Condolence Resolution

The Vice-Chancellor said, "it is with deep regret that we learnt about the passing away of –

- (1) Shri I.K. Gujral, the 12th Prime Minister of India from April 1997 to March 1998, in New Delhi. He was a distinguished alumnus of Panjab University. On his demise, the country has lost an illustrious son and all of us at Panjab University have lost a pillar of support and source of inspiration.
- (2) Professor O.P. Vig, former Chairperson, Department of Chemistry, Panjab University, on November 24, 2012. In his death, we have lost a renowned academician.
- (3) Professor Rajinder Kumar Sharma of Visveshvaranand Vishvabandhu Institute of Sanskrit & Indological Studies (VVBIS & IS) (Sadhu Ashram), Hoshiarpur, on the night of December 12, 2012, after a brief illness. In his demise the University in particular and the society at large has lost a good academician.

The Syndicate expressed sorrow and grief over the passing away of Shri I.K. Gujral, former Prime Minister, Professor O.P. Vig, former Chairperson, Department of Chemistry and Professor Rajinder Kumar Sharma of VVBIS & IS, Hoshiarpur, and observed two minutes silence, all standing, to pay homage to the departed souls. The Syndicate also passed the following Resolution:

"The members of the Syndicate of the Panjab University are pained to learn about the sudden demise of Shri I.K. Gujral,

former Prime Minister, Professor O.P. Vig, former Chairperson, Department of Chemistry and Professor Rajinder Kumar Sharma of VVBIS & IS, Hoshiarpur. The Syndicate has decided to send this resolution to the members of the bereaved family.

We, the members of the Syndicate of Panjab University, Chandigarh, offer our heartfelt condolences to the bereaved families and pray to the Almighty to grant eternal peace to the departed souls and enough courage and strength to the members of the bereaved families to bear this irreparable loss.”

Vice-Chancellor's Statement

1(i). The Vice-Chancellor said, –

- “(1) I am happy to inform that Professor Ashvini Agrawal, Department of Ancient History, Culture and Archeology, has been elected as the President of the Numismatic Society of India for the year 2012-2013 and will also preside over its Centenary Session held at the Vishva Bharati University Shantiniketan (West Bengal) from 30th November 2012 to 2nd December 2012.
- (2) I am happy to inform that Professor Suman Bala Beri (Retd.), Department of Physics, Panjab University, has been awarded the prestigious position of Emeritus Scientist of the CSIR, New Delhi, for three years. Besides Scientist Allowance of Rs.20,000/- per month and honorarium for a research staff, CSIR will release Rs.1,00,000/- per annum as a Research Grant.
- (3) It is a matter of satisfaction that the Department of Zoology, Panjab University, has been identified for support by the DST under the FIST Programme with financial assistance of Rs.1.10 crore to strengthen teaching and research in the Department. The Department of Zoology is one of the oldest Science Departments of the University and had a long history. It would have been better if this Department was granted the status of Centre for Advanced Studies in Zoology by the U.G.C. He assured that he will make efforts for making this Department as Centre for Advanced Studies in Zoology.”

RESOLVED: That –

- (1) Congratulations of the Syndicate be conveyed to Professor Ashvini Agrawal, Department of Ancient History, Culture and Archeology, on being elected as the President of the Numismatic Society of India for the year 2012-2013.
- (2) Appreciation of the Syndicate be conveyed to Professor Suman Bala Beri (Retd.), Department of Physics, Panjab University, on being awarded the prestigious position of Emeritus Scientist of the CSIR, New Delhi, for three years.

- (3) The information contained in Vice-Chancellor's statement at Sr. No. (3), be noted.

Before Item 2 on the agenda was taken up, the Vice-Chancellor gave the feedback to the item pertaining to promotion of Dr. Devinder Singh, Department of Laws, which was deferred by the Syndicate in its September meeting. He said, "a perusal of the pronouncement in U.G.C. document clearly imply that the assessment in: (i) contribution to research; (ii) domain knowledge and teaching and practice; and (iii) interview performance, are to be made by duly constituted Committee, after a given candidate fulfils the eligibility criteria which form the basis of call to appear before the Selection Committee. It may be recalled that the duly constituted Selection Committee did not consider Dr. Devinder Singh, Department of Laws, to be eligible for promotion to the rank of Professor on the basis of all the three counts together, as brought before the Syndicate in its meeting held in September 2012."

The Vice-Chancellor explained the process initiated by him for consideration of promotion cases under the Career Advancement Scheme of the U.G.C. Since the promotion case of Dr. Devinder Singh had not been routed through the new process, in order to give him benefit, his case would also now be processed under the new process. Under the new process, the candidate concerned would be asked to provide a brief summary (3-4 pages) of his research work, which would be sent to the experts. The candidate would also be asked to give a list of 6-7 experts out of whom he would pick up 2-3 experts and add a few. After getting the reports from the experts, the promotion case of the candidate would be placed before the Selection Committee. This all had been done so that they could have some feedback about the candidate before his case is considered by the Selection Committee for promotion.

Shri Ashok Goyal pointed out that in the case of Dr. Devinder Singh, the Selection Committee did not award the marks in any of the three columns and that created the problem. He pleaded that this candidate should be reconsidered for promotion from the due date.

Some of the other members, including Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath were also of the view that the case of Dr. Devinder Singh for promotion as Professor under the CAS should be reconsidered from the due date.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that if his memory helped him out, a decision was taken by the Syndicate that the minutes of the Selection Committees would be sent along with the agenda papers. He did not know why the Vice-Chancellor had not implemented the said decision. If there was any difficulty in implementing the decision, the matter should have been placed before the Syndicate for review. In fact, the decision was taken keeping in view the fact that the members could not do the evaluation of the minutes of the Selection Committees on the spot. By placing the minutes of the Selection Committees on the tables, the members had been deprived of going through the minutes.

The Vice-Chancellor said that though the observations made by Shri Ashok Goyal are genuine, when the agenda for the November meeting of the Syndicate was issued to the members, the very next

day it appeared in the Press. Keeping in view the confidentiality of the recommendations of the Selection Committees, he thought it better to supply the same to the members on the table.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that it was no excuse that the recommendations of the Selection Committees are confidential and could not be shared with the members of the Syndicate. If they had done everything in fair and transparent manner, they should not be afraid of the Press. He did not want to become a hurdle in the appointments/promotions of the candidates being presented today. In any case if the items are taken up for consideration, he would like to reserve his right to speak in the Senate because he would not be able to go through the details of the recommendations of the Selection Committee and the documents attached to them.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that, in addition to what Shri Ashok Goyal had said, as had been practice earlier, a copy of the brief bio-data of the candidates, who are called for the interview, should be provided to each and every member of the Selection Committee in advance so that they had some idea about the candidates.

Principal R.S. Jhanji said that the detailed bio-data of the candidate should be provided to the members of the Selection Committees in advance.

The Vice-Chancellor said that consolidated summary of all the bio-data in the form of copies of application forms could be made available to the members in advance. It would not be possible to provide the detailed bio-data along with all the attachments and publications to each and every member of the Selection Committee prior to the meeting.

The Vice-Chancellor further said that the members would be given sufficient time to scrutinize the recommendations of the Selection Committee.

RESOLVED: That, in future, -

- (1) the minutes of the Selection Committees be supplied to the members as and when they are finalized, i.e., along with main agenda, supplementary agenda, and the rest on the table; and
- (2) a copy of the dossier of the summary bio-data of the candidates, who have been called for the interview, be supplied to the members of the Selection Committee well in advance.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that if it had been mentioned in the advertisement that the number of posts may increase or decrease, the persons could be put on the panel; otherwise, not. He suggested that, in future, it should be mentioned in each and every advertisement that the number of posts could increase or decrease.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the persons who had been put on the panel should be treated as placed on the Waiting List.

It seemed that on 21st November only the candidates belonging to General Category were called for interview and the candidates belonging to SC categories were called for interview on 22nd November, which is wrong because it seemed as if the SC candidates had been deprived of their right to appear in the interview for the general post and compete with the candidates of general category.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the factual position was that on the first day, i.e. 21.11.2012, 14 candidates were called for the interview and the rest of the candidates were called for interview on 22.11.2012. Incidentally, the first 14 candidates belonged to general category and the rest to SC category. However, the merit list was prepared after all the candidates were interviewed. Moreover, the marks secured by the SC category candidates were less than the marks of general category candidate. Hence, SC category candidate could not be considered for appointment against the general category post.

The competent authority could assign them teaching duties in the same subject in other teaching Departments of the University in order to utilize their subject expertise/specialization and to meet the needs of the allied Departments at a given point of time, with the limits of workload as prescribed in the U.G.C. norms.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That Dr. Jagmahender Singh, be placed on the Waiting List for appointment against the general category post.

2. A summary bio-data of the selected and waiting list candidate/s enclosed. It is certified that the selected and waiting list candidate/s fulfilled the qualifications laid down for the post.

The competent authority could assign him teaching duties in the same subject in other teaching Departments of the University in order to utilize his subject expertise/specialization and to meet the needs of the allied Departments at a given point of time, with the limits of workload as prescribed in the U.G.C. norms.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That Dr. (Ms.) Swaran Lata (SC) be placed on the Waiting List.

Appointment of Assistant Professors-2 (Gen.-1, SC-1) in the Department of Statistics

2(xvi). Considered minutes dated 13.12.2012 (**Appendix-XV**) of the Selection Committees for appointment of Assistant Professors-2 (General-1, SC-1) in the Department of Statistics.

RESOLVED: That Dr. (Ms.) Anju Goyal be appointed Assistant Professor (against the general category post) in the Department of Statistics, Panjab University, Chandigarh, on one year's probation, in the pay-scale of Rs.15600-39100 + AGP Rs.6000/-, on a pay to be fixed according to rules of Panjab University.

The competent authority could assign her teaching duties in the same subject in other teaching Departments of the University in order to utilize her subject expertise/specialization and to meet the needs of the allied Departments at a given point of time, with the limits of workload as prescribed in the U.G.C. norms.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That since Dr. (Ms.) Meenal – SC candidate was not found suitable, the post reserved for SC Categories, be re-advertised.

NOTE: 1. The score chart of all the candidates who appeared in the interview will form a part of the proceedings.

2. A summary bio-data of the selected and waiting list candidate/s enclosed. It is certified that the selected candidate/s fulfilled the qualifications laid down for the post.

Appointment of Assistant Professor in Statistics at USOL

2(xvii). Considered minutes dated 13.12.2012 (**Appendix-XVI**) of the Selection Committees for appointment of Assistant Professor in Statistics at University School of Open Learning.

Dr. P.S. Gill pointed out that the candidate Ms. Anju Goyal had been given marks for the Ph.D., but she had not been awarded the Ph.D. degree, which was wrong and the same should be deleted.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that the candidate's Ph.D. viva was held and validated at Panjab University before the last date of application, i.e., 31.01.2012 and the candidate has been awarded Ph.D. degree by the time of interview. She, therefore, stood awarded 15 marks for Ph.D. degree in the template.

RESOLVED: That Dr. (Ms.) Anju Goyal be appointed Assistant Professor in Statistics at University School of Open Learning, Panjab University, Chandigarh, on one year's probation, in the pay-scale of Rs.15600-39100 + AGP Rs.6000/-, on a pay to be fixed according to rules of Panjab University.

The competent authority could assign her teaching duties in the same subject in other teaching Departments of the University in order to utilize her subject expertise/specialization and to meet the needs of the allied Departments at a given point of time, with the limits of workload as prescribed in the U.G.C. norms.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That the following persons, in order of merit, be placed on the Waiting List:

1. Ms. Richa Sharma
2. Dr. Gurjeeb Singh Walia.

NOTE: 1. The score chart of all the candidates who appeared in the interview will form a part of the proceedings.

2. A summary bio-data of the selected and waiting list candidate/s enclosed. It is certified that the selected and waiting list candidate/s fulfilled the qualifications laid down for the post.

Shri Ashok Goyal enquired as to what was their opinion about the eligibility of those persons who are not covered under the clarification given by the U.G.C. recently that the candidates who had been awarded Ph.D. degree prior to the enforcement of U.G.C. Regulations 2009 are not eligible for the post of Assistant Professor if they had not qualified U.G.C. NET. He stated that in fact they had adopted the U.G.C. guidelines in toto and one of the guidelines of the U.G.C. is that those who had been awarded the Ph.D. degree in terms of Regulations 2009, have been exempted from the U.G.C. NET. But most of the members of the Senate in its meeting held in December 2011 were of the opinion that whosoever had done Ph.D. before 2009 should be exempted from the U.G.C. NET. Hence, the Senate took the decision that all the Ph.D. degree holders irrespective of the year of award of degree are exempted from the U.G.C. NET and are eligible for the post of Assistant Professor both in the University and the Colleges affiliated to it. Since the University had no discretion, the matter had been referred to the U.G.C. for clarification and now that the U.G.C. had given its clarification, the said decision of the Senate stood nullified and the University should have stopped the selection process.

Principal Gurdip Sharma said that the Senate had taken the decision on the issue after due deliberations. The Government of Haryana has made such degree holders eligible for the post of Assistant Professors. The MHRD has already notified that the matter is still under consideration.

Principal Janmit Singh said that the Senate had taken the decision after due deliberations and the process for filling up posts was started accordingly.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the clarification received would be placed before the new Syndicate.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that the language of the U.G.C. regulation on the issue is "those who are or who acquire Ph.D. under Regulation 2009 are exempted from U.G.C. NET and are eligible for the post of Assistant Professor. Those who are already registered shall also be exempted when they completed their degrees. The U.G.C. had also circulated that those who have acquired Ph.D. from those Universities which have been set up under the Legislative Act, Central Act or Parliament Act or those private Universities/Institution which have been awarded "A" status by the NAAC are also exempted

from U.G.C. NET and are eligible for the post of Assistant Professor. Secondly, the Regulations 2009 are under review. Therefore, the statutory bodies of the University could adopt the service conditions for their employees.

Professor Naval Kishore informed that the MHRD in its communication dated 22nd October 2012 had informed while approving the recommendations of the Revisit Committee that as regards grant of exemption from U.G.C. NET for Ph.D. degree holders, the members could forward their suggestions to the Revisit Committee.

Shri Ashok Goyal informed that the University Business School of the Panjab University had already been awarding the Ph.D. degree since long as per the conditions laid down in the U.G.C. Regulations 2009, i.e., after getting the course work done by the students. Meaning thereby that the degrees awarded by the University in the Faculty of Business Management and Commerce even in the year 2000 are in terms of U.G.C. Regulations 2009. He suggested that the Vice-Chancellor should visit the U.G.C. and get the matter clarified. Let the University not do anything for which humble pie would have to be eaten later.

The suggestion put forth by Shri Ashok Goyal was agreed to.

The Vice-Chancellor said that next round of interviews calls will not be proceeded to till the clarification is received.

Shri Ashok Goyal informed that the D.U.I. had issued a letter to the Chairpersons of the University Teaching Departments and Principals of the affiliated Colleges on the above issue.

Principal Gurdip Sharma and Principal R.S. Jhanji pleaded that the letter issued by the D.U.I. should be withdrawn forthwith, otherwise the whole process of selections in the Colleges would become standstill and the students would be the ultimate sufferers.

The Vice-Chancellor informed that the letter issued by the D.U.I. was just for information and not the University directive. However, the matter would be checked.

Issue regarding re-employment of Professor V.K. Jindal (Retd.), Department of Physics

3. Considered the recommendations of the Committee dated 26.3.2012 (**Appendix-XVII**) constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to formalize the period of re-employment of Professor V.K. Jindal, Department of Physics w.e.f. 2.2.2010 up to 1.12.2010 after attaining the age of superannuation 60 years on 31.1.2010, for the period, he actually performed his duties in the Department and he be paid his salary as per University rules, i.e., last pay drawn minus pension (pay plus allowances excluding House rent). Information contained in the office note (**Appendix-XVII**) was also taken into consideration.

NOTE: 1. Professor V.K. Jindal, Department of Physics, had applied for re-employment on 10.02.2010, but was not given re-employment as he had gone to the Court and the matter was sub-judice.

2. Professor V.K. Jindal (Retd.) appointed as Guest Faculty on payment of honorarium of Rs.250/- per lecture with the ceiling of Rs.10,000/- per month for the classes which he had taught as per old rules pertaining to guest faculty, vide letter No. 4495/Estt. dated 17.9.2010 (**Appendix-XVII**).
3. The Academic Committee of the Department in its meeting dated 10.2.2010 (**Appendix-XVII**) considered and had recommended his re-employment.
4. The Academic and Administrative Committees of the Department of Physics in its meeting dated 28.3.2011(**Appendix-XVII**) also reiterated his case for re-employment as per rules.
5. **The Syndicate dated 29.5.2011 (Para 21) had resolved that Professor V.K. Jindal (Retd.), Department of Physics, be re-employed w.e.f. the date he joins after Syndicate decision, under Rule 8 at page 130 of Panjab University Calendar, Volume III, 2009, on contract basis for a period of one year on fixed emoluments equivalent to last pay drawn minus pension to be worked out on the full service of 33 years both in case of teachers opting for pension or CPF. Salary for this purpose means pay plus allowances excluding House Rent Allowance.**
6. The Senate dated 16.10.2011 (Para XI) also approved the recommendations of the Syndicate dated 29.5.2011.
7. The Chairperson, Department of Physics vide letter dated PHS/10/1799 dated 24.8.2010 (**Appendix-XVII**) has written that Dr. Jindal had begun teaching M.Sc. II year Advanced Condensed Matter Physics on 4.1.2010 (date of start of even semester teaching). However, **between 31.1.2010 to 10.2.2010 Dr. Jindal was not teaching in the Department.** The Department faced a difficulty in replacing Dr. Jindal.
8. The Chairperson, Department of Physics vide letter dated PHS/12/292 dated 25.1.2012 (**Appendix-XVII**) has also written that Professor Jindal was assigned the full teaching and supervision workload which he carried out till the end of the Semester, i.e., 1st June, 2012. Thereafter he performed the assigned academic responsibilities up to December 1, 2010.

9. The Chairperson, Department of Physics vide letter dated PHS/12/1500 dated 24.8.2012 (**Appendix-XVII**) has also written that **Dr. Jindal joined as CSIR Emeritus Scientist on 1.12.2010. His re-employment period at the University notionally would terminate on 30.11.2010.**

The Vice-Chancellor stated that let him very briefly recapitulate. Without waiting for any kind of approval, Dr. V.K. Jindal was re-employed by the Department and assigned teaching workload. When the approval was not received even by the next Semester, no teaching work was assigned to him during the 2nd Semester. Later on, it was recommended and approved that he should be paid as Guest Faculty @ Rs.250/- per lecture. But since the person (Dr. V.K. Jindal) had taught for some time, evaluated the assignments/answerbooks of the students as a valid teacher, he should be paid salary (for the period 10th February 2010 to 14th July 2010).

Principal Janmit Singh suggested that the Vice-Chancellor should be authorized to take decision in the matter, on behalf of the Syndicate.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that he had already expressed his views in the previous meeting of the Syndicate and one of his views was that he should be paid on per lecture basis @ Rs.250/- for the period he had taught. If Dr. Jindal is to be paid any salary, a certificate from the then Chairperson, Department of Physics be obtained to the effect of the number of days/months he had taught in the Department.

Endorsing the viewpoints expressed by Shri Ashok Goyal, Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that Dr. V.K. Jindal was allocated teaching workload with the understanding that in case his re-employment was not approved by the competent body, he would be paid @ Rs.250/- per lecture. As far as payment of salary on re-employment is concerned, Dr. Jindal could not be paid salary as he had not vacated the University accommodation within the requisite period of two months, the condition which is necessary for getting re-employment. Moreover, the re-employment of certain teachers were cancelled because they did not vacate the University accommodation. If Dr. Jindal is paid as per re-employment scheme, there would be injustice to those, who had been denied re-employment and also those whose re-employment had been cancelled.

Professor M. Shakeel Khan said that if Dr. Jindal is treated as re-employed and paid salary accordingly, the decision should be implemented in all the similarly placed cases.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the cases of those teachers, who had been denied re-employment on similar grounds, would be reconsidered for re-employment provided that they are below the age of 65 years.

RESOLVED: That a certificate be obtained from the then Chairperson (viz., Professor M.M. Gupta), Department of Physics and Professor C.S. Aulakh (present Chairperson) as to for which period Dr.

V.K. Jindal (Professor Retd.) had taught in the Department and his case for payment of salary be considered accordingly by the Vice-Chancellor.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That all other such cases be also considered on their respective merit.

Recommendations of Administrative and Academic Committees of Dept. of Mathematics regarding conversion of posts

4. Considered the following recommendations of the joint meetings of Administrative and Academic Committees dated 4.9.2012 (**Appendix-XVIII**) of the Department of Mathematics:

- (i) that to meet the need-based requirement of the Department, out of 5 vacant posts of Professors, one post be converted into Assistant Professor and out of 7 vacant posts of Associate Professors, two posts be converted into Assistant Professors; and
- (ii) that the above mentioned three converted posts of Assistant Professors be advertised by making necessary changes in the roster already approved by the Syndicate/ Senate.

Information contained in the office note (**Appendix-XVIII**) was also taken into consideration.

RESOLVED: That, as recommended by the Administrative and Academic Committees of the Department of Mathematics, to meet the need-based requirement of the Department, out of 5 vacant posts of Professors, one post be converted into Assistant Professor and out of 7 vacant posts of Associate Professors, two posts be converted into Assistant Professors.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That the above mentioned three converted posts of Assistant Professors be advertised by making necessary changes in the roster already approved by the Syndicate/Senate.

Recommendations of Standing Committee dated 6.12.2012 constituted to redress the grievances of Research Scholars

5. Considered the following recommendations of the Standing Committee dated 6.12.2012 (**Appendix-XIX**) constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to redress the grievances of the Research Scholars:

- (1) That the approved (before 2002) permanent (regular for Government Colleges) teachers of the Colleges affiliated to the Panjab University be exempted from Entrance Test/s for admission to enrolment for Ph.D.
- (2) That one seat, over and above the prescribed limit of 8 (eight) Ph.D. student to be supervised by a faculty member, be reserved in each University teaching department /approved Research Centre for regular teachers of Colleges affiliated to Panjab University/UGC Rajiv Gandhi National Fellow for pursuing Ph.D. degree; and

- (3) That a Research Promotion Cell, to be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor, be created for the promotion of research in the Colleges affiliated to the Panjab University. The RPC shall consist of-
- (a) Dean, Colleges Development Council; Chairman
 - (b) Two Senator Professors (one from Science and one from Humanities) from the University Teaching Departments.
 - (c) Two Ph.D. Senators from Colleges affiliated to Panjab University (one Principal and one Lecturer) one from Science and one from Humanities.
- (4) That those M.Phil. Students, who were admitted after clearing the Entrance Test conducted by the relevant Departments of PU, be granted exemption from Ph.D. Entrance Examination till the Joint Entrance Test for Ph.D./M.Phil. Entrance Examination is conducted by the University, and
- (5) Joint Entrance Test for admission to M.Phil. and Ph.D. programme be worked out.

Dr. P.S. Gill stated that the recommendation (1) be corrected to the effect that the approved permanent (regular for Government Colleges) teachers of the Panjab University and Colleges affiliated to the Panjab University with two years' experience be exempted from Entrance Test/s for admission to enrolment for Ph.D.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar referred to the following decisions of the Syndicate dated 30.4.2011 (Para 12):

2. Research Scholars, who were enrolled/ submitted their Ph.D. theses prior to 11.7.2009, but have been awarded Ph.D. degree after 11.7.2009, be also **not** required to do course work.
3. Research Scholars, who are enrolled after 11.7.2009, but before June 2010, be required to undertake pre-Ph.D. course work at any time, but prior to submission of their theses.

The above decisions needed to be reconsidered as the UGC had now written that those candidates, who had not done course work, are given two years to complete the pre-Ph.D. course work.

Dr. Mukesh Arora stated that it was surprising that the candidates enrolled before 2003 are allowed to submit their theses by 31st December 2012, whereas the candidates enrolled after 2003 have

been denied this benefit. He pleaded that they should also be allowed to submit their theses by 31st December 2012.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that some students were enrolled for Ph.D. before the new U.G.C. Regulations 2009 were notified. Such candidates could not get themselves registered because in the meantime new U.G.C. Regulations were notified and according to which all the candidates were required to do Ph.D. course work. The candidates were required to get themselves registered within a period of two years. Since the candidates are College teachers, neither they were granted leave by their respective Colleges nor University arranged Ph.D. course work for them during vacations nor in the evening, the candidates could not do Ph.D. course work and get themselves registered. He pleaded that the enrolment of all such candidates should not be cancelled on the expiry of two years, rather they should be given 2 years more to get themselves registered.

Shri Ashok Goyal further stated that while awarding Ph.D. degree under new U.G.C. Regulations 2009, the University had to issue a certificate to the candidate that the degree is being awarded to him/her in terms of U.G.C. Regulations 2009 because the candidate for whatever circumstances could not clear the University Entrance Test, but had done the Ph.D. course work.

RESOLVED: That –

- (1) the approved permanent (regular for Government Colleges) teachers of the Panjab University and Colleges affiliated to the Panjab University with two years' experience be exempted from Entrance Test/s for admission to enrolment for Ph.D.
- (2) one seat, over and above the prescribed limit of 8 (eight) Ph.D. student to be supervised by a faculty member, be reserved in each University teaching department/ approved Research Centre for regular teachers of Colleges affiliated to Panjab University/UGC Rajiv Gandhi National Fellow for pursuing Ph.D. degree; and
- (3) a Research Promotion Cell, be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor, for the promotion of research in the Colleges affiliated to the Panjab University. The RPC shall consist of –
 - (a) Dean, Colleges Development Council; Chairman
 - (b) Two Senator Professor (one from Science and one from Humanities) from the University Teaching Departments.

- (c) Two Ph.D. Senators from Colleges affiliated to Panjab University (one Principal and one Lecturer) one from Science and one from Humanities.
- (4) those M.Phil. students, who were admitted after clearing the Entrance Test conducted by the relevant Departments of PU, be granted exemption from Ph.D. Entrance Examination till the Joint Entrance Test for Ph.D./M.Phil. Entrance Examination is conducted by the University, and
- (5) Joint Entrance Test for admission to M.Phil. and Ph.D. programme be worked out.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That as far as extension in two years period for registration and issuance of Certificate to the candidates, who were enrolled without qualifying the University Entrance Test for Ph.D. during the intervening period of notification of new U.G.C. Regulations 2009, but have now done Ph.D. course work, in terms of U.G.C. Regulations 2009, is concerned, the Vice-Chancellor be authorized to take decision, on behalf of the Syndicate.

Renaming of University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology as “Dr. S.S. Bhatnagar University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology”

6. Considered recommendation of the Faculty of UICET dated 23.10.2012 that the U.I.C.E.T. be renamed as “Dr. S.S. Bhatnagar University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology”.

NOTE: The Resolution approved by the Faculty of UICET enclosed (**Appendix-XX**).

The Vice-Chancellor said that there was a great legacy of Dr. Shanti Swarup Bhatnagar.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that the appreciation of the Syndicate should be conveyed to the faculty of the University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology which had sent a very good proposal for consideration by the Syndicate.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that birthday of Dr. Bhatnagar is falling on 21st February 2013. An International Conference on Polymor in Science and Technology is being organized from 21st Feb. – 23rd Feb. 2013 at the Panjab University, in which the students and the faculty would be given inspirational lectures. He extended an invitation to all the members of the Syndicate to attend the Conference.

RESOLVED: That the University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology be renamed as “**Dr. S.S. Bhatnagar University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology**”.

Writing off Staff Car No.CH01G1-6069 and purchase of two new vehicles out of Budget Head ‘Depreciation Fund’

7. Considered minutes dated 19.10.2012 (**Appendix-XXI**) of the Committee constituted by the Vice-Chancellor with regard –

- (i) to write off Staff Car No. CHO1G1-6069 (Make=Ambassador) and;

NOTE: As per P.U. Calendar Volume III, 2009 at page 450-51 the competent authority to write off losses is as under:

Shri Ashok Goyal said that the book value of the cars sought to be written off should be given while seeking approval from the competent body.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath suggested that all the ambassador cars should be disposed of and suitable fuel efficient cars, which give better mileage, should be purchased.

It was also suggested that as these new vehicles are to be used as staff cars, and a Committee be constituted to make suitable recommendations so as to which vehicle is to be purchased.

RESOLVED: That –

- (1) Staff Car No.CHO1G1-6069 (Make = Ambassador) having Engine/Chassis number, date of purchase, etc. as given below, be written off; and

**Issue regarding violation
by M.R. Government
College, Fazilka**

8. Considered the issue of repeated violation by M.R. Govt. College, Fazilka with regard to excessive admission made in B.A. 1st year during 2011-2012 and 2012-2013.

NOTE: 1. The Dean, Colleges Development Council, has observed that the matter may be considered by the Syndicate in the light of repeated violation by the College w.r.t. excessive admission over the years and the same have been reported by Principal R.S. Jhanji, in his Inquiry Committee Report which may be read as part of the proceeding qua its findings recommendations and S.O.P.s. (**Appendix-XXII**).

The Dean College Development Council, has also observed that the issue of acceptance of Return of Students admitted to B.A. I for the session 2012-2013 will be decided after the decision of the Syndicate (**Appendix-XXII**).

2. It is worthwhile to mention here that last year, i.e., 2011-2012, the number of sanctioned seats as per the Prospectus of the College was 480 seats for B.A.I, whereas the College had admitted the 850 students. A Committee was constituted to look into the matter and the report of the said Committee was submitted to the then Vice-Chancellor. The University vide office letter No.10798 dated 21.9.2012 (**Appendix-XXII**) had instructed the College not to admit the students more than the number of students mentioned in the prospectus in accordance with the number of teachers of College is having to teach them.
3. No College can enhance suo motu without the prior approval of the affiliating University the number of seats. As per procedure/norms, if any College intends to increase the number of seats, it has to apply to the University along with requisite fee before the stipulated date.

The College, in violation and in gross disregard of the office orders, had admitted 1000 students with the permission of the DPI (Colleges), Punjab (**Appendix-XXII**) which is not tenable/valid.

4. As per order of the Vice-Chancellor, College has been directed to undertake admission in the session 2012-2013 only as per the

sanctioned seats published in the prospectus of the College for the session 2011-2012 and any excess admission thereof shall invite action under Regulation 11.1 at page 160 of the P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007. Appointment of Guest Faculty, if any, in the current session shall be subject to approval from the University and shall be in proportion to specified ratio with the regular faculty as per U.G.C./University mandate, vide letter No.4976 dated 25.6.2012 (**Appendix-XXII**).

Dr. Mukesh Arora pointed out that the cases of three Colleges viz. (i) Maharaja Ranjit Singh College, Village: Malout, District Sri Muktsar Sahib; (ii) M.R. Government College, Fazilka; and (iii) Dashmesh Girls College, Badal, District Muktsar, were under consideration by the Syndicate for making excess admission than the sanctioned seats. But the case of only one College is being placed before the Syndicate.

Professor Naval Kishore stated that the case of excess admissions made by M.R. Government College, Fazilka, is very serious one. The College had increased the seats at its own. Against the sanctioned 480 seats, they had admitted 1000 students. The returns of 480 students out of 1000 students should only be accepted. They have only four regular Lecturers, no Principal and not a single teacher to teach the subject of Physical Education. The College did not reply to any of the communications sent by the University.

Dr. Mukesh Arora stated that in fact the problem was that though there was no requisite number of teachers, the D.P.I. (Colleges) and Secretary, Higher Education, Punjab had ordered the officiating Principal to make admissions beyond the sanctioned seats. Therefore, there was no fault of teachers as nobody could refuse to obey the orders of the higher authorities. There are other Colleges e.g. at Zeera, Dhudike, etc., where excess admissions have been made in spite of having inadequate number of teachers.

Principal R.S. Jhanji enquired whether they should follow the University calendar. The College should have applied to the University for increase in seats well in advance. The University is required to inspect the College for availability of teachers, infrastructure, etc. It was not the way to increase the seats which the college had adopted.

Principal Gurdip Sharma said that there are 2500 students in this College, whereas there are only four regular teachers against the required strength of 35 teachers. During inspection it was found that only 18 teachers were there. There was no teacher for teaching several subjects and the classes were not being conducted.

Shri Jarnail Singh suggested that the Vice-Chancellor should take up the matter with the Secretary, Higher Education, Punjab.

Dr. Mukesh Arora stated that in the SPN College, Mukerian, M.A. in Hindi and Punjabi were being run without any teacher. Similar position was prevailing at A.S. College, Khanna, and a College at Mohar. He further said that periodical Inspections of the Colleges had not been done since 2007. These should be resumed.

The Vice-Chancellor said that he would personally take up this issue with the Secretary, Higher Education, Punjab. The Government had to be a model employer.

Dr. P.S. Gill referred to the letter written by the D.P.I.(Colleges), Punjab that the seats have been increased to 1000, but no more post would be sanctioned. He was not in agreement with Dr. Mukesh Arora that since no action is being taken against the private Colleges, the Government Colleges should be ignored. The fake number of teachers given by the College could be verified from the Voters List of the recently held Senate Election.

The Vice-Chancellor said that if the Government had no intention to comply with the University instructions, the whole system would collapse.

Principal R.S. Jhanji said that the University authorities pressurized the Private Colleges to pay salary to the teachers according to U.G.C. norms, whereas no such condition is applicable in respect of Government Colleges.

Principal Janmit Singh said that everyone was aware of the facts. The problem was with the system and it will not improve without the interference of the Court. Till then neither the teachers would be appointed in the Government Colleges. The M.L.As from the Punjab Assembly representing in the Senate should be apprised of the problem.

Professor Naval Kishore emphasized that a signal must be sent and the return of only 480 students should be accepted and other students should be asked to appear as private candidates and their examination centre should be created at some other place.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that let they not befool themselves. In June 2012 the University had written to the College that no additional seats would be allowed than the sanctioned seats. Every year excess admission were being made by the College. The College had sent 144 applications for late admission with Vice-Chancellor's permission. The office had written that the Principal had sent a list of 144 students for late admission with the approval of Vice-Chancellor along with Rs.1800/- each and the Principal had said that the seats are lying vacant in the College and that the late admission forms are in order (Sr.Nos. 1 to 144). This may be sent to the Vice-Chancellor for approval, please. The Deputy Registrar (Colleges) wrote that admission as proposed at 'X' being in order may be approved, which should not have been done.

Professor Naval Kishore said that when the file came to him, he ordered that the total number of sanctioned seats should be mentioned.

Shri Jarnal Singh said that there being number of students of this College who have opted for Physical Education as one of the subjects having practicals, they could not appear as private candidates.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that two types of Colleges were functioning, e.g. (i) those which do not have adequate faculty; and (ii) those which have adequate faculty, but Principal is not there. The first

category of College should be given disaffiliation notice. In regard to excess admission made by the Government Colleges, the decision should be taken keeping in view that they would not succumb to any pressure.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that if any action is to be taken, only then the item should be brought on the agenda. A signal must go and they must fine the Government Colleges as well.

RESOLVED: That –

- (i) A show-cause be issued to M.R. Government College, Fazilka, under Regulation 11.1 at page 160 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007 as to why the affiliation granted to the College for B.A. Part I be **not** withdrawn; and
- (ii) The return of the students of B.A. Part I of M.R. Government College, Fazilka, be **not** accepted.

Dr. Mukesh Arora dissented with the remarks that the same show-cause notice be issued to the similarly placed Colleges.

Enhancement in the amount of P.U. Staff (Non-teaching) Association Welfare Scheme

9. Considered if the proposal of the Panjab University Staff (Non-teaching) Association (PUSA) dated 12.10.2012 (**Appendix-XXIII**) that amount of **Panjab University Staff (Non-teaching) Association Welfare Scheme** from Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- be enhanced.

RESOLVED: That the amount, a person joining the **Panjab University Staff (Non-teaching) Association Welfare Scheme** is liable to pay, be enhanced from Rs.50/- to Rs.100/- per death of any member of the Scheme.

Arising out of this, Shri Ashok Goyal said that the demands made by the PUSA should be taken seriously. The non-teaching staff is an integral part of the administration. Even if the demands are unreasonable and could not be accepted, the reply can be given in a best possible manner. But not to reply and acknowledge their demands amounts to insensitiveness on the part of the authority. The impression should not go that the Syndicate was for the teachers only and students and non-teaching staff was the most ignored lot. Therefore, they need to introspect to give serious thought to their problems.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Joint Consultative Machinery was there to listen to the demands of non-teaching staff. He said that the JCM must meet frequently as per the need to discuss their demands.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that a message should go that they are really concerned about their demands.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath proposed that those daily-wage workers who are working against the sanctioned posts should be given basic pay plus D.A. Moreover, the services of persons, who are working on daily wage basis for the last 10 years (taking into

consideration 240 days a year as had been done by the Punjab Government) should be regularized on the basis of Supreme Court Judgement in the case of Uma Devi, etc.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the proposal put forth by Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath could be examined.

**Recommendations of
Academic Council dated
20.06.2012**

10. Considered the following recommendations of the Academic Council Meeting dated 20.6.2012:

ITEM II

That –

1. all the disciplines should introduce two papers from allied disciplines of their choice at Postgraduate level. Introduction of inter-disciplinary courses at Undergraduate level may be postponed for the time being;
2. the practice of three year time duration may be continued. It was decided that in the second year a workshop be conducted by inviting stakeholders such as teachers, select students on the basis of merit and potential employers. The Department may approach the office of Dean, College Development Council or Indian Council of Social Science and Research for funds. The responsibility to convene the workshop after two years would be of Convener, Board of Studies. The Reminder to organize the workshop will be sent by the office of Deputy Registrar (General);
3. the assignment should be field based or having 20-30% empirical base;
4. case-method approach be introduced in all the papers; and
5. communication skill be made integral part of the course. Each discipline should have two credit papers on communication skills. **This paper should comprise of two units. First unit should be devoted to writing skills, soft skills and other professional skills. The thrust of second unit should be to prepare the students for developing and sharpening discipline specific communication. The paper shall be optional.**

ITEM III

That B.A. (Honours) in Police Administration be introduced from the academic session 2012-13.

ITEM IV

That the Regulations/Rules for Postgraduate Diploma in Library Automation & Networking (Semester System) through University School of Open Learning to be effective from the academic session 2012-13, **as per Appendix-XXIV**, be approved.

ITEM VI

That the Regulations/Rules for Postgraduate Diploma in Health, Family Welfare & Population Education (Semester System) to be effective from the academic session 2012-13, **as per Appendix-XXIV**, be approved.

ITEM VIII

That the Regulations/Rules for Postgraduate Diploma in Human Rights & Duties (Semester System) through University School of Open Learning to be effective from the academic session 2012-13, **as per Appendix-XXIV**, be approved.

ITEM IX

That the nomenclature of **‘Post-Graduate Diploma in International Business’** at Kamla Lohtia S.D. College, Ludhiana be changed to **‘Post-Graduate Diploma in International Business (Innovative Programme)’** w.e.f. the session 2012-13.

ITEM XIII

That the students admitted in M.Com. (Semester System) in affiliated Colleges and University School of Open Learning (USOL) be allowed to migrate from Colleges to USOL and vice-versa w.e.f. the session 2012-13 as the syllabus for M.Com. (Semester System) in Colleges and USOL is the same.

That keeping in view the decision of the N.C.T.E., from the session 2012-13 the nomenclature of '**C.P.Ed. (Two-Year Course)**' be changed to '**D.P.Ed. (Two-Year Course)**' and the outlines of tests, syllabi and courses of reading for D.P.Ed. (Two-Year Course) be the same as for C.P.Ed. (Two-Year Course).

- (i) the Rules/Regulations, outlines of tests, syllabi and courses of reading for B.Ed. Special Education (Mental Retardation) (Semester System) for the examinations of 2012-13, **as per Appendix-XXIV**, be approved.

2. the Rules/Regulations for Post-Graduate Diploma in Mass Communication (Semester System) w.e.f. the session 2012-13, **as per Appendix-XXIV**, be approved.
3. xxxxxxx xxx xxx
4. the medium of examination for Post-Graduate Diploma in Advertising & Public Relations be **English/Punjabi/ Hindi** from the session 2012-13 and this be incorporated in the question paper under instructions to the candidates.

Referring to Sub-Item II, Shri Ashok Goyal said that this item was beyond his understanding as it had been written that the Department may approach the office of Dean, Colleges Development Council or Indian Council of Social Science & Research for Funds. He did not know as to what types funds are to be given to the Departments by the Dean, College Development Council.

It was clarified that the University Teaching Departments were supposed to approach the Indian Council of Social Science & Research for Funds, whereas the affiliated Colleges to Dean, College Development Council.

Shri Ashok Goyal observed that then the language needed to be properly worded.

Principal R.S. Jhanji suggested that since the item is not properly worded, it should be referred back.

After some discussion, it was –

RESOLVED: That the above recommendations of the Academic Council dated 20.06.2012, be approved except that recommendation contained in Item II on the agenda be referred back to the Faculty of Arts/Academic Council for reconsideration in the light of above observations made by the members.

Issue regarding grant of sanction for prosecution of Professor Om Prakash Katare, UIPS

11. Considered if sanction for prosecution against Professor Om Prakash Katare, University Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences, be granted on the basis of report submitted by the CBI, ACB, Jaipur in case related to Rajdhani Institute of Technology and Management, Village Renwal, Tehsil Phagi, District Jaipur (Rajasthan) run by Rajdhani Educational & Welfare Society, Rajasthan..

NOTE: As per the provisions contained in the Panjab University Calendar, Vol. III, 2009, at page 73 the appointing authority of Class 'A' Officer is the Senate. Therefore, the prosecution sanction of a Class 'A' Officer has to be given by the Senate.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath pointed out that while forwarding the case of Raajdhani Institute of Technology & Management, Jaipur, Rajasthan, Professor O.P. Katare had given a note that "Based on the photocopy of the documents submitted by the applicant, the proposal is considered for processing it further. Therefore, it is being forwarded to AICTE, New Delhi, for necessary action, however, the validity of the land documents and other documents submitted by the applicant can be confirmed on verification of original documents at the time of hearing Committee meeting at AICTE, HQ, New Delhi". He enquired as to what criminal act could be attributed to Professor O.P. Katare?

Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that, in addition to what Shri Chatrath had pointed out, another Committee comprising members from reputed institutions of the country was also there to consider this case. The AICTE has also released their own people and sent the papers back. He, therefore, suggested that the request of the CBI for prosecution of Professor O.P. Katare should be rejected straightway.

Dr. P.S. Gill said that, in fact, the teachers of the University as well as affiliated Colleges represented the University while doing such duties. In case sanction for prosecution was granted, it would be undue harassment to Professor Katare and, in future, nobody would like to go on such assignments.

Dr. Mukesh Arora said that the request of the CBI for prosecution of Professor Katare should be recommended to the Senate for rejection; otherwise, nobody would go for such assignments in future. In case the Syndicate decided to recommend grant of sanction for prosecution of Professor Katare, his (Dr. Mukesh Arora) name from the Committee constituted for Baba Kundan Rural College of Education, Ludhiana, should be deleted.

Principal Gurdip Sharma suggested that it should be recommended to the Senate that sanction for prosecution of Professor O.P. Katare by the CBI be not granted.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that if they read carefully, the CBI had not put anything against Professor Katare. They had only said that it was binding upon the Regional Office that they should have forwarded the copy of the proposal to the AICTE complete in all respect, but in the instant case the proposal was incomplete. Moreover, probably Professor O.P. Katare had gone for such an assignment for the first time, that too, when he was requested. The allegation that he is beneficiary did not find favour because he had just got T.A./D.A. and honorarium only for the job assigned to him. The CBI also did not seem to have any intention to punish him. Probably, a case had been made because there is provision for prosecution of Government servant for which they had to seek sanction from the employer. The provision was only to protect the Government servant from undue harassment while discharging his duties because of some action, which he had done faithfully. Professor Katare had not done anything for which sanction for his prosecution could be given. He, therefore, suggested that it should be recommended to the Senate that sanction for prosecution of Professor O.P. Katare by the CBI be not granted.

RESOLVED: To recommend unanimously that since no case is made for prosecution of Professor O.P. Katare, sanction for his prosecution sought by the CBI be **not** granted.

At this stage, the Syndicate observed that such sensitive matters should not be left at the discretion of the office staff; rather these should be dealt with on priority at the highest level of Registrar/Vice-Chancellor, so that the persons could be saved from mental harassment.

Recommendations of Committee dated 5.10.2012 regarding extension in re-employment of Professor M.K. Teja (Retd.), Department of Sociology

12. Considered following recommendations of the Committee dated 5.10.2012 (**Appendix-XXV**), constituted by the Vice-Chancellor, that Professor (Ms.) M.K. Teja (Retd.), Department of Sociology be granted extension in re-employment for a period of one year or up to the age of 63 years, whichever is earlier, w.e.f. the date she joins the department with the following conditions for which she will have to give an undertaking to the Chairperson of the department, who will ensure their compliance:

- (i) Teaching work allotted to her by the Chairperson/s from time to time shall be diligently undertaken as per the University/UGC regulations.
- (ii) As per the decision of the Syndicate/Senate, she will not be assigned any administrative work.
- (iii) Any communication to be addressed by her to the important dignitaries/men in position within the University and outside shall be regulated through the Chairperson in consonance with the University rules clause VI of the University Calendar Volume III, 2009 at page 68.

- (iv) Any refusal to undertake the assigned teaching workload or any breach of the above mandate as also governing the conduct of teacher laid in the University Calendar shall invite disciplinary action, which includes immediate termination of re-employment.
- (v) If she has opted for pension she should immediately undertake the process of getting NOC from the concerned departments and branches.

NOTE: 1. Minutes of the Committee dated 9.8.2012 (**Appendix-XXV**) constituted by the Vice-Chancellor is enclosed.

2. Joint meetings of the Academic and Administrative Committees dated 2.4.2012 is enclosed (**Appendix-XXV**).

3. The Syndicate meeting dated 29.2.2012 on the recommendation of the Committee dated 22.2.2012 has decided as under:

“that this re-employment should be ordered by the competent authority for three years in one go and that after every year the academically active status report only should be submitted by the concerned faculty member through the HOD with the advance copy to the DUI. The Vice-Chancellor should be the competent authority to accept this report and allow continuance of the said teacher as re-employed faculty. However, the usual one-day break will be there at the completion of every year during the period of re-employment. All other rules as mentioned at page 130 of Panjab University Cal. Vol. III, 2009 will be applicable.”

4. Rule 8 at page 130 of P.U. Calendar, Vol. III, 2009, reads as under:

“A teacher will be re-employed (if he wishes to be) provided he is academically active. His/ her academic activity will be assessed on the basis of the total information relating to him/her as available in the University Annual Reports. In

case any teacher wishes to submit any supplementary data, he may be free to do so. Or, if the Vice-Chancellor needs any additional information before making his recommendation, he may invite the teacher concerned for the purpose, or for elaboration/clarification of any points he deems necessary.”

5. A detailed office note enclosed **(Appendix-XXV)**.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar enquired whether re-employment could be given to a person whose case had been rejected by the Departmental Committee thrice and the Dean of University Instruction also.

Shri Ashok Goyal enquired whether there would be no problem in the Department after re-employing her.

RESOLVED: That Professor (Ms.) M.K. Teja (Retd.), Department of Sociology be granted extension in re-employment for a period of one year or up to the age of 63 years, whichever is earlier, w.e.f. the date she joins the department with the following conditions for which she will have to give an undertaking to the Chairperson of the department, who will ensure their compliance:

- (i) Teaching work allotted to her by the Chairperson/s from time to time shall be diligently undertaken as per the University/ UGC regulations.
- (ii) As per the decision of the Syndicate/Senate, she will not be assigned any administrative work.
- (iii) Any communication to be addressed by her to the important dignitaries/men in position within the University and outside shall be regulated through the Chairperson in consonance with the University rules clause VI of the University Calendar Volume III, 2009 at page 68.
- (iv) Any refusal to undertake the assigned teaching workload or any breach of the above mandate as also governing the conduct of teacher laid in the University Calendar shall invite disciplinary action, which includes immediate termination of re-employment.
- (v) If she has opted for pension she should immediately undertake the process of getting NOC from the concerned departments and branches.

Recommendations of the Committee dated 30.10.2012 regarding benefit of fixation of pay Shri Gurpreet Singh

13. Considered if –

- (i) the recommendations of the Committee dated 30.10.2012 (**Appendix-XXVI**) that the benefit of fixation of pay in the pay band of Rs.37400-67000+GP Rs.9000 be allowed to Shri Gurpreet Singh, Electronic Engineer, Department of Geology.
- (ii) budgetary provision for grant of pay-scale/pay band of Rs.37400-67000+GP Rs.9000 from the existing pay-scale of Rs.15600-39100+GP 7600/- for the post of Electronic Engineer in the Department of Geology, to the incumbent (Shri Gurpreet Singh) be allowed to be made in the Budget Estimate.

Information contained in the office note (**Appendix-XXVI**) was also taken into consideration.

- NOTE:**
1. Shri Gurpreet Singh was appointed as Electronic Engineer w.e.f. 26.4.1991 in the Reader's pay scale. His pay-scale was revised as per UGC pay-scales in the scale of Rs.12000-420-18300 w.e.f. 1.10.1996 and in the scale of Rs.15600-39100+GP 8000 w.e.f. 1.1.2006.
 2. The benefit of fixation of pay in the pay band of Rs.37400-67000+GP Rs.9000 after completion of 3 years of service be allowed to Shri Gurpreet Singh w.e.f. 1.1.2006.

Dr. P.S. Gill pointed out that there were 2-3 more similar cases, which should also be taken up immediately.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath suggested that similar cases should be dealt with accordingly.

RESOLVED: That –

- (1) the benefit of fixation of pay in the pay band of Rs.37400-67000+GP Rs.9000 be allowed to Shri Gurpreet Singh, Electronic Engineer, Department of Geology; and
- (2) budgetary provision for grant of pay-scale/pay band of Rs.37400-67000+GP Rs.9000 from the existing pay-scale of Rs.15600-39100+GP 7600/- for the post of Electronic Engineer in the Department of Geology, to the incumbent (Shri Gurpreet Singh) be allowed to be made in the Budget Estimates.

Withdrawn Item

14. Considered if the resignation of Dr. Puneet Kapoor, Senior Lecturer in Anaesthesia, Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital, P.U. be accepted w.e.f. 17.1.2013, under Regulation 6 at page 118 of P.U. Calendar, Vol.-I, 2007. Information contained in the office note was also taken into consideration.

NOTE: Regulation 6 at page 118 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007 reads as under:

“A permanent employee, recruited on or after January 1, 1968, shall give at least three months, notice before resigning his post, failing which he shall forfeit salary for the same period.

Provided that Syndicate may waive this requirement in part or whole for valid reasons.....”.

The Vice-Chancellor informed that since Dr. Puneet Kapoor, Senior Lecturer in Anaesthesia, Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital, has withdrawn her resignation, the item should be treated as withdrawn.

This was agreed to.

Fixation of dates for the meetings of Faculties to be held in March 2013

15. Item 15 on the agenda was read out, viz. –

To fix the dates for the meetings of the Faculties to be held in March 2013 for the purpose of electing various Boards of Studies (i.e. Undergraduate and Postgraduate Boards of Studies) for the term 1.4.2013 to 31.3.2015 as provided under Regulation 2.8 at page 55 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007.

NOTE: Regulation 2.8 *ibid* reads as under:

“The election of teachers from the affiliated colleges of Under-graduate and Post-graduate Boards of Studies by the Faculties concerned shall be held by March 31 every alternate year by Single Transferable Vote System.

The Syndicate shall fix a date or dates on which meetings of the various Faculties shall be held for the purpose of electing Board of Studies.

xxx xxx xxx”.

Dr. Mukesh Arora pointed out that, earlier, certain subjects, e.g. Music, Home Science, etc. were either not taught in the affiliated Colleges or were taught in a few Colleges only. That was why the members were nominated on such Board of Studies. Now, since such subjects are taught in many Colleges and teachers were also there in numbers, he proposed that election to Board of Studies in such subjects should also be conducted.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that as far as proposal made by Dr. Mukesh Arora is concerned, it is a long process as it needed amendment in the Regulations. He suggested that a Committee should be constituted to look into this issue.

RESOLVED: That the Vice-Chancellor be authorized to fix the dates for the meetings of the Faculties to be held in March 2013 for the purpose of electing various Boards of Studies (i.e. Undergraduate and Postgraduate Boards of Studies) for the term 1.4.2013 to 31.3.2015 as provided under Regulation 2.8 at page 55 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007, on behalf of the Syndicate.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That a Committee be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to examine the proposal made by Dr. Mukesh Arora.

Installation of 50 KW Solar Power Generation System at the Department of Botany

16. Considered the proposal of Dean Research for installation of 50 KW Solar Power Generation System at the Department of Botany and sanction Rs. 31.50 lac out of the Budget-Head 'Development Fund' of the University.

NOTE: Since, the expenditure involved is for installation of Solar Power Generation System, hence it is covered under Sr. No. 9 of the guideline i.e. providing and construction of power sub-station or otherwise it can also be covered under the decision of the Syndicate dated 22.11.2003 (Para 15).

Dr. P.S. Gill suggested that they should approach those Departments which are engaged in Solar Generation System.

Shri Ashok Goyal pointed out that Development Fund could not be used for such activities. Moreover, the Syndicate decision dated 30.10.2003 which had been annexed with the item was also for that particular case only and not that the Vice-Chancellor had been authorized for future as well.

It was clarified that there was a provision for installation of Solar Power Generation System under the PURSE grant received by the University, but since they fell short of certain amount, a sum of Rs.31.50 lac is being sought from the 'Development Fund' of the University.

Dr. P.S. Gill said that earlier solar lights were installed in the Campus, but they did not know as to what had happened to those lights. Moreover, no person from Engineering and Energy Departments had been associated with this work.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that, basically, provision for this fund had been made for taking care of buildings, residences, maintenance, etc. and the Vice-Chancellor was authorized to meet the emergent situations and not that the Vice-Chancellor was authorized to create infrastructure.

RESOLVED: That the item be reviewed in the light of discussion took place in the meeting of the Syndicate.

Recommendations of Executive Committee of Sports Department dated 27.4.2012

17. Considered the following recommendations dated 27.4.2012 (**Appendix-XXVII**) of the Executive Committee of Panjab University Sports Committee (PUSC) duly approved by the Vice-Chancellor and also be allowed to be incorporated in the official Handbook of PUSC:

The Committee has approved that one separate category for "Competitors from other Institutions" should be created and the membership fee to be charged should be twice as the fee charged from the University Students.

Item 19 (from Current Agenda)

The Committee has approved to include Dean Student Welfare as member of Panjab University Sports Committee.

Item 21

The Executive Committee recommended and approved that Identity Card and Registration fee for using the facilities of Tennis/Swimming/Gym/Badminton should be compulsory for all.

Item 22

The Committee approved publication of changed designation in PUSC Rule Book and University Calendar i.e. Director Sports and Dy. Directress Sports to University Director of Physical Education and Deputy Director Physical Education as per UGC guidelines.

Item 27

The following eligibility rules were recommended and approved for coach/referee/umpire/official for various university games and tournaments:

A person should be:

- (i) DPE/Physical Education teacher/Assistant Professor/Associate Professor/ Professor having specialization or participation at University/ National or International level in the concerned game.

Or

- (ii) A qualified coach/referee/umpire having qualified the concerned test/course.

Subject to the following conditions:

- (i) The coach/referee/umpire/official should be the employee of Government, Semi-Government or other Institution/ Agency and;
- (ii) The coaches giving coaching or training to any college affiliated to Panjab University in the concerned game during the current session will not be eligible for appointment.

To amend the rule to constitute the Selection Committees:

Qualifications for the post of Assistant Professor in Disability Studies

20. Considered the recommendations of the Expert Committee dated 19.7.2012 (**Appendix-XXX**) constituted by the Vice-Chancellor under the Chairmanship of the Dean Faculty of Education, for examining minimum qualification for appointment of Assistant Professor in Disability Studies in the Department of Community Education and Disability Studies:

Essential

Masters degree in any subject area with not less than 55% of marks (50% for SC/ST/Physically & Visually Handicapped).

And

M.Ed. degree in the Learning Disability area with not less than 55% of marks (50% for SC/ST/Physically & Visually Handicapped) or an equivalent grade of B in 7 point scale or an equivalent degree from a foreign University recognized by RCI. In case of non-availability of a candidate with M.Ed. (Special Education) in particular disability specialization for faculty position at B.Ed. (Special Education) level, M.Ed. (Special Education) in some other disability specialization. M.Ed. (General) preferably with dissertation/research work in Special Education with B.Ed. (Special Education) in respective disability area may be considered on temporary basis.

Besides fulfilling the above qualifications, the candidate should have **either** cleared the National Eligibility Test (NET) conducted by the UGC, CSIR or should have obtained Ph.D. Degree in the relevant subject.

Information contained in the office note (**Appendix-XXX**) was also taken into consideration.

RESOLVED: That the following qualifications be prescribed for the post of Assistant Professor in Disability Studies in the Department of Community Education and Disability Studies:

Essential

Masters degree in any subject area with not less than 55% of marks (50% for SC/ST/Physically & Visually Handicapped).

And

M.Ed. degree in the Learning Disability area with not less than 55% of marks (50% for SC/ST/Physically & Visually Handicapped) or an equivalent grade of B in 7 point scale or an

equivalent degree from a foreign University recognized by RCI. In case of non-availability of a candidate with M.Ed. (Special Education) in particular disability specialization for faculty position at B.Ed. (Special Education) level, M.Ed. (Special Education) in some other disability specialization. M.Ed. (General) preferably with dissertation/research work in Special Education with B.Ed. (Special Education) in respective disability area may be considered on temporary basis.

Besides fulfilling the above qualifications, the candidate should have **either** cleared the National Eligibility Test (NET) conducted by the UGC, CSIR or should have obtained Ph.D. Degree in the relevant subject.

**Reinstatement of Shri

21. Considered if –

- (i) Shri Suraj Parkash Joshi, Senior Assistant be reinstated without any condition w.e.f. 29.10.2010 i.e the date of decision of the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, as he has been acquitted by the Hon'ble High Court vide Criminal Revision No.1518 of 2005 (**Appendix-XXXI**);
- (ii) the period spent under suspension of Shri Suraj Parkash Joshi, Senior Assistant w.e.f. 5.11.2001 to 21.7.2009 (AN) (as he was reinstated provisionally w.e.f. 22.7.2009, strictly without prejudice and subject to decision of Court cases pending against him) be treated on duty and his consequential service/financial benefits/promotion etc. during his suspension period also be sanctioned/released, as per Rule 2.1 at page 112 of P.U. Cal. Vol. III, 2009.

Information contained in the office note (**Appendix-XXXI**) was also taken into consideration.

NOTE: 1. Rule 2.1 at page 112 of P.U. Calendar, Volume III, 2009 is as under:

“2.1 An officer against whom proceedings have been taken for arrest in execution of a money decree or on a criminal charge or who is detained under any law shall be considered under suspension and allowed subsistence allowance only. If he is subsequently acquitted of the blame, full amount due may be allowed in respect of the period of suspension otherwise as the circumstances may warrant.”

2. As per decision of the Syndicate dated 31.5.2009 (Para 20), the Vice-Chancellor had provisionally reinstated him along with other three persons who were involved in other

separate cases, strictly without prejudice and subject to decision of Court cases pending against them. They would not be posted against any post, which involve financial or public dealing. They will not be considered for any promotion till their cases are finalized. Their reinstatement will neither have any bearing on the charges/allegations being faced by them nor their reinstatement will entitle them to claim any financial benefit for the period they have remained under suspension.

3. Law officer of the Panjab University has observed as under:

“Shri Suraj Prakash Joshi acquitted by the Hon’ble High Court vide order dated 29.10.2010 passed on Criminal Revision No. 1518 of 2005. Suraj Parkash Vs Union Territory, Chandigarh. Therefore, he is entitled to get all the benefits due to him as per Rule 2.1 at page 112 of P.U. Cal. Vol. III, 2009.”

RESOLVED: That –

- (i) Shri Suraj Parkash Joshi, Senior Assistant be reinstated without any condition w.e.f. 29.10.2010 i.e the date of decision of the Hon’ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, as he has been acquitted by the Hon’ble High Court vide Criminal Revision No.1518 of 2005 (**Appendix-XXXI**);
- (ii) the period spent under suspension of Shri Suraj Parkash Joshi, Senior Assistant w.e.f. 5.11.2001 to 21.7.2009 (AN) (as he was reinstated provisionally w.e.f. 22.7.2009, strictly without prejudice and subject to decision of Court cases pending against him) be treated on duty and his consequential service/financial benefits/promotion etc. during his suspension period also be sanctioned/released, as per Rule 2.1 at page 112 of P.U. Cal. Vol. III, 2009.

Deferred item

22. Considered the recommendations of the Committee dated 13.2.2012 constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to examine the representation of Dr. B.B. Goyal of University Business School requesting necessary amendment in the orders of P.U. Senate dated 11.6.2012 (Para LII). Information contained in the office note was also taken into consideration.

NOTE: 1. The Senate meeting dated 11.6.2009 (Para LII) had resolved that the decision of the Senate dated 28.3.2009 (Para XXXIII) be modified to reads as under:

“That though promotion orders of Dr. B.B. Goyal as Reader be not withdrawn as a measure of concession as he was promoted as Reader by the Syndicate decision dated 15.5.2004 w.e.f. 31.12.2001. He will continue to draw salary of Rs.12840/- w.e.f. 31.12.2001, i.e. the date of his promotion. The punishment of stoppage of increments with cumulative effective will stand till the said decision of the Syndicate. However, debarring him from undertaking any remunerative work in Panjab University should stand. He will start earning his normal annual increment only after the decision of the Syndicate dated 15.5.2004 whenever it becomes due.”

2. The Syndicate meeting dated 24.3.2012 **vide Para 23 had deferred** the consideration of the item.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that all the relevant decisions of the Senate taken since 2000 should be appropriately enumerated together for a careful comprehension of the issues related to this item.

RESOLVED: That the consideration of the Item 22 on the agenda be deferred.

Recommendations of the Committee dated 8.10.2012 regarding constitution of Research Promotion Committee of the Department of Evening Studies

23. Considered recommendations of the Committee dated 8.10.2012 (**Appendix-XXXII**), constituted by the Vice-Chancellor, that a Research Promotion Committee of five disciplines (English, Hindi, Economics, Punjabi and Political Science) of the Department of Evening Studies be constituted. The tenure of the Committee would be two years. The Committee shall consist of the following:

1. 5 persons of the disciplines (Professors/Associate Professors/Assistant Professors, by rotation) from the DES.
2. 2 Professors/Associate Professors, by rotation from the parent Department of the 5(five) discipline.

The functions of the Research Promotion Committee shall be to interview the candidates, allot the Supervisor/ Joint Supervisor(s), scrutinize the synopsis, topic and plan of research for the purpose of registration and recommend the same to the Research Degree Committee.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that earlier the Department of Evening Studies was used to be Evening College and the University School of Open Learning was Directorate of Correspondence Studies. Now both these institutes have become independent Departments but the students of these departments had to appear before the Research Degree Committees of the main

Departments, which did not recommend enrolment/registration of Ph.D. students of these two departments. He, therefore, pleaded that these departments should be treated as Multi-Disciplinary Departments and independent RDCs should be constituted for them.

It was also advocated that such a step of constituting the independent RDCs would help in getting more grants from the funding agencies as credit would go to the teachers of these departments as they would be allowed to guide more research scholars for Ph.D. degree.

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that there cannot be two RDCs in a subject. Moreover, the teachers of these departments have been put on the RDCs, by rotation. Their representation could be increased. He, therefore, proposed that the recommendations of the Committee should be approved.

RESOLVED: That –

- (1) a Research Promotion Committee of five disciplines (English, Hindi, Economics, Punjabi and Political Science) of the Department of Evening Studies be constituted. The tenure of the Committee would be two years. The Committee shall consist of the following:
 - (i) 5 persons of the disciplines (Professors/ Associate Professors/ Assistant Professors, by rotation) from the DES.
 - (ii) 2 Professors/Associate Professors, by rotation from the parent Department of the 5(five) discipline.

The function of the Research Promotion Committee shall be to interview the candidates, allot the Supervisor/ Joint Supervisor(s), scrutinize the synopsis, topic and plan of research for the purpose of registration and recommend the same to the Research Degree Committee.

- (2) the nomenclature of the Department shall be Department of Evening Studies – Multi-disciplinary Research Centre; and
- (3) the Conveners of the Research Degree Committee (in the subjects of English, Hindi, Economics, Punjabi and Political Science) would be on rotational basis, i.e. Department/Department of Evening Studies – Multi-disciplinary Research Centre/University School of Open Learning on rotation basis.

Grant of re-employment to certain University teachers

24. Considered if the re-employment be given to the following persons on contract basis with one day's break up to attaining the age of 63 years as mentioned against each, as per rules/regulation of P.U.

and Syndicate decision 28.6.2008 and 29.2.2012 on fixed emoluments equivalent to last pay drawn minus pension to be worked out on the full service of 33 years both in case of teachers opting for pension or CPF. Salary for this purpose means pay plus allowances excluding House Rent Allowance as per Rule 8 at page 130 of P.U. Calendar, Volume III, 2009:

NOTE: 1. The Syndicate meeting dated 29.2.2012 on the recommendation of the Committee dated 22.2.2012 has decided as under:

“that this re-employment should be ordered by the competent authority for three years in one go and that after every year the academically active status report only should be submitted by the concerned faculty member through the HOD with the advance copy to the DUI. The Vice-Chancellor should be the competent authority to accept this report and allow continuance of the said teacher as re-employed faculty. However, the usual one-day break will be there at the completion of every year during the period of re-employment. All other rules as mentioned at page 130 of Panjab University Cal. Vol. III will be applicable.”

2. Rule 8 at page 130 of P.U. Calendar, Volume III, 2009 reads as under:

“A teacher will be re-employed (if he wishes to be) provided he is academically active. His/her academic activity will be assessed on the basis of the total information relating to him/her as available in the University Annual Reports. In case any teacher wishes to submit any supplementary data, he may be free to do so. Or, if the Vice-Chancellor needs any additional information before making his recommendation, he may invite the teacher concerned for the purpose, or for elaboration/ clarification of any points he deems necessary.

If a teacher wishes that the extent of academic activity, be determined by the Academic Committee of his/her department, he/she may be allowed to do so”.

3. The Syndicate meeting dated 28.6.2008 (Para 58) reads as under:

“the teachers superannuated at the age of 60 years shall be re-employed as per already existing rules/regulations with the modification that they will be re-employed after one day’s break for a **maximum period of 3 years on contract basis**, on year to year basis, on fixed emoluments equivalent to last pay drawn minus pension to be worked out on the full service of 33 years both in case of teachers opting for pension or CPF. Salary for this purpose means pay plus allowances excluding House Rent Allowance.”

On the issue raised by Shri Ashok Goyal that the possibility be explored to increase the age of retirement of non-teaching staff from 60 years to 61 years on the basis of Punjab Government decision, Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath apprehended that such a move might attract for decrease in age of retirement from 60 years to 58 years.

RESOLVED: That re-employment be given to the following persons on contract basis with one day’s break up to attaining the age of 63 years as mentioned against each, as per rules/regulation of P.U. and Syndicate decision 28.6.2008 and 29.2.2012 on fixed emoluments equivalent to last pay drawn minus pension to be worked out on the full service of 33 years both in case of teachers opting for pension or CPF. Salary for this purpose means pay plus allowances excluding House Rent Allowance as per Rule 8 at page 130 of P.U. Calendar, Volume III, 2009:

Issue regarding conferment of (*honoris causa*) degree on certain persons

28. Considered the recommendations of Committee dated 4.10.2012 (**Appendix-XXXIII**) constituted by the Vice-Chancellor, that the title of D.Sc./D.Lit. (*honoris causa*) degrees be conferred upon the following persons for their outstanding academic achievements and other professional/public accomplishment in the next Convocation to be held in 2013:

D.Lit. Degree

1. Professor Anish Kapoor
2. Professor Romila Thapar

D.Sc. Degree

1. Professor Ashoke Sen, F.R.S.
2. Professor M.S. Raghunathan, F.R.S.

NOTE: Panjab University Act under Section 23 at page 9 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007 reads as under:

“23. Honorary Degrees: Where the Vice-Chancellor and not less than two-thirds of the other members of the Syndicate recommend that an honorary degree be conferred on any person on the ground that he is, in their opinion, by reason of eminent position and attainment, a fit and proper person to receive such a degree and where their recommendation is supported by not less than two-thirds of the Fellows present at a meeting of the Senate and is confirmed by the Chancellor, the Senate may confer on such person the honorary degree so recommended without requiring him to undergo any examination.”

Shri Ashok Goyal and Shri Gopal Krishan Chagtrath were of the view that more and more persons who were the alumni of the Panjab University and belonged to the northern region of the country and had contributed a lot at the global level should be found out for conferring the honorary degrees of the Panjab University.

Principal Gurdip Sharma said that they should not limit their proposal only to the Persons who are connected with the Panjab

University or the northern region. They must honour a person keeping in view one's stature and merit.

RESOLVED: That, in accordance with Section 23 at page 9 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007, it be recommended to the Senate and the Chancellor that –

- (1) honorary degree of Doctor of Literature (*honoris causa*) be conferred on Professor Anish Kapoor, on the ground that he, in the opinion of the Syndicate, by reasons of his outstanding academic achievements and other professional/public accomplishment, is a fit and proper person to receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Literature (*honoris causa*);

(Bio-data enclosed)

- (2) honorary degree of Doctor of Literature (*honoris causa*) be conferred on Professor Romila Thapar, on the ground that she, in the opinion of the Syndicate, by reasons of her outstanding academic achievements and other professional/public accomplishment, is a fit and proper person to receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Literature (*honoris causa*);

(Bio-data enclosed)

- (3) honorary degree of Doctor of Science (*honoris causa*) be conferred on Professor Ashoke Sen, F.R.S., on the ground that he, in the opinion of the Syndicate, by reasons of his outstanding academic achievements and other professional/public accomplishment, is a fit and proper person to receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Literature (*honoris causa*);

(Bio-data enclosed)

- (4) honorary degree of Doctor of Science (*honoris causa*) be conferred on Professor M.S. Raghunathan, F.R.S., on the ground that he, in the opinion of the Syndicate, by reasons of his outstanding academic achievements and other professional/public accomplishment, is a fit and proper person to receive the honorary degree of Doctor of Literature (*honoris causa*);

(Bio-data enclosed)

Deferred Item

29. Considered minutes of the Academic and Administrative Committee dated 21.9.2012 of Visveshvaranand Vishvabandhu Institute of Sanskrit & Indological studies, Hoshiarpur to start the M.Phil. (Sanskrit) course w.e.f. the session 2013-2014.

NOTE: Since there is no financial implication on the University and infrastructure is available in the Department, the proposal be approved. The proposed intake per year shall be of 10 seats (reservation as per University rules). The

syllabus has already been approved by the Joint Research Board (JRB).

Principal Gurdip Sharma and Principal Janmit Singh said that before allowing starting of M.Phil. course at VVBIS & IS, Hoshiarpur, the infrastructure should be examined, otherwise it would only add another unemployed class as the neither the building nor the class rooms are in proper shape there. Further, the M.Phil. course had become obsolete.

Dr. Mukesh Arora said that keeping in view the fact that the existing faculty had less workload, M.Phil. course should be allowed to be started at VVBIS&IS, Hoshiarpur. Moreover, M.Phil. in Sanskrit is running at the Panjab University Campus successfully.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that according to U.G.C. new Regulations 2009, admission procedure for both M.Phil. and Ph.D. is the same due to which the students prefer to do M.Phil. than Ph.D.

RESOLVED: That the consideration of Item 29 on the agenda be deferred. In the meanwhile, the proposal to start M.Phil. (Sanskrit) at VVBIS&IS, Hoshiarpur be examined by a Committee to be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor.

Amendment of Regulations for BAMS

30. Considered the amendment in Regulations (**Appendix-XXXIV**) for BAMS prescribed by the Central Council of Indian Medicine, New Delhi duly approved by the Dean, Faculty of Medical Sciences as per authorization given by the Faculty of Medical Sciences at its meeting held on 29.3.2012 (Para 8) for the Session 2012-13.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that Shri Dhanwantri Ayurvedic College & Hospital, Sector 46, Chandigarh had been making admissions as per High Court judgements. The College had for the first time applied for provisional affiliation in the year 1992. Thereafter, it never applied for extension of affiliation. Though the Inspection Committees visited the Colleges several times, the College did not cooperate with the Committees.

On a point of order, Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the judgement had been stayed by the Division Bench and the College had been allowed to make admissions in violation of the order of the Supreme Court wherein they had fixed the last date for admission as 30th September. But the College continued to make admissions up to December that too without the Entrance Test by the students and nobody in the University knew that the College is making admissions. In case the admissions made by them are in terms of court judgement, only then theses should be accepted, otherwise not.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath informed that the AYUSH had also asked the University not to give affiliation to this College.

Professor Naval Kishore informed that in 2011-12 also the students of this College were allowed to appear in the examination due to pendency of the case in the court. However, the students were not issued Registration Cards.

RESOLVED: That the new Regulations framed and notified by the Central Council of Indian Medicine, New Delhi, vide notification No.28-14/2011-Ay(UG Regu). Dated 25th April 2012, for BAMS course,

as per Appendix, be adopted and the proposed amendment of Regulations (**Appendix-XXXIV**) be approved.

Deferred Item

31. Consideration of Item 31 on the agenda was deferred, viz. –

31. To consider Rules/Norms/Guidelines related to funding/reimbursement of expenses on placement related activities of departments form Central Placement Cell Account for the session 2012-13.

Issue regarding grant of affiliation to Mata Gurdev Kaur Memorial Shahi Sports College of Physical Education, Jhakroudi

32. Considered the issue regarding grant of affiliation to Mata Gurdev Kaur Memorial Shahi Sports College of Physical Education, Jhakroudi, Samrala (Ludhiana) for three years degree course in Physical Education, Health Education and Sports for the session 2012-13, which is non-operative in the Panjab University and its affiliated Colleges since long. Information contained in the office note (**Appendix-XXXV**) was also taken into consideration.

NOTE: 1. Mata Gurdev Kaur Memorial Shahi Sports College of Physical Education, Jhakroudi, Samrala (Ludhiana) filed a Civil Writ Petition No. 21181 of 2011 (**Appendix-XXXV**) in the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court.

The Hon'ble Court did not find any merit in the case of the Petitioner College and refused to intervene in the matter and left to the Vice-Chancellor to take decision in the matter as it is entirely an academic issue as per order dated 3.7.2012.

2. The new course has been introduced namely, Four Year Degree Course for B.P.Ed. in place of this course.
3. The Chairperson, Department of Physical Education has informed that B.Sc. three year degree course in Physical Education Health Education and Sports is not operative in the Panjab University and to its affiliated Colleges instead of this four year integrated course is running by the P.G. Government College, Sector 11, Chandigarh which is affiliated to Panjab University Chandigarh.
4. The Chairperson, Department of Physical Education has intimated that the syllabus for the above mentioned degree course has not been approved by the concerned Board of Studies/ Faculty/Academic Council.

Professor Naval Kishore said that as observed by the Chairperson of the Department of Physical Education, it is not operative in the Panjab University and its affiliated Colleges instead of this four year integrated course is running by the P.G. Government

College, Sector 11, Chandigarh which is affiliated to Panjab University Chandigarh.

Shri Jarnail Singh stated that that B.Sc. three year degree course in Physical Education Health Education and Sports is an academic course. When the College had acquired the infrastructure, faculty and the course as well as regulations existed in the calendar, what was the harm in granting it affiliation. The syllabus could be got prepared if it was not available.

RESOLVED: That the request of Mata Gurdev Kaur Memorial Shahi Sports College of Physical Education, Jhakroudi, Samrala (Ludhiana) for grant of affiliation to start M.A. (Physical Education) Two Year (Annual System) course w.e.f. the academic session 2011-12 be rejected on the grounds that the University in 2006 had decided that the nomenclature of M.A. (Physical Education) be changed to M.P.Ed.(Physical Education), which is a professional course and makes the candidates eligible for appointment as teacher/coach in Physical Education. The NCTE approval, being mandatory, had not been obtained by the College.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That the request the College for grant of affiliation for B.Sc. Three-Year Course in Physical Education, Health Education and Sports, be examined.

Assignment of Fellows to Faculties

33. Considered that the Fellows be assigned to the Faculties for the term 1.11.2012 to 31.10.2016 as per **(Appendix-XXXVI)**, under Regulation 2.1 at page 46 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007, in anticipation of approval of the Senate.

NOTE: 1. Regulation 2.1 ibid reads as under:

“2.1 Fellows shall be assigned to Faculties for the whole of their term, by order of Senate with reference to their special qualifications, after considering recommendations made by Syndicate in this behalf subject to the limitations that no Fellow shall be assigned to (a) more than two out of the Faculties of Languages, Arts, Science, Law and Medical Sciences and (b) more than two out of the remaining Faculties.

Provided that –

- (i) One of the Faculties assigned to a Fellow elected by a Faculty shall include the Faculty which elected him, and
- (ii) A Fellow may, however, ask for a change on the expiry of 2 years of the assignment and his request will be considered by Syndicate”.

2. Minutes of the meeting of the Committee dated 6.12.2012 constituted by the Vice-

Chancellor under his chairmanship, to open the envelopes containing options given by the Fellows (for the term 1st November 2012 to 31st October 2016) for assignment of Faculties is enclosed (**Appendix-XXXVI**).

At the outset, the Vice-Chancellor stated that one envelope had been received from a Fellow giving his choice for assignment to Faculties after the stipulated date i.e. 27.11.2012. He sought advice of the members whether it should be opened and placed before the Syndicate for consideration.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that as per Regulation 2.1 at page 46, P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007, the Fellows are to be assigned to Faculties for whole of their term, by order of Senate with reference to their special qualifications, after considering recommendations made by the Syndicate in this behalf, subject to the limitations that no Fellow shall be assigned to (a) more than two out of the Faculties of Languages, Arts, Science, Law and Medical Sciences and (b) more than two out of the remaining Faculties. According to him, nobody could be denied his right to give his choice for the Faculties. Moreover, the letter does not say that the choice given by any Fellow after the stipulated date, would not be considered. Earlier also the allotment of Faculties were considered in the Syndicate and even the Vice-Chancellor was authorized to take decision on behalf of the Syndicate on the choices given by the Fellows received after the meeting of the Syndicate. He, therefore, pleaded that the envelope received after 27.11.2012 be opened and considered for assignment to Faculties.

Shri Jarnail Singh said that the person concerned might be out of country and sent his choice for assignment to Faculties now. Therefore, the envelope should be opened and considered.

Principal R.S. Jhanji said that the envelope should be opened and the request for assignment to Faculties should be acceded to, but he/she should not be allowed to cast vote in the ensuing Syndicate/ Deans/Secretaries elections.

Principal Janmit Singh said that the envelope should be opened and the request for assignment of Faculties should be acceded to.

Principal Gurdip Sharma said that since two Members of the Legislative Assembly of Punjab are yet to be elected and they would send their choices later on, their requests for assignment of Faculties are also to be considered, the envelope should be opened and the request of the Fellow should be accepted.

Dr. Mukesh Arora said that the request of the Fellow for assignment to Faculties should be considered and acceded to.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that since the motive for assignment to Faculties after knowing the Faculties of others affected the elections, which had already been announced. If the letter written by the Registrar requesting the Fellows to give their choice for assignment to Faculties by 26.11.2012 had any sanctity, they ought not to accept it. Once the last date for giving choices had been fixed and the envelopes had been opened, nobody could be allowed to opt for

Faculties. If at all for a moment the suggestion of other members is to be accepted, the same process should be followed and the envelope should be placed before the same Committee and thereafter before the Syndicate. As far as allocation of Faculties is concerned, there was no Regulation under which the Fellow could opt for the Faculties; rather assignment of Fellows to the Faculties is the prerogative of the Syndicate and Senate. If the Fellow concerned is assigned Faculty now, it would be unfair and amount to interference in the ensuing Elections of Syndics and Deans/Secretaries of the Faculties and nothing else. He did not know whose envelope it was. Even if it was due to the circumstances beyond the control of the person as he might be out of the country, might be in the hospital, the choices could have been received after the elections and then he would have been the last person to object. Now, they could well imagine the purpose of sending the choice of Faculties late. But in the interest of natural justice and fair play, the Fellow concerned should be assigned the Faculties after this year's elections; otherwise, it would be unfair to those who had sent their choice of Faculties within the stipulated time and their choice had become public.

Professor M. Shakeel Khan said that the Vice-Chancellor should be authorized to consider and take decision on the issue.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that if the request of the Fellow concerned is considered now, especially when the Faculties of other Fellows had become public, it would be unfair. According to him, this envelope should be opened along with the envelopes received from the remaining Fellows, including M.L.A.s.

Professor Naval Kishore said that the same process, which was followed in the case of the Fellows, who had sent their choices of Faculties by the stipulated, should be followed in this as well.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Fellows must apply within the stipulated date; otherwise, it would set a wrong precedent. Moreover, if the envelope contained a letter justifying the delay, the issue could have been examined.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that under Section 38 of Panjab University Act, if there arises any dispute, the matter could be referred to the Chancellor for final orders. He suggested that the envelope should be opened and the matter of assignment of Faculties should be referred to the Chancellor for adjudication.

Shri Ashok Goyal did not agree with the contention made by Shri Chatrath because there was no dispute about the membership of the Fellow concerned for which such a provision had been made under Section 38. Moreover, agenda and supplementary agenda for this meeting of the Syndicate had been issued much earlier, i.e., much before the receipt of this envelope. Now, there is no such provision under which this choice for assignment to Faculties contained in this envelope could be considered by the Syndicate. The agenda for the Syndicate is to consider the choices of assignment to Faculties of the Fellows, envelopes of which had been opened by the duly constituted Committee. If something had been received thereafter, it did not find mention in the agenda. Further, if the sanctity of the date is not to be kept, in future, nobody is going to bother about the deadline. Furthermore, the Senate could not consider it directly as Faculties

could be assigned to the Fellows on the recommendation of the Syndicate.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that, according to Regulations, the Fellow concerned was entitled to become a member of the Faculties and had right to vote.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that there was no dispute that the Fellow concerned is entitled to become the member of the Faculties, but it is the timing which mattered the most because he/she has not sent his choices for assignment to Faculties within the stipulate date. He/She is entitled to become the member of the Faculties, but after the elections.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that if the sanctity of the date was not kept, the members would be free to give their choices for assignment to Faculties at any time.

Since majority of the members were of the view that the envelope should be opened and the matter regarding assignment of Fellow to the Faculties should be referred to the Chancellor for adjudication, the Vice-Chancellor opened the envelope which was found to be of Shri K.K. Sharma, Advisor to U.T. Administrator, Chandigarh.

At the end, the majority decision was that as Shri K.K. Sharma has submitted his choice for assignment of Faculties after the stipulated date, i.e., 27.11.2012, therefore, under Section 38 of the Panjab University Act at page 14 of the P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007, the matter be referred to the Chancellor to give decision whether he be allotted Faculties now in the Senate to be held on 22.12.2012 and allowed to participate in the election of Syndicate and Deans/Secretaries of the Faculties to be held on 23.12.2012 and 24.12.2012, or he be allotted Faculties later in the Syndicate to be held in January 2013.

Shri Ashok Goyal, Principal R.S. Jhanji, Dr. Dinesh Talwar and Professor Naval Kishore recorded their dissent with the remarks that the sanctity of the date for submission of choices for assignment of Faculties to the Fellows had not been kept.

RESOLVED: That the Fellows be assigned to the Faculties for the term 1.11.2012 to 31.10.2016 **as per Appendix-XXXVI**, under Regulation 2.1 at page 46 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007, in anticipation of approval of the Senate.

Recommendation of Justice Jain Committee regarding disaffiliation of Guru Gobind Singh College of Education, Dabwali Road

35. Considered the recommendation of the Justice Jain Committee (**Appendix-XXXVII**) with regard to disaffiliation of the Guru Gobind Singh College of Education, Dabwali Road, Tehsil Malout, District Sri Muktsar Sahib.

- NOTE:** 1. On account of the cancellation of recognition of the College by the NCTE under Section 17(3) of National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993, the University withdrew the affiliation of the College vide No. 2793-2810/Misc. dated 4.4.2012 (**Appendix-XXXVII**).

As a result, the College filed a Writ Petition. The Civil Writ Petition No. 6437 of 2012 of Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court, Chandigarh is enclosed (**Appendix-XXXVII**).

The Hon'ble High Court quashed both the orders by passing the following orders:

Without going into the merit of the claim or expressing any opinion, whether the petitioners have or do not have a case of recognition, I quash the orders Annexures P-10 & P-14 and direct both NCTE and Punjab University to inspect the petitioner-College, grant hearing to the petitioners through the new management and after such effecting hearing and considering pass a final order within 21 days of receipt of certified copy of this order.

2. Contempt petition No. 32/95 of 2012 (proceeding under the Contempt of Courts Act No.70/1971 is enclosed (**Appendix-XXXVII**).
3. A detailed office not enclosed (**Appendix-XXXVII**).
4. Acceptance of students' Return for the session 2012-2013 of the College in view of the emerging situation along with office note (**Appendix-XXXVII**).

Initiating discussion, Professor Naval Kishore stated that the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court had directed both the University and NCTE to inspect the College and take a final decision and thereafter submit the report to the Court. The University Committee had inspected the College and submitted its report. Now, it for the Syndicate to take a final decision in the matter. As far as admissions are concerned, the College had made admissions at its

own, but the University had not accepted their Students' Return. As per the directive issued by the Punjab Government, till the Dean's Office gave approval, admissions could not be made by the College.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that it is the College which had less land and got the revenue records fabricated. When the Inspection Committee went they showed the land somewhere else whereas actually the land was at some other place.

Principal Gurdip Sharma said that he had gone through the Periodical Inspection Committee report and found that there was no regular Principal in the College. Moreover, the approval had also been withdrawn by the NCTE and the Punjab Government had also withdrawn its NOC. Now, they had no choice but to withdraw the affiliation.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that after granting them personal hearing, the University is supposed to pass final orders within 20 days.

Professor Naval Kishore said that as far as contempt of the court is concerned, it had been taken care of.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that the University had to insert a notice in the newspapers that neither Guru Gobind Singh College of Education, Dabwali Road, Tehsil Malout, District Sri Muktsar Sahib, had been granted affiliation for B.Ed. course for the year 2012-13 nor it would grant the same in future as well.

RESOLVED: That though neither the University had granted affiliation to Guru Gobind Singh College of Education, Dabwali Road, Tehsil Malout, District Sri Muktsar Sahib for B.Ed. course for the year 2012-13 as claimed by the College, nor the College applied for it, as per direction of the Court, a Committee of the University inspected the College and found some bogus/fake documents. Hence, it is not a fit case for grant of affiliation. This may be informed to the Hon'ble High Court. The College be informed accordingly and the notice in the newspapers be given regarding this for information of the public.

Agenda Items 26 and 27 being Ratification and Information Items, these be read under Items 36 and 37.

Routine and formal matters

36. The information contained in Items **R-(i)** to **R-(xii)** on the agenda was read out, viz. –

(i) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate, has extended the term of appointment of Dr. Amandeep Singh Marwaha, Training- cum- Placement Officer, UIAMS, P.U. for another period of one year w.e.f. 30.10.2012 with one day break on 29.10.2012 (28.10.2012 being Sunday) or till the advertised post is filled through regular selection, whichever is earlier on the previous terms & conditions.

(ii) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate, has accepted the resignation of Dr. Sheeba Mohindra, Associate Professor in Oral Medicine & Radiology (Temporary), Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital, w.e.f. 05.11.2012, with the condition that she has to deposit her one month salary in lieu of short of one

month notice period, under Rule 16.2 available at page 83 of P.U. Calendar, Vol.III, 2009.

NOTE: 1. Rule 16.2 page 83 P.U. Calendar, Volume III 2009 read as under:

“the service of a temporary employee may be terminated with due notice on payment of pay and allowances in lieu of such notice by either side. The period of notice shall be one month in case of all temporary employee which may be waived at the discretion of appropriate authority.

2. The faculty member is urged to complete the teaching duty in the present semester, so that the interests of the students are protected.

(iii) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of Syndicate, has accepted the resignation of Dr. Abhishek Mehta, Assistant Professor, Public Health Dentistry (Temp.), Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital, w.e.f 23.10.2012 by waiving off the condition to deposit one month salary in lieu of one month notice period before resignation under Rule 16.2 page 83 P.U. Cal. Vol. III 2009.

NOTE: 1. Rule 16.2 page 83 P.U. Cal. Vol. III 2009 read as under:

“the service of a temporary employee may be terminated with due notice on payment of pay and allowances in lieu of such notice by either side. The period of notice shall be one month in case of all temporary employee which may be waived at the discretion of appropriate authority”.

2. An office note enclosed **(Appendix-XXXVIII)**.

(iv) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate/Senate, has accepted the resignation of Ms. Shilpi Ahluwalia, Assistant Professor in Food Technology (temporary) University Institute of Chemical Engineering & Technology w.e.f. 1.12.2012 under Rule 16.2 at page 83 of P.U. Cal. Vol. III, 2009 as she has tendered one month notice prior to resignation.

NOTE: Rule 16.2 at page 83 of P.U. Cal. Vol. III, 2009 reads as under:

“The service of a temporary employee may be terminated with due notice or on temporary of pay and allowances in lieu of such notice by either side. The period of notice shall be one month in case of all temporary employees which may be waived at the discretion of appropriate authority.....”.

- (v) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate, on the recommendations of the Leave Cases Committee, has granted Study Leave to Ms. Meenu Saihjpal nee Kaushik for one year w.e.f. the date she is relieved from the department, under Regulation 11 (I) at page 140-143 of P.U. Calendar, Vol. I, 2007, to complete her Ph.D. research work.

NOTE: 1. Ms. Meenu Saihjpal nee Kaushik is required to execute an Indemnity Bond on a non-judicial stamped paper of Rs.15/- before proceeding on leave.

2. Ms. Meenu Saihjpal nee Kaushik also required to sent reports of progress in her studies/research. These reports shall reach the Registrar within one month of the expiry of every six months of the Study Leave failing which the payment of salary me be deferred till the receipt of such reports. The other terms and condition will be applicable under Regulation 11 (I) at page 140-143 of P.U. Calendar, Vol. I, 2007.

- (vi) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of the approval of the Syndicate, has approved the following recommendations of the Committee made in its meeting held on 30.8.2012 (**Appendix-XXXIX**) with regard to plan pertaining to Teaching the subject of Environment and Road Safety Education introduced from the current session 2012-2013:

- (vii) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation approval of the Syndicate, has exempted the implementation of Semester System in all Postgraduate Diploma Courses being run by the University School of Open Learning (USOL), Panjab University, Chandigarh for the session 2012-13.
- (viii) The Vice-Chancellor in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate, has re-employed Sh. Hari Ram, Technical Officer, Computer Centre (retired on 31.10.2010) (whose term of re-employment expired on 17.10.2012), on contractual basis (after giving one day break on 18.10.2012), w.e.f. 19.10.2012 for a period of three months or till the post of Sr. Technical Assistant (G-I) (vacated by Shri M.S. Shammi on his retirement) in the D.C.S.A is filled in after following the prescribed procedure, whichever is earlier, and he be paid half of the salary last paid (excluding HRA,CCA and any other special allowance) rounded lower 100, as per Senate decision dated 04.12.2010.
- (ix) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate/Senate, has allowed the implementation of revised rates of remuneration to staff for examination related work in Computer Unit for the year 2012 as recommended by a Committee dated 5.4.2012 (**Appendix-XL**) constituted by the Vice-Chancellor effective from 31.3.2012.
- (x) The Vice-Chancellor, subject to and in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate/Senate, and grant of NOC from Punjab Government has granted temporary extension of affiliation to the following Colleges in the courses/subjects mentioned against each, as per Inspection Report (**Appendix-XLI**) with the condition that the College will follow the other instructions/ guidelines of the Govt. of India/UGC/ U.T. Administration/ Central Council of Homoeopathy (CCH)/ Punjab Government/PU Chandigarh.

(xii) The Vice-Chancellor, in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate/Senate, has approved the revised rates of examination, other related application forms and fee structure (after 10% increase) w.e.f. examination of March, 2013 onwards.

NOTE: 1. The rate list of examination and other related forms and fee applicable from examinations of March 2013 onwards (after 10% increase) enclosed **(Appendix-XLII)**.

2. The Syndicate meeting dated 4.11.2012 has resolved that the information contained in Item 58 (R-viii) on the agenda, be placed before the Syndicate at its next meeting.

Referring to Sub-Item R(x), Dr. Dinesh Talwar stated that out of 14 teachers, three had retired. Meaning thereby, there were only 11 teachers in the College. Information be sought from the College whether it had appointed 26 teachers.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that, as per his information, the College had not appointed any teacher.

Professor Naval Kishore said that there was a general amnesty of the CCM that the Colleges which did not fulfil the requisite conditions for the session 2012-13, they would be closed from the year 2013-14. In view of this general amnesty of the CCM, two Committees of the University visited the College and told it in clear terms that in case they did not fulfil the conditions by December 2012, their case for affiliation for the year 2013-14 would not be considered.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar pointed out that till now neither the College had given any advertisement for filling up the posts nor had sought any panel from the University, how would they be able to fill up the post by 31st December 2012?

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Dean, College Development Council would write to the College concerned immediately and seek information whether it had appointed the requisite number of teachers.

Dr. P.S. Gill said that notes to both the sub-items (x)(1) and (x)(4) are same which related to grant of affiliation for the years 2011-12 and 2012-13. He enquired whether the compliance report for the year 2011-12 had come from the College. He also enquired whether the University allowed re-employment in affiliated Colleges.

Professor Naval Kishore said that as far as promotions in Homeopathic Medical College & Hospital, Sector 26, Chandigarh, is concerned, the case had been placed before the Syndicate and the Syndicate rejected the same on the ground that in the absence of any regulations/rules of the CCM, the regulations/rules of the University would apply.

Dr. P.S. Gill informed that the College appointed teachers in a particular discipline, but ask him/her to teach in another discipline. How the teacher would be eligible for promotion in his discipline?

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath suggested that the College should first allocate teaching in the discipline of the teacher concerned and thereafter additional discipline.

Referring to Sub-Item R(xii), Dr. Dinesh Talwar said that despite there being decision of the Senate that no fee would be increased during the session 2012-13, the fees had been increased, that too, in anticipation of approval of the Syndicate and Senate and without any justification.

It was clarified that, in fact, the decision of the Senate was that the tuition fees would not be increased during the year 2012-13.

Shri Ashok Goyal observed that the basic question was that why such an important matter had been allowed to be effected in anticipation of the approval of the Syndicate. Why such an exorbitant hike was made. The decision of the Senate is aptly clear that there would not be any hike in fee. The hike might have been implemented because the date for submission of examination forms might be near. If at all the fee had to be increased, they should have been taken into confidence.

It was clarified that the date of submission of examination forms had come near and the forms were to be got printed and were to be sold at new rates. Hence, the hike in fee was inevitable and implemented in anticipation of the approval of the Syndicate.

Shri Ashok Goyal desired that at least the comparative statement of the fee, i.e., revised and unrevised, should have been appended with the item.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar highlighted the problems faced by the students of the Correspondence Studies in not getting their Roll Numbers and they were advised to get the Duplicate Roll Numbers by paying Rs.110/- each.

The Vice-Chancellor said that with a view to mitigate the problem faced by the students, they need to encourage either speed post or engage some reliable courier service. In the meanwhile, he would talk with the Head of the P&T Department to help in accepting the job in bulk because deliverance of Roll Numbers to the students was of utmost importance and it was their social responsibility to accept it.

Dr. Dinesh Talwar pointed out that a student, who had submitted his examination form in July, was declared ineligible in the month of December that too on the last date.

The Vice-Chancellor said that since the examination is the most important functions of the University, some senior officials of the University should be deputed to attend to such complaints of the students and this work should not be left to the Clerks.

Dr. Mukesh Arora said that one of the major reasons was that there is less manpower in the examination branches than required. University Calendars of the University also needed to be updated.

RESOLVED: That the information contained in Item 36-R-(i) to R-(xii) on the agenda, be ratified.

After decisions on the agenda items were taken, the members started general discussion.

- (1) Dr. Mukesh Arora pleaded that the candidates, who had secured less than 20% marks in their 10+2 examination but were placed under compartment by the Board, if they passed or secured 20% or more marks in the subject in the supplementary examination in which they were placed under compartment before the last date of admission with late fee with the permission of the Vice-Chancellor, should be allowed admission or to appear in the 1st year of the degree examination.

The Vice-Chancellor said that a clarification on the issue would be issued by the Controller of Examinations.

- (2) Dr. Mukesh Arora said that there was a provision in the Calendar to take admission in the next higher class within 10 days from the declaration of the result. Now with the implementation of the Semester System at the Postgraduate level, this provision needed to be amended, otherwise, the students would think that it is their right to take admission within 10 days from the declaration of result.
- (3) Shri Jarnail Singh said that Swami Sarvanand Giri Panjab University Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur was itself a big institution. Some of the employees are working there before the institution was taken over by the University, their cases for regularization should be taken up. The two posts of Doctors had been sanctioned, the same should be filled up soon. A Staff Nurse should also be appointed and deputed to work at night.

Principal Gurdip Sharma endorsed the viewpoints expressed by Shri Jarnail Singh.

- (4) Principal Janmit Singh stated that the reservation at the Guest House and Faculty House had become a big problem. Earlier, a person of the rank of Assistant was assigned this job and he was doing this job smoothly. But he had been removed from there.

Principal Gurdip Sharma said that the Senior Assistant, who was working satisfactorily, should again be assigned the job of reservation of the Guest House/Faculty House.

- (5) On the suggestion made by Dr. Mukesh Arora, it was –

RESOLVED: That –

- (i) The Inspection Fee and the sitting fee for the experts of the Selection Committee in the University and its affiliated College be increased from Rs.700/- to Rs. 1,000/-;
- (ii) An honorarium of Rs.1,500/- be paid to the Chancellor's nominee in the Selection Committee of the University and Vice-Chancellor's nominee/s in the Selection Committee of the affiliated Colleges;
- (iii) The D.A. to the members of the Inspection Committees be paid @ Rs.300/- per day; and
- (iv) The rate of road mileage journey by own car/taxi in connection with University work be enhanced from Rs.9/- p.k.m. to Rs.10/- p.k.m.

- (6) Dr. Dinesh Talwar sought to know the fate of his Resolution regarding observance of 5 days week in the Colleges affiliated to P.U. moved in an earlier meeting of the Syndicate (prior to joining of present Vice-Chancellor).
