B.C. reservation.

The Vice-Chancellor said that two years ago an estimate of Rs.367 crore was sent to the Central Government. If permission is granted by the Central Government, they would go ahead with the reservation for O.B.C.

Endorsing the viewpoints expressed by Shri Prabjeet Singh, Dr. Kuldeep Singh said that the University should not write off the amount of grant pending on the part of Punjab Government.

Referring to the remarks made by Dr. Ronki Ram, Shri Prabjeet Singh said that perhaps the Colleges of Punjab directly linked to the grant being provided by the Punjab Government. Since Punjab had a moral and legal right on the Panjab University, the Panjab University should get its full share from the Punjab Government.

Dr. Gurmeet Singh appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for presenting a very good budget. He stated that the Syndicate in its last meeting had enhanced the freeships from 10 to 20, but the office had not implemented the same on the plea that they had not received any communication in this regard. He pleaded that the Syndicate decision regarding enhancement in freeship should be implemented from the year 2010-11. He further said that a sum of Rs.25000/- would be given to each department of the purpose

of Young Scientist Award. He pleaded that this award should be limited only to the science departments. He added that the sum of Rs.5 lac was allocated for hostels in the previous year. He pleaded that the allocated money should be spent for the purpose for which it was allocated rather than making fixed deposits of the said amount. Further a sum of Rs. 25 lac had been earmarked for new projects. It would be ensured that money is distributed amongst the concerned departments. He further stated that in all the centrally funded institutes, scholarship is given to every research scholar. He also said that in order to give an opportunity to make progress in life and to give natural justice, there should be no limit for applying outside for the non-teaching employees. Dr. Gurmeet Singh enquired about the steps taken by the University for its own Anthem.

Endorsing the viewpoints expressed by Professor R.P. Bambah, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that nothing more can be said whatever has already been expressed in words. If he expressed anything in the praise of Professor R.C. Sobti, the Vice-Chancellor, that would be short of expression what the Vice-Chancellor had done for this University. As he had brought so much funds to the University, he would always be praised and his name would be written in golden letters. As far as budget is concerned, he was only concerned with the one saying that when one become rich, he has to face certain consequences as richness never comes alone and brings many bad things along. Therefore, his only suggestion in this regard was that before starting any new course, make the appointments of the teachers. Otherwise, the University would be criticized and it would bring a bad name from the society as was happening in the case of private academies, which are functioning for the sake of earning revenue. He, therefore, pleaded that they should try to eliminate that impression. Referring to the statement that 500 posts were advertised, he stated that all the vacant positions, which are mandatory for imparting education to the students and had been advertised, should be filled up at the earliest. If there are still certain posts, which are mandatory but could not be advertised, should be advertised and filled up at the earliest. The Vice-Chancellor had said that since the Central Government had agreed to meet the major portion of the deficit of the University, arrears due from Punjab Government should be written off. To this, some of the members had reacted that it would have a bad affect on the aided Colleges. He said that he differed from his friends' suggestion that as had been done by the aided College, the Panjab University should also approach the Court for getting released its share due on the part of Punjab Government. Since the Panjab University had different standing than that of the aided Colleges, it could not go to the Court. As suggested by Dr. Dharinder Tayal, it would be appropriate if the amount of arrear due on the part of the Punjab Government should be kept in a separate account instead of being shown in the balance sheet every year.

Continuing, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that when much funds had come from Central Government and other agencies like U.G.C., etc., the benefits should be extended to both teaching & non-teaching staff and the students as well. During the last about 10 years the University had faced severe financial crunch, especially due to non-receipt of grants from the Punjab Government and under this tremendous pressure the University had to (i) start certain self-financing courses; (ii) enhance its fee structure; (iii) enhance cost of forms, prospectus (including various Entrance Tests), Handbook of Information, etc. They should also introspect as to what they are providing to the hostellers. The cost of eatables provided to the students in hostels and the shops at the Students' Centre should also be reduced because the rates were fixed on the basis of commercial situation prevailing in the city at that time. If need be, the rents of the shops at the Students' Centre should be reduced so that they can provide the eatables to the students at much lower rates as the rents of the shops goes to the Estate Fund. In fact, the shops at the Students' Centre are meant for serving the students rather than generating income for the University. They should be conscious of the fact that facilities are required to be given to the students, teachers and residents of the Campus. Hence, they should not treat the shops as commercial ventures and increase the rents of the shops frequently. He proposed that they should reduce the prices as a matter of goodwill gesture. He knew that it is not possible to provide hostel to every student, but we have to think as to how many hostels were there when they used to have 4,000 students. When the students'

strength had gone up by more than 4 times, how many more hostels are required to be constructed.

The Vice-Chancellor said that he had written to the Government that the University would not reduce income generated by it through various sources. As far as income from commercial sources is concerned, they had taken a decision that whatever increase is to be made, its benefit would be given to the students.

Continuing, Shri Ashok Goyal said that if as per directive of MHRD, the income of the University is to be increased by 10% every year, at least the cost of forms, etc. should not be increased.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.**

Continuing further, Shri Ashok Goyal said that as far as reducing the prices of eatables are concerned, he would come to his (Vice-Chancellor's) office and give a solution.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that the whole Senate had already given a standing ovation to the Vice-Chancellor for doing so much for the Panjab University. He stated that Panjab University Act, 1947 had been amended by the Parliament and it became a Parliament Act according to the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. As far as funding of the University is concerned, the Act says that the successor States will share the expenditure of the University in ratio to be fixed by the Government of India. Presently, the said ratio is 60:40 between Central Government and Punjab Government. He agreed with the other speakers who had said that they should not write off the arrear due from the Punjab Government as the old obligation of Punjab State did not finish with the assurance of the Central Government that they would meet most of the deficit of the University. It has nothing to do with the present arrangement.

Continuing, Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that, earlier, the Board of Finance had taken a decision that the Panjab University deficit would be decided on the basis of filled posts only, which was incorrect. The Vice-Chancellor had been able to convince the members of the Board of Finance and the Board had now agreed to fix the deficit of the University on the basis of sanctioned posts. Thus, the Vice-Chancellor had been able to control the damage and acknowledged the efforts of the persons who had helped the University in this regard. The Vice-Chancellor had done a lot and is still making concerted efforts for the betterment of the University. He further stated that earlier the Department of Laws was at number two in the country, but is not now. He urged the Vice-Chancellor to initiate steps to bring the University at number one in the country as the University had the infrastructure for the same, which only the Vice-Chancellor could do. The faculty and the students of Department of Laws had excelled in different fields. The students of this Department had become Chief Justice/Judges of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, High Courts of different States, teacher in various Universities and they are happy with. The University had also taken a decision to prepare an Encyclopaedia pertaining to the Law Faculty (what is their contribution, who reached where, etc.) and he had already announced that the expenditure on this would be met by him. They had also approved introduction of B.Com. LL.B. (Hons.) course at the Panjab University.

Shri Gurdip Singh stated that now the University has stood on its feet. The non-teaching staff is also happy with the Vice-Chancellor had worked. He urged the Vice-Chancellor to continue working the same way. The Panjab University had taken a lead in regularizing the services of daily wagers/persons working on contract basis whereas the Punjab Government had left behind as far as regularizing of services of daily wagers and payment of arrears to its employees for the revised pay-scales w.e.f. 1.1.2006 is concerned and he himself and on behalf of the Non-Teaching Employees' Federation thanked the Vice-Chancellor. He also thanked Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath for advising the University legally for regularizing the services of daily wage workers and Professor

A.K. Bhandari, Registrar and his team for provided all possible support in this difficult task. He stated that though the decision of the Joint Consultative Machinery (JCM) had not been implemented in toto, a step had been taken by which services of 39 employees working on daily wage basis had been regularized. He further stated that according to the judgement of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the case of Uma Devi, the services of those daily wagers could be regularized who had put in service for at least 240 days in a year for 10 years. He, therefore, pleaded that the condition of 240 days should be taken into consideration for regularizing the services of daily wagers and the work in this regard should be given impetus. As there is a shortage of staff, especially with the retirement of a large number of employees, the vacant posts should be filled up at the earliest. In addition to this, amendment in the promotion policy for Restorers is needed and those who had worked for at least 5 years up to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2010, should be promoted rather than 6 years up to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2010.

Professor Jaspal Kaur Kaang appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for presenting a good Budget and taking several welfare measures. She pleaded that the services of teachers working on contract basis in University Institute of Engineering & Technology, Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital, etc. should also be regularized as had been done in the case of non-teaching employees. She also appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for the proposal building an Old-Age Home at the University Campus. She also pleaded that the Crèche at the University Campus should be enlarged so that more children of the working couples could be accommodated. Similarly, the increment for M.Tech. examination should be granted to the teachers as provided in the U.G.C. guidelines. The payment of Summer School has not been made so far, the same should be made at the earliest. Further, certain anomalies, which had occurred in the pay fixation of teachers after adoption of revised pay-scales, should be removed.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter regarding anomalies in the pay fixation of teachers would be looked into.**

Dr. Dalip Kumar stated that the Budget presented by the Vice-Chancellor is students' and campus friendly. The Budget has, in fact, stabilized the financial position of the University. He, however, observed that there was nothing in the Budget for about 2.48 lac students who came from 188 affiliated Colleges. He pleaded that as had been done in the case of University employees, 25% concession in tuition fee in the self-financing courses should be granted to the wards of employees of affiliated Colleges. Similarly, the facility of research grant for the University teachers should also be extended to the teachers of affiliated Colleges. In addition, the students of affiliated Colleges should also be included in the scheme of Young Scientist Award. Further, the College teachers should be exempted from Ph.D. Entrance Test.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the University had already granted the concession of 25% to the wards of College employees from the Dean College Development Council Fund and nothing more could be given. He clarified that Young Scientist Award was only for the teachers of the Science Departments and it has been sanctioned by the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India.

Extending huge appreciations to the Vice-Chancellor for presenting a student friendly Budget, Dr. Jasvir Kaur Chahal stated that the facility of Old-Age Home would be given only to those who would pay a sum of Rs.5 lac. She enquired whether this facility would be granted to those also who really needed it, but did not have so much money.

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that it is a self-financing project.

Continuing, Dr. Jasvir Kaur Chahal appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for extending the facility of attending Refresher Courses to the non-teaching employees also. She

suggested that the University should evolve certain courses for the employees to acquaint them with various methods of work so that they could do the work efficiently.

The Vice-Chancellor said that they are changing the name of Academic Staff College.

Continuing further, Dr. Jasvir Kaur Chahal stated that it is good that the services of daily wagers, who had completed 10 years of service, had been regularized. She pleaded that the services of other employees working on daily wage basis should also be regularized as and when they complete 10 years of service. She further said that on the one hand with the introduction of a large number of new courses, the number of students had escalated manifold and on the other hand no new posts are being created to cope with the additional workload. She pleaded that new non-teaching posts should be created and the vacant posts should also be filled up.

The Vice-Chancellor said that it was a one time measure. He, however, said that the services of those daily wage workers would be regularized, who fulfilled the conditions of 10 years of qualifying service by 31<sup>st</sup> December 2010, but had not been considered due to oversight. As far as creation of new non-teaching posts is concerned, as observed by the Government of India, the ratio between teachers and non-teachers is already above the fixed norms, i.e. at 1:1.9. The Government is insisting up the University to reduce the ratio to 1:1.3 in the coming years.

Dr. P.S. Gill appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for presenting a good Budget. He further said that Leave Encashment has already there for University teachers. He urged the Vice-Chancellor to take up the matter with regard to grant of leave encashment and revised gratuity to the College teachers with the concerned quarters.

The Vice-Chancellor said that University has already made payment according to the revised gratuity.

Dr. M.L. Aeri appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for presenting an excellent Budget. He, however, pointed out that 88 per cent of the University Budget is being spent on the salaries of employees, whereas only one per cent of the budget is being spent on infrastructural development.

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that one per cent is from the Non-Plan Budget for Infrastructure, whereas the actual allocation for infrastructure is much more which is coming from Special Development Grants under Plans/Schemes, etc.

Continuing, Dr. M.L. Aeri said that if the actual position is that, then it is very good. He further said that accreditation of the teaching and learning material of the teachers being promoted under Career Advancement Scheme, is necessary.

**The Vice-Chancellor clarified that a Standing Committee consisting of five senior-most Professors of the University has already been constituted for this purpose.**

Dr. Dinesh Talwar stated that the University had 1510 sanctioned teaching posts and majority of them had been filled up, which was good. As per his information, in 1988, the Department of Physical Education and Directorate of Sports were made independent units. At that time eight coaches were there and who were later on designated as Lecturers (Coaching). Since then the University had been participating in about forty games at University and Inter-University level, but the students who had done/will do M.P. Ed. from this University could become Lecturers/Assistant Professors if they had specialization in only those eight games. Even Sachin Tendulkar, after doing M.P.Ed. from Panjab University could not become lecturer here because he played cricket, which did not fall in those eight disciplines available in the University. M.P.Ed. is the course which students do to become Lecturers and the syllabus for M.P.Ed. is



common for first year for all the students and in 2<sup>nd</sup> year they do specialization in one of the games. For becoming Coaches, the players have to do NIS not M.P.Ed. After doing M.P. Ed. from Panjab University, the student can become lecturer in an affiliated College but could not apply for Lecturership in the University.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter could be looked into. However, Dr. Dinesh Talwar should give his viewpoints in writing so that no ambiguity remains.**

**Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that a representation to this effect had already been given to the worthy Vice-Chancellor.**

On a point of order, Ms. Jasvir Kaur Chahal said that the representation had come, but the Board had rejected the same unanimously.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that he would go through the file and decide as to what remedial measures could be taken.**

Continuing, Dr. Dinesh Talwar appreciated the Vice-Chancellor for making payment of the arrears, revised leave encashment and gratuity to the teaching and non-teaching staff. He enquired whether the Colleges affiliated to Panjab University follow the University Calendar. He pointed out that one of his friends who is appointed in the University gets twelve earned leave whereas he gets only eight earned leaves. He suggested that the matter should be seriously looked into.

The Vice-Chancellor said that he would write to the affiliated Colleges to follow the University Calendar in toto.

Principal Hardiljit Singh Gosal suggested that University should start scholarships in the name of Yuvraj Singh and Harbhajan Singh.

The Vice-Chancellor said that for getting money from the UGC there is no escape for the University but to eventually implement the semester system of examination, both in the University and its affiliated Colleges.

To this, Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that, perhaps, Semester System is a welcome step, but results of re-evaluation are still not declared by the University. If the result of Annual Examinations could not be declared within stipulated time, how the results of semester system could be declared well in time.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that, in the first instance, the Semester System should be started at the Postgraduate level and if it worked successfully for two years, the same should be implemented at the Undergraduate level also.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu stated that since the University had neither sufficient staff to cope with the additional work nor the issue of implementation of semester system of examination had been discussed at proper level, it should not be implemented. Secondly, even when there is Annual System of examination, a large number of students did not receive their roll numbers, D.M.C., etc. They could well imagine the fate of the students after the implementation of the Semester System.

The Vice-Chancellor said that it is for the University authorities to see as to how the results be declared in time. They are already working on developing a foolproof system, including modalities, for implementation of the Semester System. He assured that the semester system would not be implemented half-baked.

Referring to the statement of the Vice-Chancellor that regarding implementation of Semester System and working out, Shri Prabhjeet Singh said that how could the semester system be implemented when the modalities are still to be approved by the Senate?

The Vice-Chancellor said that they must be clear that they are living in the age of science and technology where the changes are taking place very fast. On the one side, they are saying that the Panjab University should be made a Central Funded University and on the other side, they say that the semester system should not be implemented in the affiliated Colleges. To get grants from the Central Government, the University has no option but to implement the semester system. **He, therefore, proposed that the implementation of the semester system of examination should be approved, in principle, and the modalities be worked out later on.**

Appreciating the Vice-Chancellor for presenting an excellent Budget, Dr. Tarlok Bandhu enquired whether the incentives being given to the University teachers for carrying out research would be extended to the teachers of the affiliated College.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the University teachers, especially from the Science Departments, had got these projects from the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India. He added that the U.G.C. had now number of schemes for College teachers as well and they could apply for the same.

Shri Harpreet Singh Dua stated that the University is getting an income of about Rs.43 crore from the students of affiliated Colleges, whereas the income from the campus students is about Rs.5 crore, including the students of University School of Open Learning. Secondly, the University charged money from the Colleges for providing furniture in the Examination Centres. Similarly, the revenue generated by A.C. Joshi Library is about Rs.1.5 lac, whereas the revenue generated by P.U. Extension Library is about Rs.3.5 lac. He further said that the number of regular faculty in the affiliated Colleges, including Government Colleges, is decreasing.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that the income of Rs.43 crore includes examination fee from the students of P.U. Campus, University School of Open Learning, affiliated Colleges and candidates appearing in private capacity. **He, however, said that the matter regarding charging money from the Colleges for providing furniture in the Examination Centres would be looked into.** Referring to the decreasing number of regular faculty, he said that about 943 vacant posts of the Colleges are going to be filled up soon. Referring less income from A.C. Joshi Library, he said that now they had allowed private students to avail the facilities of the A.C. Joshi Library, which would definitely help in increasing the income.

Principal Gurdip Sharma congratulated the Vice-Chancellor for presenting a good Budget. He stated that 45% faculty positions are lying vacant at the University campus and 60% at Swami Sarvanand Giri P.U. Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur. Similarly, 50% and 55% teaching positions are lying vacant in the aided Colleges and Government Colleges, respectively. In the newly established Centre, e.g. P.U. Rural Centre, Kauni, no post has been filled on regular basis.

The Vice-Chancellor said that earlier the University did not want to take risk in filling up the posts on regular basis. Now, since the Punjab Government had agreed to give a grant of Rs.6 crore for P.U. Rural Centre, Kauni, the University would try its best to fill up the vacant posts.

Continuing, Principal Gurdip Sharma stated that as had been the case with the University, the Colleges are also facing a lot of problems for filling up the teaching posts on regular basis. The University is appointing faculty on contract basis as also providing guest faculty for teaching certain courses, whereas the Colleges were not being allowed to do so. Why the Colleges were being discriminated?

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that the Colleges could appoint faculty on contract/temporary basis, but the NET qualified persons have to be given full pay-scales and the Non-NET persons a fixed salary of Rs.25,800/- p.m.

To this, Principal Gurdip Sharma said that when a new course is introduced, the teacher appointed do not have full teaching load. Therefore, they should be made a payment of Rs.15,600/- p.m. rather than Rs.25,800/- p.m.. However, when the course enter into third year at that time there could be sufficient teaching load, the teacher concerned could be paid a fixed sum of Rs.25,800/- p.m.

Continuing further, Principal Gurdip Sharma stated that since there is a scarcity of accommodation at Swami Sarvanand Giri P.U. Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur, no new course should be started there. The University had made a commitment to the donor that the dispensary existed in the campus, would be smoothly run by the University. He pleaded that the services of Homoeopathic Doctor of that dispensary should be regularized and if need be, a post be created because Homoeopathy is popular system of medicine. He added that a Homoeopathic Clinic had been opened in his College, wherein free medicines costing about Rs.2,000/- p.m. are being distributed. They had adopted four villages for the purpose.

Professor Keshav Malhotra stated that Professor A.C. Joshi, the former Vice-Chancellor, development Sector 14 Campus. The South Campus, which had been created by the present Vice-Chancellor, needed certain improvements, the same should be carried out. The vacant land, which had been earmarked for construction of house, for the time being should be developed into children park. He suggested that since there is not playground in the South Campus, vacant land should be developed as a playground.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.**

On a point raised by Professor Keshav Malhotra regarding revival of Staff Club, the Vice-Chancellor said that Professor Malhotra should take a lead and get the election of the Staff Club conducted so that the process for its revival is started.

Shri Madal Lal Aeri said that after the submission of report on Sadhu Aashram to the Vice-Chancellor, nothing has been heard so far.

Dr. Rabinder Nath Sharma remarked that, in fact, the Panjab University is lucky to have such an energetic Vice-Chancellor. With the help of Hon'ble Prime Minister, Dr. Manmohan Singh, Shri Pawan Kumar Bansal, Shri Kapil Sibal, construction work is going on all around the Campus. Though prosperity is good, priority should be given to development of infrastructure; otherwise, time might come when there would be no money to pay electricity bills. When there is a Shooting Range near Dhanas, where only once or twice a year practice is done, what is need for constructing a new Shooting Range at the Campus? He added that an Ultra Modern Shooting Range was there in the Badal Village, the shooters could go for practice. In nutshell, he said that while incurring expenditure, economy measures should be adopted and their focus should be students' welfare.

On a point raised by Shri Virander Kumar Tewari regarding allocation of funds for Publication Bureau and housing accommodation for teaching and non-teaching staff, the Vice-Chancellor said that they had earmarked Rs.1 crore for University Business School building, but since they could not spend it, the money had been shifted to Publication Bureau, which is being developed as Real Publishing House of the University. He added that, in future, all the publications would be published by the Publication Bureau of the University. Another Rs.1 crore had been earmarked for development of P.U. Press.

**RESOLVED:** That –

- (3) Incumbent Readers and Lecturer (Selection Grade) who had not completed three years in the pay-scale of ₹12,000-₹18,300 on January, 2006 shall be placed at the appropriate stage in the Pay Band of ₹15,600-₹39,100 with AGP of ₹8,000 till they complete three years of service in the grade of

Lecturer (Selection Grade)/Reader, and thereafter shall be placed in the higher Pay Band of ₹37,400-₹67,000 and accordingly re-designated as Associate Professor.

- (4) Readers/Lecturers (Selection Grade) in service at present shall continue to be designated as Lecturer (Selection Grade) or Readers, as the case may be, until they are placed in the Pay Band of ₹37,400-₹67,000 and re-designated as Associate Professor as described in (3) above.

**(Syndicate dated 21.01.2011 Para 7)**

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that re-designation of Lecturers, Readers as Assistant Professors and Associate Professors are part of the U.G.C. notification, which had already been adopted by the University. He wanted to know the purpose of bringing the item again on the agenda?

Principal Gurdip Sharma handed over papers regarding revised pay-scales of Principals to the Vice-Chancellor on the floor of the House.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Regulations had already been amended and sent to the Government of India for approval. Hence, the item should be treated as withdrawn.

**This was agreed to.**

**XXIII.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-5.5** on the agenda was read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

**C-5.5** That Mr. Jagdish Kumar, Assistant Technical Officer, University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology, be promoted as Senior Technical Officer (Grade-I) in the pay-scale of ₹10300-34800+GP ₹5000/- w.e.f. the date he reports for duty after issue of the orders.

**XXIV.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-5.6** on the agenda was read out, viz. –

**C-5.6** That the recommendations of the Committee dated 25.11.2010 constituted by the Vice-Chancellor with regard to the case/cases of those teachers who were selected under the CAS Scheme after having been rejected once or twice by the Selection Committee, be approved with date of eligibility to be 31.3.2004 as recommended by the Finance & Development Officer.

**NOTE:** The date of eligibility of Dr. V.K. Chopra was 3.2.2003, since he was rejected by the earlier selection Committee, the eligibility of Dr. V.K. Chopra may be shifted after one year of being originally eligibility. However, it is necessary to mention that last publication of Dr. V.K. Chopra is during the session 2003-2004, since no date is mentioned in the journal, it may be taken as 31.3.2004 as recommended by FDO. Hence, Dr. V.K. Chopra is eligible to be promoted as

Professor under CAS w.e.f. 31.3.2004, i.e. the date of last publication. The Committee further recommended that candidates selected in the first selection Committee will be senior to those who were promoted in the subsequent selection Committee after being rejected in the first selection Committee.

**(Syndicate dated 21.01.2011 Para 36)**

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the Vice-Chancellor had made statement several times and taken a stand that what had been done by the Syndicate, Senate and the U.G.C., he would not do anything beyond the U.G.C. And if anything beyond required to be done that would be done after taking NOC or approval from the U.G.C. In the case of promotion of two persons as Professors, which is listed in the agenda, it had already been decided by the Senate dated 10.10.2010 that letters of promotion be issued in anticipation of Senate, but the letters of promotion were not issued to them. The item is listed in the agenda with a note as if the clarification from the U.G.C. is taken in anticipation of the approval of the Senate. When he raised the issue in the meeting of December meeting of the Senate, the Vice-Chancellor had said that the matter would be looked into. In fact, the matter was referred to the U.G.C., but he did not know why? In the case of Dr. V.K. Chopra, the University without the consent of the U.G.C. has preponed his eligibility. Why they are treating this case differently. Secondly, there is provision under the CAS that if somebody is rejected, he/she would be eligible one year after the date of his/her rejection. In the meantime, a clarification from the U.G.C. had been received that they would be appointed from the date of their promotion is approved by the competent authority. But Professor R.C. Sobti, the Vice-Chancellor, is so generous that he gave a statement in his first meeting of the Senate as Vice-Chancellor in the year 2006 that he would ensure that none of the persons would be rejected under the CAS and he was happy that till today he has done that and none of the candidates, who appeared under CAS, has been rejected. The Vice-Chancellor has himself committed that several times he requests the members of the Selection Committees not to reject the person and if they are not satisfied with the performance of the persons, please promote them with certain conditions. Meaning thereby, that the person concerned was not found suitable for promotion by the Selection Committee and if promoted with condition, he is subject to evaluation by experts. That means the person, who was not found suitable for promotion on the date of interview, but was recommended subject to certain specific conditions, has to be promoted after his/her evaluation by the experts. This meant that the work done by Dr. V.K. Chopra up to 2004 was not suffice and he was required to do more research work for promotion. Since Dr. V.K. Chopra was again rejected in 2008, he is eligible for promotion from 2009 only and could not be promoted from 2004 under any circumstances.

The Vice-Chancellor said that, earlier, this House has approved many such cases, including that of Dr. N.K. Sehgal.

Continuing, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that even if earlier many such cases had been approved by the House without taking approval from the U.G.C., what is the harm in sending all such cases to the U.G.C. He said that the case of Dr. N.K. Sehgal was totally different and could not be compared with that of Dr. V.K. Chopra. The University has to adopt a uniform policy for promotion as Reader and Professor under the CAS.

Shri Virander Kumar Tewari stated that he had gone through all the papers (Page No.50 to 66 from minutes of the Syndicate meeting dated 21<sup>st</sup> January 2011) relating to promotion of Dr. V.K. Chopra and Dr. Geeta Shukla. After going through these pages it had come to notice that the position of Professor is very meaningful position and the U.G.C. has been consistently trying to raise the standards of Professor in the University by way of proposing various conditions pertaining to teaching and research, publications, attendance of conferences, etc. When the promotion of Dr. V.K. Chopra has been recommended by the Selection Committee after taking the opinion of three experts, who



has authorized the Finance & Development Officer to prepare the note to the effect that since there is no date of publication in the journal, Dr. V.K. Chopra should be promoted w.e.f. 31.3.2004 as the financial year ends on 31<sup>st</sup> March? They can well imagine the status of the journal on which its date of publication is not mentioned. Since he has strong objection to the promotion case under consideration, he pleaded that the entire case of promotion of Dr. V.K. Chopra needed to be examined afresh and the approval of the U.G.C. should be taken under all circumstances.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that it is not for the first time that such a case has come. They could not have two different laws for similar cases. The basis for determining the eligibility of the candidate under C.A.S. in this case is the same which they took in other C.A.S. cases. Secondly, the eligibility is that somebody ought to have served for such a number of years and submitted such number of papers which are to be assessed and those found suitable are called for interviews. He further stated that when Dr. V.K. Chopra applied for promotion as Professor for the second time, he did not attend the interview because the Chairperson of the Department had written against his promotion; hence, he was treated as rejected. After one year when he became eligible and applied for promotion, he was found suitable and got selected. Therefore, he was entitled to take the benefit of eligibility from the back date.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that if the promotion is to be made on the basis of eligibility, what for the interviews are being held? Referring to the case under consideration, he said that the papers which were presented before the Selection Committee did not belong to that year. The two books also needed to be evaluated, which meant that promotion is to be granted only if the report of the experts is satisfactory. In any case, in several cases the date of promotion as Professor has been fixed with the approval of the U.G.C. and in this case also the same procedure should be followed.

Continuing, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that as a Chairman of the Committee constituted to look into the pending cases, he had asked for a particular circular, but the same was not supplied to him for several months. In the absence of the said circular, he could not hold the meeting of Committee. Instead of directing the office to provide the circular, it was preferred to appoint another Committee. As pointed out by Shri Virander Kumar Tewari under what circumstances, the F.D.O. has been asked to prepare a note in which he had mentioned that as there is no date of publication in the Journal, let it be considered the 31<sup>st</sup> March (end of the financial year), whereas the financial year is taken into consideration for financial purposes only and not for academic matters.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that, in fact, the Committee had recommended that the date on which somebody is found eligible after the assessment of the papers shall be the date of eligibility. If somebody is rejected and become eligible again and apply again, that date is considered as the date of his/her eligibility.

Dr. Ronki Ram stated that the University is known for academics and research and the Panjab University is internationally known by it. Administration is equally important, but they had to follow the procedures laid down by the U.G.C. for promotion as Associate Professor and Professor.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that regarding promotion of Dr. V.K. Chopra, the U.G.C. has already clarified that the University may go ahead with the recommendation of the Selection Committee subject to the condition that his date of eligibility be shifted to the date he fulfils all the requirements under CAS, in view of the U.G.C. circular of July 2003.

Shri Jarnail Singh stated that whenever the promotions under CAS were delayed, the teachers faced a lot of problems, including eligibility for travelling by air. He pleaded that since this case has already been delayed much, rather than sending it to the U.G.C., the Vice-Chancellor should himself look into it.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that if the members were confident that whatever has been proposed is right, why are they afraid of sending it to the U.G.C. for clarification?

**RESOLVED:** That the case of Dr. V.K. Chopra along with all other parallel cases would be re-examined and sent to the U.G.C. for clarification.

**XXV.** The recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Items C-5.7 to C-5.16** on the agenda were read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

**C-5.7** That the recommendations of the Committee dated 10.12.2010, constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to workout the modalities in regard to Visiting Professors and their likely role in the University be approved.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that though the Syndicate has recommended grant of sanction for prosecution of S/Shri Satish Kumar Padam, Executive Engineer and Nand Lal Kaushal, SDE, Panjab University, they have neither been supplied the copy of the complaint nor copy of the First Information Report (FIR). According to him, sanction for prosecution was being granted on the complaint of a Contractor and, that too, without application of mind.

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that the papers relating to this case (charges framed by the CBI) are of about 1000 pages. It would be difficult to make 100 copies of those 1000 pages and if that is done, it might affect the investigation being done by the CBI.

Shri Jarnail Singh said that it mean that Shri Satish Kumar Padam is a culprit. He suggested that before taking any decision the whole case should be enquired into.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that according to him, the issue was before the House and all the papers are being treated as deemed to have read. He, however, suggested that all the relevant papers should be circulated to the members and thereafter decision on granting sanction for prosecution should be taken and that would be correct procedure.

Shri Shri V.K. Sibal stated that the CBI was the Investigating Agency and they had provided a large number of documents. As Principal Executive of the University, if the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that there are sufficient charges for prosecution, sanction for prosecution should be given by the Senate as CBI is to further probe the case. Hence, it would be impractical for all of them to look into all the documents.

Dr. Ronki Ram was of the view that in the first instance both Shri Satish Kumar Padam and Shri Nand Lal Kushal should be heard by the Senate in person and if the Senate is not satisfied with their reply, the sanction for their prosecution should be granted.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that it was not for the first time the Senate was considering a case for grant of sanction for prosecution of an employee. Earlier, the case regarding grant of sanction for prosecution of Dr. Sodhi Ram, former Controller of Examination, was discussed in the Senate threadbare and sanction for his prosecution by the CBI was not granted.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that Shri Nand Lal Kaushal, SDE, was going to retire on 30<sup>th</sup> April 2011 and technically it would be difficult to retire him unless he is reinstated first.

After discussion, it was –

**RESOLVED:** That a Committee comprising of Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath, Shri V.K. Sibal and Shri Ashok Goyal be constituted to look into all the documents and make recommendations. The Vice-Chancellor be authorized to take decision on the recommendations of the Committee, on behalf of the Senate.

**XXVII.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-5.18** on the agenda was read out, viz. –

**C-5.18** That –

- (1) the request of Dr. K. Gauba, Director-Principal, Dr. H.S.J. Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital, Panjab University for his repatriation to PGI and to continue to be on leave till he is officially relieved, be accepted;

Dr. Gurmeet Singh said that since Dr. K. Gauba has joined back as Director-Principal of Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital, the above recommendations of the Syndicate seem to have become defunct. Hence, if any modification in these recommendations is required in view of his joining, the same should be placed before the Syndicate.

Shri Jarnail Singh and Dr. Gurmeet Singh suggested that the services rendered by Dr. K. Gauba as Director-Principal, Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital should be appreciated.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that as far as he remembered, it was earlier decided by the Senate that Dr. K. Gauba would continue to be the member of Dental Council of India (DCI) by virtue of Director-Principal of Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital and member of Senate.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal said that assuming whatever the Senate had passed, do they have any problem with his continuing as member of the DCI.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar stated that in the meeting of the Senate, he had said that Dr. K. Gauba should be recommended for nomination on the DCI by name so that he could remain member of the DCI till he is Director-Principal of Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the issue regarding continuation of Dr. K. Gauba as representative of the University on the DCI would be looked into.**

**RESOLVED:** That the recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-5.18** on the agenda, be approved.

**RESOLVED FURTHER:** That the appreciation of the Senate for the services rendered by Dr. K. Gauba as Director-Principal of Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital, be placed on record.

**XXVIII.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-5.19** on the agenda was read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

The Vice-Chancellor said that his unbecoming behaviour even towards authorities is highly uncalled for and he should be told to mend his ways.

Regional Centres (who do not have knowledge of Punjabi) be required to acquire a certificate having qualified Punjabi subject up to Matric standard, within a period of 3 (three) years;
2. all those teachers, who are working in the Colleges affiliated to the Panjab University situated in the Union Territory of Chandigarh (who do not have knowledge of Hindi or Punjabi) be required to acquire a certificate having qualified Hindi or Punjabi subjects up to Matric standard, within a period of 3 (three) years;
3. in future, in all the appointments of teachers to be made in Colleges affiliated to Panjab University in the State of Punjab and P.U. Regional Centres, qualifying in Punjabi and in all the appointments of teachers to be made in Colleges affiliated to Panjab University in the Union Territory of Chandigarh, qualifying in Hindi or Punjabi up to Matric standard, be made necessary. In case a teacher does not possess the requisite certificate, he/she be given two years' time for qualifying in the said subject, failing which he/she be **not** confirmed;
4. in the wider interest of the students, the teachers to be appointed at Panjab University Campus in future would also be required to qualify in Hindi or Punjabi up to Matric standard; and
5. the University would make necessary arrangements for teaching of Hindi and Punjabi by the respective Departments and conduct examination itself for issuance of certificate of having qualified in Hindi and Punjabi up to Matric standard.

**(Syndicate dated 13.12.2010 Para 13)**

Dr. P.S. Gill stated that under recommendation (1) above, all those teachers, who are working in the Colleges affiliated to the Panjab University situated in the State of Punjab and P.U. Regional Centres (who do not possess knowledge of Punjabi) are required to acquire a certificate of having qualified Punjabi subject of Matric standard. The term, 'Who do not have knowledge of Punjabi', have not been specified. He enquired whether the teachers who could read Punjabi language were also required to qualify Punjabi subject of Matric standard?

The Vice-Chancellor said that there might be teachers from all over the country, who do not possess knowledge of Hindi or Punjabi and would face a lot of problem in evaluating the answer-books of students. Secondly, the Panjab University is going to be a Centrally Funded Institute and they had to take care of all such things.

Dr. Kuldip Singh stated that the teachers are recruited in the Government Colleges situated in Chandigarh as per norms of the U.P.S.C., whereas in the State of Punjab, everybody is required to have knowledge of Punjabi language of Matric Standard. Could the University change the recruitment norms laid down by the Governments?

Dr. Mukesh Arora said that he was in favour of the recommendation of the Committee that all those teachers, who are working in the Colleges of Punjab, affiliated to the Panjab University should also possess knowledge of Hindi as there is no harm in having knowledge of Hindi in addition to Punjabi.

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that, in fact, 3-4 teachers of P.U. Regional Centre, Muktsar, neither knew Hindi nor Punjabi and could not evaluate the answer-books of the students written in Hindi or Punjabi. One of the teachers had made a representation that they should be asked to acquire the knowledge of Hindi and Punjabi, so that they could evaluate the answer-books of the students.

Referring to recommendation (2) and (3), Dr. Dalip Kumar stated that there are many teachers recruited through UPSC in the Government Colleges, Chandigarh, and in the advertisement of the UPSC, which recruits teachers from different parts of India, there was no such eligibility condition. He pleaded that the condition that in case a teacher does not possess the requisite certificate, he/she be given two years' time for qualifying in the said subject, failing which he/she be **not** confirmed, should be deleted as the confirmation of teachers of Government Colleges do not fall in the ambit of the University.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that the terms and conditions of the Central Government are applicable on the teachers appointed in the Colleges of U.T. Government and of Punjab Government to those, who are appointed in the Government Colleges in the State of Punjab. According to the State Policy, they are required to pass Punjabi of Matric standard before their appointment. He suggested that the condition of Punjabi should only be imposed on the teachers appointed/to be appointed in the Regional Centres of the University.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that for those, who seek appointment in P.U. Regional Centres, the University could impose a condition that they should acquire knowledge of Punjabi and a Committee for the purpose should be constituted.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into by appointing a small Committee comprising of Shri Virander Kumar Tewari, Dean, Faculty of Languages.**

**This was agreed to.**

#### **Item C-6.2 - Gap**

**XXXIII.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-6.3** on the agenda were read out, viz. –

**C-6.3** That the Vice-Chancellor be authorized to initiate the process/es for implementing the recommendations of the 6th Central Pay Commission and certain other UGC guidelines and implementation of Section 2(d) (iv) of the CEI Act, 2006 and certain modifications/ amendments etc. which have to be carried in the Regulations in PU Calendars.

**(Syndicate dated 13.12.2010 Para 1)**

Shri Ashok Goyal enquired whether the University could enhance the age of retirement of teachers from 60 years to 65 years in the absence of ratification by the Punjab Government. Earlier also the Senate had to eat a humble pie when it approved enhancement in age of superannuation of teachers from 60 years to 62 years as the same was rejected by the Government of India. He pleaded that they should propose amendment in Regulations in such a way that it is approved by the Government.

**RESOLVED:** That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-6.3** on the agenda, be approved.

**XXXIV.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-6.4** on the agenda were read out, viz. –

**C-6.4** That it be recommended to the Senate that, in recognition of their scholarship and conspicuous service to the University, the following persons be conferred the title of 'Professor Emeritus', under Regulation 3 at page 114 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007:

1. Dr. S.C. Verma  
Department of Botany
2. Dr. S.B. Bhatia  
Department of Geology

**(Syndicate dated 13.12.2010 Para 1)**

Dr. Gurmeet Singh pointed out that in the Annual Report of the University (July 2009 – June 2010) a list of Emeritus Professors has been given upto 1.3.2011, which is wrong. In fact, the list of Emeritus Professor should be upto 1.3.2010 as the Annual Report is upto 1.6.2010. He further said that when the Vice-Chancellor, who is so much busy, could still do research, why cannot the Emeritus Professors are involved in the research activities.

The Vice-Chancellor said that he would ask the Dean of University Instruction Office to make necessary corrections in the Annual Report.

Continuing, Dr. Gurmeet Singh suggested that Dr. Neelam Man Singh Chaudhary, who is a great personality in the field of theatre at national as well as international level, should also be made an Emeritus Professor.

**The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.**

**RESOLVED:** That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-6.4** on the agenda, be approved.

**XXXV** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-6.5** on the agenda were read out, viz. –

**C-6.5** That –

1. PCPs at University School of Open Learning may be covered under special lectures;
2. The teachers, who possess the minimum qualifications for the post of Assistant Professor, conducting PCPs at University School of Open Learning may be given payment @ ₹1,000/- per lecture at par with guest faculty in other teaching

departments of University and provision for required funds for the same may be made in the budget because, if there is difference in payments for taking lecturers (1-hour duration) within the University, the teachers would opt for taking classes at a place where higher payment is made;

3. In future, the payments for conducting PCPs at University School of Open Learning be kept at par with payments to be made to the Guest Faculty (having same qualifications) in the University teaching Departments and uniformity be maintained.

**(Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 Para 8)**

Dr. Emanuel Nahar pleaded that for conducting P.C.P., the University School of Open Learning should be allowed to make payment to the teachers at the rate of Rs.1000/- w.e.f. 2010-11.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the increase is always made prospectively and never retrospectively.

**RESOLVED:** That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-6.5** on the agenda, be approved.

**XXXVI.** The recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Items C-6.6, C-6.7, C-6.8 and C-6.9** on the agenda were read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

**C-6.6** That the nomenclature of fee head of B.Sc. in Hospitality and Hotel Administration and B.Sc. in Tourism Management to undertake the students activities like field visits, soft skill training, inviting industry experts, placement activities etc. be changed from 'Field Work' to **'Student Welfare Activities Fund'**.

**(Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 Para 15)**

**C-6.7** That Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) be executed between Swami Sarvanand Giri Panjab University Regional Centre, Bajwara (Hoshairpur) and M/s Infosys Technologies Ltd., Bangalore-560100.

**(Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 Para 41)**

**C-6.8** That the report submitted by Hon'ble Mr. Justice K.C. Gupta (Retired) with regard to the alleged violations of the Lyngdoh Commission directives in the Elections to the Panjab University Campus Students Council during 2010, be accepted and for its implementation a Committee be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor.

**(Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 Para 45)**

**C-6.9** That the recommendations of the College Development Council dated 30.12.2010, be approved.

**(Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 Para 46)**

**XXXVII.** The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-6.10** on the agenda was read out, viz. –

**C-6.10** That Dr. Janmit Singh, Fellow, be allowed to exercise his statutory rights as a member of the Senate, but the decision will have to be got ratified by the Senate.

**(Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 Para 50)**

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the Item placed before the Syndicate dated 21.1.2011 was that Dr. Janmit Singh be allowed to exercise his statutory rights as Member of the Senate. But nowhere in his representation, he has requested the University to restore his voting rights. Earlier also they had discussed and came to the conclusion that they could grant something which was not asked for. He further stated that in his representation, Dr. Janmit Singh had levelled serious and mischievous allegation that “It is for the first time that ignoring all the precedents and in violation of the Statutory Regulations which allow me to continue as member of the Senate which I am continuing, I denied the rights conferred upon me by virtue of my position as a Senator”. He had further alleged that the academicians should be saved from the high-handedness and blackmailing of certain persons, e.g. Shri Ashok Goyal and Professor Keshav Malhotra. Dr. Janmit Singh had mentioned in his representation that “it is material fact on record that I have not ceased to be Principal of the affiliated degree college on account of appointment for a period of less than one year. Interestingly, this assignment was given to me by you without my giving any application and you made this announcement at Village Kauni when you had gone to inaugurate Regional Rural Centre at Kauni, District Muktsar, to which I readily agreed to serve. I still continue to be the Principal of that college to which post I can go back at any time as I have my lien. It is also a material fact on record that in the past past, similar situation arose when some of the sitting Fellows were selected and appointed to higher posts, they continued to be the member of the Senate till they were confirmed to the higher post ....”. He had further alleged that Shri Ashok Goyal and Professor Keshav Malhotra are tricky persons. Regarding Shri Anupam Gupta, he had alleged that Shri Anupam Gupta had hatched a criminal conspiracy against him. The Syndicate had considered his representation without going into the contents and recommended restoration of his rights. Shri Ashok Goyal pleaded that an enquiry should be instituted under what authority/regulation voting rights had been withdrawn and later on restored on the orders of the court, though the orders of the court are not known. In fact, it was the Vice-Chancellor who announced in the meeting of the Senate that in view of the legal opinion obtained from the University Legal Retainer, Professor Janmit Singh, P.U. Rural Centre, Kauni, had been allowed to attend the meeting of the Senate, but he would not be allowed to cast his vote for the election of Syndicate as Fellow of the University. The representation of Dr. Janmit Singh had also said that since he was supporting a particular candidate from the Principals’ Constituency, who was not liked by Professor Keshav Malhotra, Dr. Keshav Malhotra got deleted his name from the list of voters of Principals’ Constituency. Shri Ashok Goyal said that, in fact, Professor Keshav Malhotra was in no way involved in the election process, but Dr. Janmit Singh just by mere saying had levelled allegations against him.

Continuing, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the representation of Dr. Janmit Singh was “undated” and presented before the Syndicate in January 2011. He is not interested in knowing when the representation was received in the University because Dr. Janmit Singh did not ask for restoration of statutory rights in his representation, though the item regarding which was placed before the Syndicate by the University. The representation says that a kind of conspiracy has been hatched by two persons, who are presently members of the Syndicate, whereas he and Professor Keshav Malhotra were not members of the Syndicate in January 2011. This meant that the representation had been written in parts, i.e. some parts in December 2010 and some in January 2011. Meaning thereby, everything has been done in a planned manner.

Continuing further, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that Dr. Janmit Singh in his representation at page 145 has alleged that “it is a fact that I was not having good relations with one Mr. Kamal Chaudhry, who remained President of the D.A.V. College Managing Committee, Hoshiarpur. One complaint was got managed by Mr. Ashok Goel and Dr. Kehsav Malhotra against me by Mr. Kamal Chaudhary, who was inimical to me, because he lost control of the management of D.A.V. College in which I happened to be Principal and he forcibly tried to occupy the College and its management which was resisted by me and the Management and criminal cases were filed against Shri Kamal Chaudary in which I happen to be an eyewitness”. At page 147, the representation says that “Dr. Keshav Malhotra was to contest election from the Language Faculty and his close aid Dr. Dinesh Gupta had to contest election for the office of Dean from the Faculty of Business Management & Commerce. So, it was an attempt to deprive me of right to vote”. Shri Ashok Goyal reiterated his demand that an enquiry should be conducted to examine the whole issue.

Continuing further, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the minutes of the Committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor are never shown to the members of the Committee. He had requested the Vice-Chancellor, Registrar, Dean, College Development Council, etc. to supply him a copy of the minutes of a meeting of the Committee held on 24.8.2010 in the P.U. Guest House, constituted by the Vice-Chancellor under the Chairmanship of Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath, of which he was a member. But he was sorry to say that he had been told that no such minutes are available in the University. He enquired where the minutes are gone. It is not the first case, in four other cases, though certain decisions were taken by the Committee but the minutes were recorded differently. He pleaded that an enquiry should be conducted so that whosoever is guilty should be taken to task. He had with him the photocopies of all the relevant documents but what have been supplied to the Vice-Chancellor was totally different. He enquired what right the Chairman of the Committee had got on behalf of the members. He remembered that two years ago, Shri V.K. Sibal had suggested that the proceedings should be signed by all the members of the Committee but still the Chairman alone is signing the proceedings. He again pleaded that a certified copy of the original minutes of the Committee dated 23.8.2010 and 24.8.2010 which were supposed to be signed by all the members, should be supplied to him as he was a member of the said Committees. If the same were not supplied, it would be a big scandal and he would lodge F.I.R. with the Police, make a complaint to the Chancellor & other higher authorities in the country and also raise the issue in the media, so that the culprits are brought to book.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that there was not even a single case where the rights of a member have been snatched. In fact, Dr. Janmit Singh had been appointed as Professor on temporary basis and he had been allowed to retain his lien as Principal by the College Management. Since there is no provision in the University Calendar, he had been wrongly denied the right to vote as member of the Senate. When report came, it was realized that there is no provision in the Act/Regulations to deny a member of the Senate his right to vote, the item was placed before the Syndicate for restoration of his voting rights.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that whatever Shri Ashok Goyal had said regarding forging of minutes of the meetings of the Committee is absolutely right. He said that minutes of one of the Committee meeting of U.M.C. were also not written by the Chairman in accordance with the decision taken by the Committee.

The Vice-Chancellor said that denial of voting right is different, but levelling serious allegations and passing derogatory remarks by a member of the Senate needed enquiry.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that whosoever is at fault should be punished.

Principal Hardiljit Singh Gosal stated that a member of the Senate could only be removed by the Government and that too, on the recommendation of the Senate

supported by at least two-thirds of the whole of number of Fellows. As soon as such order is notified in the official Gazette, the person so appointed or elected shall cease to be a Fellow.

After some further discussion, it was –

**RESOLVED:** That the Vice-Chancellor be authorized to re-examine the case and take appropriate decision, on behalf of the Senate.

**XXXVIII.** Considered the following Resolution (**Item C-6.11**) proposed by Dr. Dharinder Tayal, a Fellow:

“the attire for the Convocation of the University be in Consonance with our culture and weather”.

**NOTE:** The Syndicate dated 5.3.2011 (Para 21) has resolved that the above Resolution proposed by Dr. Dharinder Tayal, a Fellow, be forwarded to the Senate with the remarks that the recommendation of the Committee dated 11.2.2011, be accepted.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Committee of Syndics, constituted by him, to consider the above Resolution proposed by Dr. Dharinder Tayal, has not recommended any change in Regulation/s.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal stated that though the Committee has not recommended any change, but the attire for the Convocation of the University can be changed by amending the Regulation/s, of course, with the concurrence of the House. One of the members had said that he (Dr. Tayal) had given it a political colour by meeting certain students belonging to ABVP after the meeting. After the meeting, one can meet anyone. Referring to a comment made by one of the members in the Syndicate that black is a beautiful colour, he said that after doing some research he came to the conclusion that today black is also referred to as ‘black marketing, black myth’, which is an inactivity.

The Vice-Chancellor said that biologically black is rich colour and it has something melanin, whereas white is prone to cancer.

Continuing, Dr. Dharinder Tayal stated that most of the members of the Syndicate and Senate did not attend the entire Convocation. From which it is clear that they are not comfortable in the gowns. The basic idea for proposing the Resolution was that the gown should be attractive and comfortable to the students. The plea that the students do not like his proposal is incorrect because it had appeared in the newspapers that students wanted the change. Though nothing can be forced on anybody, he had just made an attempt to protect the honour of the country by leaving the colonial legacy and it is just a suggestion. Secondly, the black colour is not conducive to the Indian weather. Dr. Tayal suggested, if his Resolution could not be accepted in the present form, the Fashion Technology Department of the University could be asked to prepare three-four designs of the gowns, which should be considered in the next meeting of the Senate.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that his only request is that the Regulations of the University should be fully respected by the members of the Syndicate and Senate. If they themselves did not honour the regulation of the University, how they could expect the same from the Colleges and the public at large. In fact the Regulation says “Fellows and Graduates of the University shall be entitled to wear academical costumes...”, but a member of the Syndicate and Senate attended the Convocation without wearing the gown. How the Vice-Chancellor had allowed this?

The Vice-Chancellor said that every member should have full respect to the Regulations.

Shri Dayal Pratap Singh Randhawa said that though the Regulations provide that it is mandatory to wear gowns by the Fellows and graduates, but these did not debar them to change the design of the gowns. He, therefore, suggested that the change in design of gowns should be considered.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal said that had he not have respect for other members of the Committee, he would have protested in unethical manner.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that whatever Regulation was there or decision taken, everybody has to follow the same and nobody has got any right to violate it.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal said that 100% of the members do not follow the Regulations, i.e., they did not wear the ceremonial cap, which is also a violation of the regulations. Who had authorized them to do so?

Principal S.S. Sangha said that if the entire gown could not be changed, at least change in colour should be considered.

**RESOLVED:** That the above Resolution proposed by Dr. Dharinder Tayal, a Fellow, be rejected.

**XXXIX.** The information contained in **Item R-6.1** on the agenda was read out and ratified,  
i.e. –

**R-6.1** That the Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate/Senate, has approved the following recommendation of the Advisory Committee dated 4.2.2010, as recommended by the Dean, Faculty of Science to discharge the functions of the Board of Studies in Microbial Biotechnology for the examination of November/December 2010:

“The examination system of M.Sc. Microbial Biotechnology be changed and adopted as existing in Department of Biotechnology i.e. the examination system (Theory and Practical) should be purely internal”

**XL.      ZERO HOUR**

Dr. P.S. Gill stated that though the deduction from the teachers' remuneration for evaluation towards 'Teachers' Holiday Home' had been increased, the allocation for them in the Holiday Home had not been increased. He further said that one of the teachers of GGN Khalsa College, Ludhiana, was asked to vacate the 'Teachers' Holiday Home', Shimla, at midnight.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the former Registrar, Professor S.S. Bari, had asked the teacher to vacate the accommodation because he had himself signed as the Principal of the College.

Shri Harpreet Singh Dua stated that a Principal of the College counter-signed the request of three teachers for reservation of accommodation in 'Teachers' Holiday Home', Shimla, and when the teachers concerned requested for reservation of accommodation, the office told them that five rooms had already been reserved for teachers on the recommendation of the same Principal. In fact, the teacher had himself counter-signed the form as Principal of another College. Affidavits to the effect that none of them had counter-signed the form in question had been given by both the Principals, attested by First Class Magistrate.

Principal Hardiljit Singh Gosal said that since the teachers are entitled for reservation of accommodation, they should not be required to get the form counter-signed by the Principal.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that it is not for the first time that such a complaint had been received by the University. But it is surprising that no enquiry had been conducted so far.

The Vice-Chancellor said that he would look into the file and take appropriate action.
