I. The Vice-Chancellor said, "I am pained to inform this august House about the sad demise of Shri Hazari Lal ji, father of Professor K.K. Talwar, Fellow, Shri Sampooran Singh, father of Dr. Ajaib Singh, Mrs. Mukhtiar Kaur, mother of Dr. P.S. Gill, and Dr. (Mrs.) Saudamini Bambah ji, (fondly remembered as the Florence Nightingale of our University) former Chairperson of the Department of Physical Education, who had made rich contributions for the growth of values in the society. I am further pained to inform this august House about the sad demise in the recent days of two of our distinguished alumni – Shri Dev Anand, renowned film personality and Dr. Swaran Chandan, an eminent Punjabi writer, who were known worldwide for their great contributions. The

fragrance of their affection, values and moral courage will be constant inspiration to the society at large.

As a mark of respect to Shri Hazari Lal ji, Shri Sampooran Singh ji, Dr. (Mrs.) Saudamini Bambah ji, Shri Dev Anand ji and Dr. Swaran Chandan ji, the Senate expressed its sorrow and grief over their passing away and observed two minutes' silence, all standing, to pay homage to the departed souls.

RESOLVED: That a copy of the above Resolution be sent to the members of bereaved families.

II.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that Lt. General B.S. Dhaliwal had been conferred The Engineering Federation of Asia and Pacific Award (FIEAP) for the year 2011. This Award had been conferred for the first time to an Indian. There are a total of 21 countries in this Federation. The major ones are China, Singapore, Malaysia, Australia, U.S.A., France, Taiwan, Pakistan, India, etc.

RESOLVED: That felicitation of the Senate be conveyed to Lt. General B.S. Dhaliwal on having been conferred the Engineering Federation of Asia and Pacific Award (FIEA) for the year 2011.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Syndicate in its meeting held today had decided the proceedings of the Syndicate and Senate be videographed on experimental basis and, thus, each member must restrict himself to three minutes time after getting permission from the chair. Hence, every member is requested to get permission before speaking and restrict himself/herself up to 3 minutes time.

Shri Gurdip Singh, on behalf of the Federation of non-teaching employees and on his own behalf, thanked the Vice-Chancellor for taking initiative to fill up the vacant non-teaching posts. In this way, the major demand of the employees had been fulfilled as majority of the persons in this University were working on *ad hoc*/daily wage basis. He urged the Vice-Chancellor to complete the entire process and fill up these posts at the earliest.

The Vice-Chancellor said that, the previous day, they had approved the schedule for appointment of clerks and other lower level posts. The entire process of recruitment would be completed by 10th of February 2012, but it depended on the Screening and other Departmental Committees, etc. He hoped that the Departmental Heads and the Dean of University Instruction would complete the process as per schedule.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that recently the Punjab Government had regularized the services of certain categories of employees, who had completed three years' service. He pleaded that the above-said policy of the Punjab Government should be adopted before filling up the vacant posts through proper procedure.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.

V. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-3 on the agenda** was read out, viz. –

C-3 That, keeping in view the letter dated 9.11.2011 from the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) had been received through which it had been informed that ‘as per CVC Office Order No.31/5/05 dated 12.05.2005 of the CBI, the matter be referred back to the Senate for consideration and, in the meanwhile, legal opinion on the letter of the CBI, be obtained.

NOTE: Letter No. 26/2/2009-PD(HRD)/3368 dated 16.11.2011 received from Joint Director (Policy), Central Bureau of Investigation, Policy Division, 27 North Block, New Delhi along with its enclosure is enclosed (**Appendix-I**)

(Syndicate meeting dated 19.11.2011 Para 2(i))

The Vice-Chancellor stated that, in fact, the Senate in its previous meeting had authorized the Syndicate to hear Shri Satish Kumar Padam, Executive Engineer and Shri Nand Lal Kaushal, S.D.E. In the meanwhile, the University got a letter from the CBI to the effect that they could not provide opportunity to hear the accused, i.e. Shri Satish Kumar Padam and Shri Nand Lal Kaushal and the Syndicate decided that the matter be referred back to the Senate for consideration and, in the meanwhile, legal opinion on the letter of the CBI, be obtained. The legal opinion given by the Legal Retainer is as under:

“The Hon’ble Supreme Court has held in Supdt. of Police (CBI) Vs. Chowdhary – AIR 1996, SC 186, as under:

“The grant of sanction, therefore, being administrative act, the need to provide an opportunity of hearing the accused before according sanction does not arise. The High Court, therefore, was clearly in error in holding that the order of sanction is vitiated by violation of the principles of natural justice.”

There are other judgements of the Hon'ble Supreme Court to that effect. Even the instructions of CVC dated 12.05.2005 are the same to the above effect.

In view of the above, the CBI is right in whatever they say in their letter dated 09.11.2011.”

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that there are two types of cases: (i) where the employer does not give an opportunity to the accused employee, and then the accused do not have any claim that he must be given an opportunity to be heard; and (ii) the employer wanted to hear the accused employee. They had to distinguish between these two types of cases and take an appropriate decision.

Dr. Gurmeet Singh said that this issue had been lingering for the last over one year. Since all the documents had been supplied to the members, they were supposed to take a decision which should not only be fair but look to be fair. A message should go outside that the University is not afraid to take action against its employees. According to him, grant of sanction for prosecution of an employee is not a punishment at its own. Hence, they should not sit on the judgement and grant sanction for prosecution of the accused employees.

Shri A.S. Bedi said that as per authorization given by the Senate, the issue was discussed in the meeting of the Syndicate dated 19.11.2011 and keeping in view the letter of the C.B.I., it was decided that legal opinion be obtained and thereafter the matter be placed before the Senate.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that, in fact, the Senate had constituted a Committee of three members to look into all the relevant papers and take decision on behalf of the Senate. As per authorization of the Senate, the Committee looked into all the papers and granted sanction for prosecution of Shri Satish Kumar Padam and Shri Nand Lal Kaushal. Thus, it was wrong to say that they had not granted sanction for prosecution of the accused employees. Actually, the problem was that the C.B.I. sent them a draft and they wanted them to grant sanction on the dotted lines for which the Committee was not authorized and resultantly the matter was placed before the Senate.

Shri V.K. Sibal stated that he was a member of the above said Committee and it was true that the Committee had granted sanction for prosecution of Shri Satish Kumar Padam and Shri Nand Lal Kaushal. But, there was a background that one of the members refused to apply his mind. The Committee told him that if he did that the case

would finish in the first hearing. It was under those circumstances that the sanction for prosecution was granted. This was a case where a man had been caught red-handed by the C.B.I. The investigation agency had recordings of the telephonic conversation, reports of the Forensic Science Laboratory, etc., which gave clear indication that the man demanded money. Hence, there was no need to hear the accused by the Senate before granting sanction for their prosecution.

Shri Gurdip Singh said that there was no harm in hearing the accused employees.

Agreeing with Shri Gurdip Singh, Dr. Akshaya Kumar stated that they must also look to be fair, but should not stand in the way of natural justice. In certain cases, things were too obvious. Hence, the Senate should grant sanction for prosecution of the accused employees. He enquired with whose permission certain cases had been reported to the Vigilance, Punjab.

The Vice-Chancellor said that they had not referred any case to the Vigilance, Punjab. Perhaps, one of their own colleagues might have made a complaint to the Vigilance, Punjab.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that guilty persons should be given punishment so that the message should not go that they were protecting the wrong persons. But, at the same time it should be ensured that sanction for prosecution could only be granted if they were satisfied that the persons are definitely guilty. Referring to C.B.I. letter, he said that it seemed that the entire University record had been made available to the C.B.I.

The Vice-Chancellor said that it is incorrect that the University had provided all the record to the C.B.I. In fact, the C.B.I. is getting information from the newspapers.

Continuing, Shri Prabhjit Singh said that how the C.B.I. came to know that the Syndicate of the University is giving personal hearing to the accused. Secondly, these are mere guidelines of the Supreme Court but not the directives. On the one side, they were not following the guidelines of the U.G.C. and on the other they were following the guidelines of the Supreme Court of India. It was the discretion of the University to give personal hearing to the accused employees or not. The University could not testify on the basis of the documents supplied by the C.B.I. whether the charges framed against them are correct or not. Thirdly, no recovery had been made from Shri Nand Lal Kaushal. In nutshell, he said that the accused must be given a personal hearing by the Senate.

The Vice-Chancellor said that could they go against the Hon'ble Supreme Court?

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that neither they could go against the Hon'ble Supreme Court nor they wanted to do so. But in this case the C.B.I. was dictating them.

The Vice-Chancellor said that they would state only those facts on which they were satisfied and the others could be left.

Dr. S.S. Randhawa stated that in order to give natural justice, the House should hear the accused employees first and thereafter decide whether sanction for their prosecution be given to the CBI or not.

Ms. Jasvir Kaur Chahal enquired was it not the right of the appointing authority to hear the accused employees and to know whether they were convicted or not?

The Vice-Chancellor said that CBI had provided them certain documents and after applying their minds, they had to say whether they were satisfied with the charges or not.

Shri V.K. Tewari said that it could only be gauged by the legal persons whether the charges framed by the C.B.I. were justified or not.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that it was not right of the accused to be heard, but the employer could give them personal hearing at its own.

Professor Rupinder Tewari observed that if the accused could not be heard by the entire House, members having legal acumen should be allowed to give them personal hearing and make recommendations.

Dr. P.S. Gill suggested that the Vice-Chancellor should be authorized to form a Committee to reply considering the draft supplied by the C.B.I.

The Vice-Chancellor said that since it is a serious matter, they needed to be careful while replying to the C.B.I. Though they had sympathy with their employees, they could not play with the regulations/rules.

Dr. Kuldip Singh said that earlier the University had given personal hearing to Dr. Sodhi Ram, the then Controller of Examinations against whom charges were also framed by the C.B.I. He enquired why different yardsticks were being adopted in the present case.

Shri A.S. Bedi said that they would not like to become a party in the grant of sanction for prosecution of the accused employees without hearing them.

Dr. R.P.S. Josh said that first of all they should hear the accused employees and thereafter decide whether sanction for their prosecution was to be granted or not.

Professor S.K. Sharma said that it seemed that they were going strictly as per the whims of the C.B.I., but a number of cases of the C.B.I. fall flat in the court. He felt that though the accused had not requested for personal hearing, the Senate could decide to provide them personal hearing either by itself or by a Committee to be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor.

Shri V.K. Sibal said that Senate was not a trial court as it had got the limited mandate i.e. either to give sanction for their prosecution or deny it by giving reasons.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the issue was lingering on for quite some time. Moreover, in view of the Supreme Court ruling, the Senate could not provide personal hearing to the accused employees, but they would mention only those things in the sanction about which they were fully convinced.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that if he remembered correctly the issue for grant of permission for prosecution of the aforesaid employees came to the Senate for the first time in its meeting held on 29.3.2011. At that time some of the members were of the opinion that since none of the papers were made available to the members, permission could not be given without applying their mind. And some of the members were of the opinion that permission be granted by the Vice-Chancellor if he is satisfied that the employees were definitely guilty. General view in the House was that unless and until they were not supplied all the papers and apply their minds, sanction for prosecution should not be granted. Consequently, three-member Committee was constituted by the Senate to take decision on its behalf. To his utter shock just after four days, on 4.4.2011 at 1.30 p.m. when he was in Delhi, he received a telephone call from the University office that a meeting of the Committee had been fixed at 4.30 p.m. for which no papers were provided to him. He could not attend the meeting. Only two members met and subsequently he came to know that those two members were also not provided all the relevant documents. In the absence of documents and the fact that one of the two members also did not apply his mind, the Committee had granted sanction for the prosecution of the accused employees. Till that time he did not had any doubt regarding the decision of the Committee for permitting the C.B.I. to prosecute the accused. Thereafter the University received a draft from the C.B.I. requesting the University to give sanction on the dotted lines. He enquired why the Registrar did not show the said draft

to the members of the Committee. In the meantime, the University received a revised draft and controversy arose whether it was within the purview of the Committee to grant sanction for prosecution of the employees as per the draft. Thereafter, the case came to the Senate and the Senate authorized the Syndicate to hear the accused on its behalf. Now, the Syndicate had decided that in view of the C.B.I. letter, legal opinion be obtained and the case be referred to the Senate. His specific enquiry was could the Syndicate, which had been authorized by the Senate to act on its behalf, could on its own go beyond its jurisdiction. The Syndicate had recommended that legal opinion be obtained and the same was first required to be placed before the Senate. And it was only for the Senate to decide as to what action is to be taken. The impression was that the whole Senate was for saving the culprits. He enquired whether they had to do whatever C.B.I. wanted. How they could take a different stand in the second case. The power to hear the accused rested with the employer and after application of mind the employer had not been debarred by Supreme Court from granting sanction for their prosecution. However, the employee could not claim, as a matter of right, that he had to be heard, but the employer could grant them personal hearing and that did not mean that they wanted to save the accused. There was difference between the present case and in the case of Dr. Sodhi Ram, as he was not caught red handed. In the instant case, as per claim made by C.B.I., Shri Satish Kumar Padam had been caught red handed by the C.B.I. They should take an independent decision on the basis of the facts of the case and not as dictated by the C.B.I.

Dr. A.C. Vaid said that if the accused had not requested for personal hearing, they should not grant the same. Why they were bent upon saving a person who had been caught by the C.B.I. red handed?

The Vice-Chancellor said that the sanctioning authority was only to see whether prima facie case was made out on the basis of documents submitted by the C.B.I. Moreover, grant of sanction for prosecution did not mean that they were punishing the accused.

Shri Ashok Goyal said that once the University had given permission for the prosecution of the accused, what were the reasons for the Committee to meet again? Could they show the letter received from the C.B.I. mentioning that this type of sanction for prosecution was not acceptable to them?

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that though the F.I.R. was one, no trap was laid down by the C.B.I. to catch Shri Nand Lal Kaushal. If the sanction for prosecution of Shri Satish Kumar Padam was granted, sanction for prosecution of Shri Nand Lal Kaushal would also have to be provided. Since, Shri Nand Lal Kaushal had not been caught red handed, the question arises as to how these two cases could be segregated?

Dr. Kuldip Singh said that there was contradiction between the rulings of the Hon'ble Supreme Court and the High Court. However, general guidelines were not acceptable to them.

Dr. Gurmeet Singh said that if they are not guilty, they would be acquitted by the Court. He, therefore, suggested that they should not linger on the issue and grant sanction for their prosecution without any further delay.

Shri V.K. Sibal observed that, earlier, since one of the members of the Committee had not applied his mind, the sanction granted by the Committee was invalid.

The Vice-Chancellor said that there was no harm in granting sanction for the prosecution of the accused, as the Court was not going to take a decision *suo moto*.

At this stage, it was clarified that on the recommendations of the above mentioned Committee, the University wrote a letter to the C.B.I. stating that on the basis of the information provided by the C.B.I., the Senate of the University grants permission that

Shri Satish Kumar Padam and Shri Nand Lal Kaushal be prosecuted. When this letter reached the C.B.I., somebody from the C.B.I. told the Registrar that they had already sent a draft along with all the papers and that the sanction for prosecution should be given in that format. The draft was circulated to every member and the meeting of the Committee was called again. Since the Committee could not reach to a conclusion in one or the subsequent meetings, he was called in the C.B.I. office to explain the delay. While discussing the matter, it was noticed that in the proceedings of the Senate meeting, where the matter was discussed, it has been mentioned that all the Senate members were not provided the material supplied by the C.B.I. since Senate was the appointing authority of the accused, the C.B.I. wrote that the University should have provided all the papers to the Senate to reach at a conclusion. Therefore, it was decided that in the next meeting of the Senate all the papers relating to the case, including the papers provided by the C.B.I., should be made available to the members and on the basis of that the Senate should take a decision.

RESOLVED: That on the basis of the documents provided by the C.B.I. and after proper application of mind, the Senate resolved that the sanction already granted by the University on the recommendation of the Committee, for the prosecution of Shri Satish Kumar Padam, Executive Engineer and Shri Nand Lal Kaushal, S.D.E., on behalf of the Senate, be allowed.

VI. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-4 on the agenda** was read out, viz. –

C.4 That the matter regarding grant of sanction for prosecution of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo, be referred to the Senate for consideration.

(Syndicate meeting dated 19.11.2011 Para 3)

Shri Ashok Goyal said that the case of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo was different from the case of Shri Satish Kumar Padam and Shri Nand Lal Kaushal, Executive Engineer and S.D.E., respectively as Shri Satish Kumar Padam had been caught red handed and arrested by the C.B.I., whereas the case of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo related to N.I.T., Srinagar, where he was Director, while on Extra Ordinary Leave (EOL). N.I.T., Srinagar, had not granted sanction for prosecution of their employees, who were also involved in this case. The case of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo was referred to Panjab University because he was not the employee of N.I.T., Srinagar. Moreover, Dr. R.K. Wanchoo had now rejoined his parent Institution, i.e. Panjab University. Now, the question arises could they grant sanction for prosecution of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo for his act alleged to have been done at another Institution? He remarked that Panjab University was not an automatic machine for grant of sanction for prosecution of its employees.

Professor S.K. Sharma stated that he happened to be one of the members of the Selection Committee of N.I.T., Srinagar. In fact, he was a nominee of the All India Council of Technical Education on the Selection Committee. Four candidates were selected by the Selection Committee. Since the original proforma had only three columns but names of four candidates were supposed to be written on it which was required to be countersigned by all the members of the Selection Committee. The C.B.I. caught hold of a particular member of the Selection Committee from whom they got it revealed that it was not his signature but the same was got not proved from the report of hand-writing expert. Even if his (Professor S.K. Sharma) signatures are verified by the C.B.I., it would not match every time.

Shri V.K. Sibal stated that there were six members on the Selection Committee, whereas four persons signed on the prescribed proforma and the other two members did not. There was no indication as to why the other two persons had not put their signatures. What was the urgency to put signatures by the four persons and what were the reasons for not signing by the other two members?

Dr. Rabinder Nath Sharma stated that if they go by the charge sheet prepared by the C.B.I., the sanction for prosecution of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo should be given by the Panjab University, even if the N.I.T., Srinagar had not given sanction for prosecution of its employees. Secondly, two yardsticks should not be applied to similar cases. He, therefore, pleaded that sanction for prosecution of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo should be given and he should prove his innocence in the Court and a message should go that they are not saving anybody.

Professor S.K. Sharma said that since the N.I.T., Srinagar had answered all the columns of the proforma sent by the C.B.I. and had finally said that as no case was made out at that stage, they would not grant sanction for prosecution of their employees.

Dr. Rabinder Nath Sharma said that the University should not become a party for safeguarding the culprits.

Dr. Rupinder Tewari said that two yardsticks should not be applied while dealing with similar cases. In case they are not satisfied with the charges framed by the C.B.I., a Committee of legal luminaries should be constituted to look into the matter in the first instance.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the House should take a collective decision in this regard.

Dr. P.S. Gill said that the guidelines of the Supreme Court should not be considered as a directive to the University. Since this case related to Dr. Wanchoo, who was at N.I.T., Srinagar, on deputation and not at Panjab University, they were not supposed to grant permission for his prosecution for the act done at Srinagar.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar said that they should not follow different yardsticks in similar cases. Dr. R.K. Wanchoo might have taught the students and done research for several years, but in this matter they should not stand in between.

The Vice-Chancellor requested all the members to go through the papers provided to them and after applying their minds come out with concrete decision. He added that the MHRD had asked the NIT, Srinagar to grant sanction for prosecution of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo and the NIT, Srinagar, had written that since he was not their employee, the matter should be referred to Panjab University where he was working on permanent basis. Hence, now it is the liability of the Panjab University.

Professor S.K. Sharma said that they should say that since at the time of this act Dr. R.K. Wanchoo, the then Director, NIT, Srinagar, was on EOL from Panjab University, Chandigarh, N.I.T., Srinagar should be asked to give sanction for his prosecution.

Dr. Gurmeet Singh said that the proposal put forth by Professor S.K. Sharma was not practicable as the employer had to grant sanction for prosecution.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal stated that they were not supposed to apply same yardstick to each case rather each and every case should be dealt with independently on merits. They had to go by the documents made available to them. He asked whether after going through the documents, they feel he was guilty. The same opinion as given in the case of Shri Satish Kumar and Shri Nand Lal Kaushal would not be right because this case is different in nature. Some members are assuming that NIT, Srinagar, is protecting its employees, whereas they had no interest in protecting anybody. In the end, he suggested that either they should say that after going through the documents they are satisfied that Dr. R.K. Wanchoo is guilty and he should be prosecuted or not, at all, grant sanction for his prosecution or make a reference to NIT, Srinagar.

Shri A.S. Bedi remarked that the C.B.I. was not the ultimate authority. They should apply their mind independently and see whether *prima facie* case was made out or not.

The Vice-Chancellor suggested that before they decided to grant sanction for the prosecution of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo, they should have a report from the NIT, Srinagar, what they had to say on the issue.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar said that these are adequate papers and they should apply their minds and say whether sanction for prosecution should be granted or not.

Principal S.S. Randhawa remarked that the C.B.I. is acting like a dictator. The signatures of some of the members of the Selection Committee are there and the C.B.I. could not say that Dr. R.K. Wanchoo had committed a crime.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath observed that the C.B.I. is interfering in the academic affairs of the University. Earlier, he was shocked when they came to the Department of Laws. Though they are against corruption, but they must save their employees from arrest, if innocent.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that they should take a decision as most of the members had pointed out, but should not say yes to whatever had been provided by the C.B.I. They had to apply their minds and as an employer say whether a *prima facie* case was made out on the basis of the documents provided or not. This discretion had been given to the employer by the Court. In spite of the fact that on the basis of documents no case is made out, they could not say that since in another case sanction for prosecution had been given, therefore, in this case also sanction for prosecution should be given.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that earlier when Shri Pal, Superintending Engineer, Punjab State Electricity Board, was caught red handed by the C.B.I., the Supreme Court had said that nobody could compel the employer to grant sanction for prosecution.

Referring to the proposal of the Vice-Chancellor that comments from N.I.T., Srinagar, would be sought on the issue relating to grant of sanction for prosecution of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo, Shri Ashok Goyal enquired as to what information the University would like to seek. According to him, relevant information had already been given by N.I.T., Srinagar vide letter No.NIT/DO/11/1855 dated 12.09.2011, which, *inter alia*, reads as under:-

“In accordance with the directions of the Hon’ble Chairman, Board of Governors, National Institute of Technology, Srinagar, the request of the CBI was placed on table before the Board of Governors of the Institute at its meeting held on 08.09.2011. After thorough discussion, the Board of Governors observed that

1. While framing the charges motive behind the alleged irregularities have not been brought out.
2. The advertisement notice issued in June 2007 clearly mentions qualification for the post of Lecturer as First Class Masters degree in the appropriate branch of Engineering/Technology. The candidates were short listed by the Screening Committee of the Institute keeping in view their academic merit in appropriate branch of Engineering.

3. All the four candidates selected against the post of Lecturers were handwritten by one and the same Officer at the same time and signed by all the Selection Committee members. The candidate appearing at S.No.04 was authenticated by putting signatures of four members of the Selection Committee.
4. The report of the National Institute of Forensic Sciences, Panchkula, has confirmed the signatures of one of the members of the Selection Committee who had reportedly denied his signatures.
5. One of the members of the BOG who was also member of the Selection Committee clearly stated that his statement given to CBI by him has not been correctly reproduced in the report.
6. Chairman, BOG statement has not been correctly reproduced in the report.

Keeping in view above and other relevant facts, the BOG unanimously decided not to issue sanction for prosecution of Professor Aijaz Hussain Mir, HOD, Electronics and Communication Engineering and Mrs. Arooj Nissar, Lecturer and have recommended closure of case. Concerned CBI Officer should be informed about the decision of the BOG with information to concerned Officer of the MHRD, Government of India, New Delhi, through an order to be signed on behalf of the Board of Governors by Chairman. ...”

What else information they wanted to have from NIT, Srinagar? On the basis of the above information, no *prima facie* case was made out. Hence, sanction for prosecution of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo should be refused as had been done by the NIT, Srinagar.]

Dr. Akshaya Kumar stated that there should not be any division between the teaching and non-teaching staff of the University as both are working in the same Institution. The sanction for prosecution in the earlier item, i.e. non-teaching case, had already been granted and the issue should not be reopened again.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the case should be considered on merit basis and not keeping in view whether the person belonged to teaching or non-teaching staff.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that these cases are totally different in nature and should be decided on merit after applying their minds.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal said that Dr. R.K. Wanchoo was not the employee of the University at the time when the act has been alleged.

Dr. Rabinder Nath Sharma said that though N.I.T., Srinagar had not granted sanction for prosecution of their employees, they should consider the prosecution case of Dr. R.K. Wanchoo on merit and should not refuse the permission on the plea that since NIT had not given, they would also not give our permission. Otherwise, a wrong message would go outside.

Dr. Karamjit Singh suggested that a Committee should be constituted to look into all the aspects of the case and make its recommendations; otherwise, our employees would be unnecessarily harassed by the C.B.I.

Professor Keshav Malhotra endorsed the viewpoints expressed by Dr. Karamjit Singh.

Dr. Janmit Singh said that both the cases could not be compared with one another and; hence, in this case permission for prosecution should not be granted.

Dr. Kuldip Singh said that a wrong message would go outside that in the case of non-teaching employees, the Senate had granted sanction for prosecution and in the case of a teacher, it had refused the prosecution. He pleaded that two yardsticks could not be adopted in the similar cases.

Shri V.K. Tewari stated that the Vice-Chancellor had requested the members to peruse all the papers supplied to them. After going through the paper, he found that there were six members on the Selection Committee. Some of the members of the Selection Committee had said it in unequivocal terms that only three persons were selected and not four. The contention of those members was that this interpolation had been done afterwards. The interpolation had to be seen in the context of law. In the process of investigation certain allegations had also been raised, e.g. controversy in the list of selected persons. Perhaps in the light of that observation, they should get some final words from NIT, Srinagar. That was why the proposal of the Vice-Chancellor looked to be fair.

After discussion, it was –

RESOLVED: That a letter be written to Director, NIT, Srinagar, on behalf of the Senate, to get information in the light of the discussion which took place in the meeting. The information supplied by the NIT, Srinagar, be placed before the Syndicate for consideration in the first instance and, thereafter, the matter be placed before the Senate, if needed.

Shri A.S. Bedi stated that one of the candidates for the post of Registrar had alleged that the call letters for the interview scheduled for 29th August 2011 were sent on 25th August 2011, whereas the call letters for the interview for the post of Controller of Examinations scheduled for 9th August 2011 were sent on 1st August 2011 given them more than a week's time. But the candidates who were supposed to appear in the interview for the post of Registrar were not given any time as 27th and 28th August 2011 were holidays. Thus, he was not in favour of approving the appointment of Dr. A.K. Bhandari as Registrar.

Dr. R.P.S. Josh stated that he had no objection to the approval of appointment of Registrar, but one of the candidates for the post of Controller of Examinations was harassed and insulted in the interview. He had said that the candidate, recommended by the Selection Committee for the post of Controller of Examinations, was made to suffer to mitigate the harassment of a rejected candidate. Thus it seems imperative that the matter of selection of controller of Examinations be taken into consideration.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the complainant had sent an e-mail to the Chancellor and the Vice-Chancellor. In reply to the e-mail, the Deputy Registrar (Estt.) had replied that the candidates were also informed about the interview through e-mail. Now, the candidate in question (Dr. Kulbir Singh Dhillon) had written the following letter to the University saying that he had never made any complaint:-

“It is submitted that I had applied for the post of the Registrar at Panjab University, Chandigarh and Interview has been held for the post. I had represented to the Vice-Chancellor of the above mentioned University that I had not received the interview letter for the above mentioned post. Meanwhile I contacted the local post office which informed me that the letter from Punjab University has reached them on time but could not be delivered because of Saturday. So the matter has been sorted out and prima facie it seems there was no wrong on the part of the University or its officials concerned.

It is further submitted that some people are using my name for their vested interests and issuing statements on my behalf. I have full faith in Dr. R.C. Sobti, the Vice-Chancellor and Panjab University, Chandigarh. It is requested that the inquiry should be closed”

Referring to Sub-Item C-7(8), Dr. Karamjit Singh stated that he was not against the appointment of Mr. Naveen Kumar as Assistant Professor in Infrastructural Management, but as per page 128 of the Appendix (Syndicate meeting dated 29.8.2011), the candidate had been awarded zero mark for assessment of Domain Knowledge and Teaching Skills (30%). He do understand that there was no qualifying marks in each criteria, e.g. academic record and research performance (50%), assessment of domain knowledge and teaching skills (30%) and interview performance (20%). His only concern was that though the candidate got zero mark in domain knowledge and teaching skills, they were still appointing him as Assistant Professor. It might send a wrong message outside. He suggested that the criteria should be reviewed.

The Vice-Chancellor said that Dr. Karamjit Singh had raised a valid point and the same would be reviewed, as a Committee was still working on the criteria, including Proforma for A.P.I. score.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar said that since in University Institute of Engineering & Technology, they appoint persons both from academics and industries, could they implement A.P.I. score for the persons who come from industry. He, therefore, suggested that a separate Committee be constituted to look into the matter.

Dr. A.C. Vaid suggested that it is better to give weightage to those persons who had Domain Knowledge and Teaching Skills.

Professor S.K. Sharma said that in engineering, people who are from industry, their API score would always be zero. He, therefore, suggested that there should be separate rules for appointments in engineering.

Ms. Jasvir Kaur Chahal stated that she had been raising the issue of discrepancies in the proforma of A.P.I. score time and again in the last two-three meetings of the Syndicate and Senate as well. Despite giving her the assurance in the previous meeting of the Syndicate, the newly evolved API score proforma had not been provided to her. It was also assured that Dr. Akshaya Kumar would conduct a workshop on this issue, but the same had not been held so far. The previous day, she was told that the newly evolved API score proforma had been uploaded on the University Website. She enquired what was the use of uploading the A.P.I. Proforma on the University website without solving the discrepancies existed in the A.P.I. score proforma? Her only concern was that they were acting on such important issues in a very hurried manner. Instead they should examine every nitty-gritty of the API score proforma and find proper solution so that no such problem arose in future.

Professor B.S. Ghuman clarified that there was no A.P.I. score for the posts of Assistant Professor. The template used is only for making the system transparent and its objective was also for giving weightage to academic qualifications, experience, etc. at the time of appointment. If there are certain lacunae, the API score proforma could be reviewed by the Syndicate and the Senate. In the case of Associate Professor in the subject of Engineering and Technology, it was clearly written that the professionals are eligible, but they must have Ph.D. and teaching experience. However, in the case of professionals, a Committee of experts could be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to examine the equivalent of professionals.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that he was in agreement with other members that there were certainly lacunae in the criteria. Certain marks should be earmarked for capacity to communicate. He, therefore, suggested that the criteria should be reviewed.

Dr. Karamjit Singh stated that regarding selection criteria the U.G.C. says that while selecting the Assistant Professor in Universities and Colleges 100 marks should be there. The University had divided the 100 marks in the ratio of 50 marks (for academic record and research performance), 30 marks (for domain knowledge and teaching skills) and 20 marks (for interview performance). But the question was how to assess the domain knowledge and teaching skills. He, therefore, suggested that the criteria should be got reviewed by a Committee of experts so that a clear-cut direction was there in the template.

The Vice-Chancellor proposed that the Senate should constitute a Committee of experts to review the API score proforma because certain selections had been scheduled in the first week of January 2012.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar stated that already there were 30 members on the Committee which is looking into the problems in API score proforma. The members are applying their minds. PUTA also did an extensive exercise and also sought suggestions from the faculty members. The Committee had also discovered that API score was being interpreted in a number of ways. PUTA recommended that wherever the API was silent, the benefit should go to the teachers. Since a larger Committee was already in place,

which is looking into the nitties and gritties, if another Committee was constituted, it would be an unending problem. He, therefore, pleaded that they should not rush through the issue of API score proforma.

Dr. Gurmeet Singh said that since the API score issue was a sensitive one, a Committee comprising Deans, President, PUTA, and certain senior faculty members should be constituted to look into the problem and make recommendation/s. He added that by and large they were following the U.G.C. He, however, pointed out that as per the existing API template, they were approving 109 promotions.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the Committee which is looking into the API score proforma should make its final recommendations by 25th December 2011.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath pointed out that the appointment of ST candidates had only been challenged of the University Institute of Legal Studies (5-Year Law) and not of the Department of Laws (3-Year Law). He, therefore, pleaded that the appointment of ST candidates in other Departments/Institutions should be approved.

Dr. Kuldip Singh said that since the API score proforma was also applicable in the case of appointments in the affiliated Colleges, some persons from the affiliated Colleges should also be appointed members of the Committee constituted to review the API score proforma.

The Vice-Chancellor said that Shri M.L. Aeri, Dr. I.S. Sandhu and Principal Narinder Singh Sidhu would be appointed as member of the above-said Committee.

Continuing, Dr. Kuldip Singh said that a Review Committee had been constituted by the U.G.C. to consider the anomalies.

The Vice-Chancellor said that he has learned that the Anomaly Committee had considered the anomalies and recommended 72-73 amendments. The amendments would be considered by the Commission. They should wait for the outcome.

Principal Narinder Singh Sidhu suggested that all the appointments recommended by the Syndicate should be approved. However, for future, the discrepancies in the API score proforma should be removed.

Professor Rupinder Tewari said that he wondered that a person, who had got zero mark in Domain Knowledge and Teaching Skills, had been recommended for appointment as Assistant Professor in the Panjab University. Since it is wrong, it should be rectified.

The Vice-Chancellor said that it could be changed at this stage.

Shri V.K. Tewari stated that he wanted to know from the chair whether the API score proforma applicable for the post of Professors in the University would also be applicable for appointment of Principals in the affiliated Colleges. As far as he knew the U.G.C. says that API score was applicable to the Professor and its equivalent. The University had already made two appointments of Principals, i.e. in the Constituent Colleges of the University. Perhaps, the appointments in the affiliated Colleges were required to be made as per the U.G.C. guidelines, wherein the minimum API score was 400 marks.

Principal Narinder Singh Sidhu informed that the Punjab Government had not yet adopted these norms of the U.G.C.

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that they had followed these norms for their own Constituent Colleges. But the affiliated Colleges situated in Punjab were supposed to follow the norms of the Punjab Government and the affiliated Colleges situated in U.T.

Chandigarh that of the Chandigarh Administration till the new norms of the U.G.C. are adopted by the respective Governments.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu said that since the Punjab Government had not yet adopted the new U.G.C. guidelines, the affiliated Colleges should be allowed to make the appointments of Principals without API score. He also pointed out that in affiliated Colleges, the candidates without NET were also not declared eligible for the post of Assistant Professor. Moreover, if the Punjab Government had not adopted the new U.G.C. guidelines, the candidates, who have done M.Phil., should be made eligible under the old guidelines.

The Vice-Chancellor said that whatever the old guidelines of the Governments are, the same should be followed by the affiliated Colleges situated in the jurisdiction of the respective Governments.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that since the Punjab Government had not adopted the new U.G.C. guidelines, the candidates possessing M.Phil. degree but without NET, should be continued to be made eligible under the old guidelines.

RESOLVED: That the recommendations of the Syndicate contained in Item 7 on the agenda, be approved, except that the appointment of Dr. Ajay Kumar Dogra (ST) as Assistant Professor in Hospital Management at University Institute of Applied Management & Sciences, who had been allowed to join in anticipation of the approval of the Senate, be kept in abeyance, keeping in view of the Senate decision dated 16.10.2011 (Para IV) on similar cases.

Professor A.K. Bhandari abstained when above Item 7 on the agenda was considered.

At this stage, the Vice-Chancellor stated that the proposals of Panjab University on the proposed Centres on “Cultural Fixation on “Honour”: A Gender Audit of Punjab and Haryana” and “Application of Nanomaterials, Nanoparticles and Nanocomposites” had been selected under CPEPA of U.G.C. for which it would be receiving a grant of Rs.1.85 crore and Rs.3.55 crore, respectively. The University Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences had also received a grant of Rs.2 crore for the construction of hostel for conducting training courses under U.G.C. scheme for Networking Resource Centre.

The Vice-Chancellor further stated that the University had got a copy of the following letter dated 14.11.2011 from Shri Harpreet Singh, Director, Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India, regarding funding of Panjab University:

“As you are aware, the University Grants Commission has released an amount of Rs.150 crore to the Panjab University, Chandigarh for 2010-11 in pursuance of the D.O. letter dated 1.11.2010 of the then Additional Secretary (HE). The matter relating to change of funding pattern of Panjab University through the University Grants Commission requires the concurrence of the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Ministry of Finance. This Ministry is in the process of consulting these Ministries and thereafter, the matter will be placed before the CCEA for its approval.

2. Pending approval of the competent authority, U.G.C. is requested to continue funding the Panjab University, Chandigarh based on norms as applicable to Central Universities excluding the State Government’s share of Rs.21.00 crore and the amount of funds generated by the Panjab University through its self-financing courses.

3. For 2011-12, an amount of Rs.150.00 crore may be released immediately to allow the Panjab University to meet its financial requirements, under intimation to this Ministry, to enable this Ministry to send a compliance report to the PMO.
4. As regards reimbursement of funds to the U.G.C. by the MHRD, action is being initiated to open a new sub-head under the main budget head of the U.G.C. in the Demands for Grants of MHRD. You may kindly project the amount pertaining to Panjab University as part of the annual budgetary proposals to this Ministry”.

Hence, the funding pattern of the University was being changed which required concurrence of Ministry of Human Resource Development, Ministry of Home Affairs and Ministry of Finance, Government of India. If the University would have got released a grant of Rs.32 crore from the U.T. Administration, the whole exercise would have become futile.

Dr. Gurmeet Singh said that discussion regarding Central Funding of the Panjab University was going on from the last three-four years. But as per the above letter, though a new sub-head under the main budget head of the U.G.C. in the Demands for Grants of MHRD is being created, still the Panjab University would not become a Central Funded University.

Shri V.K. Tewari said that papers were to be put up before the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court by the Attorney General about the central funding of the Panjab University. Had those papers been put up before the Hon'ble Punjab & Haryana High Court?

IX. The recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Items C-8 and C-9 on the agenda** were read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

C.8 That Dr. Ronki Ram be promoted from Associate Professor Stage-4 to **Professor Stage-5** in the Department of Political Science, Panjab University, Chandigarh, under the U.G.C. Career Advancement Scheme (subject to fulfillment of U.G.C. conditions) with effect from **12.06.2010**, in the pay-scale of ₹37400-67400 + AGP ₹10,000/- at a starting pay to be fixed under the rules of Panjab University. The post would be personal to the incumbent and he would perform the duties as assigned to him.

(Syndicate meeting dated 29.8.2011 Para 2(viii))

C.9 That Dr. Neeraj Khullar be promoted as Reader in the Department of Biotechnology, Panjab University, Chandigarh, under the U.G.C. Career Advancement Scheme (Old Scheme) (subject to fulfillment of U.G.C. conditions), with effect from **04.06.2008**, i.e. after one year from the date of her eligibility, i.e. 04.06.2007 as done in the case of Dr. Seema Vinayak and Dr. Geeta Shukla, Department of Psychology and Microbiology, respectively, in order to maintain uniformity in all such cases, in the pay-scale of Rs.12000-420-18300 at a starting pay to be fixed under the rules of Panjab University. The post would be personal to the incumbent.

(Syndicate meeting dated 27.9.2011 Para 2(xxii))

X. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-10 on the agenda** was read out, viz. –

C-10 That, subject to the fulfilment and verification of API scores on the last date of submission of application and if found eligible thereafter, the following persons be appointed Principal in any two of the four constituent Colleges of Panjab University, i.e. (i) Nihalsinghwal, District Moga, (ii) Balachaur, District Nawanshahr, (iii) Sikhwal, District Sri Muktsar Sahib, and (iv) Guru Har Sahai, District Ferozepur, in order of merit, on one year's probation, in the pay-scale of Rs.37400-67000 + AGP of Rs.10,000/- on a pay to be fixed according to the rules of Panjab University:

1. Dr. Sunil Khosla
2. Dr. Bhushan Kumar Sharma.

(Syndicate meeting dated 29.8.2011 Para 2(xviii))

Principal Narinder Singh Sidhu and Principal Gurdip Sharma jointly pleaded that the minimum pay of Dr. Sunil Khosla and Dr. Bhushan Kumar Sharma should be fixed at Rs.42,000/-.

The Vice-Chancellor said that their pay would be fixed according to the rules of the Panjab University.

Dr. Kuldip Singh enquired when would the verification of API score would be done, as per the conditions laid down by the Syndicate? Would the verifications be made after these appointments were approved by the Senate?

Professor Naval Kishore clarified that the verifications would be done within two-three days.

Principal S.S. Sangha enquired since out of 4 posts of Principals only two posts had been filled, when would the remaining two posts be advertised? He said that as per Calendar, Periodical Inspection Committee comprised of two members, whereas Periodical Inspection Committees comprising four members had been sent to the Colleges.

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that since a huge data was to be checked, Periodical Inspection Committees comprising four members had been sent. He added that now the University was contemplating of dividing the Colleges into three categories on the basis of their following the regulations, rules, instructions, etc. of the University. The affiliated Colleges obtaining 75 points, 50 to 74 points and below 50 points would be categorized as A, B and C, respectively.

Continuing, Principal S.S. Sangha said that, as per N.C.T.E. norms, 16 teachers were required to be appointed by the Department of Education, whereas only 6 teachers were there.

The Vice-Chancellor said that they are going to fill up the vacant posts shortly.

Shri Ashok Goyal enquired as to how many Constituent Colleges of the University were there?

The Vice-Chancellor said that there was a problem with regard to establishment of a Constituent College at Guru Har Sahai, District Ferozepur. He requested Dr.

Kamaljit Singh, the Co-ordinator of the Constituent Colleges, to explain the difficulties with regard to the Constituent Colleges.

Dr. Kamaljit Singh clarified that, in fact, the University Grants Commission had not approved the establishment of Constituent College at Guru Har Sahai, District Ferozepur. But the Punjab Government had assured that they would do everything for the Constituent College being established at Guru Har Sahai, District Ferozepur. Unfortunately, the Punjab Government had not given a single rupee this year so far. The University Grants Commission had given a grant of Rs.1.6 crore for each of the Constituent Colleges approved by it. Out of the lump sum grant of Rs.5 crore + recurring grant of Rs. 1 crore every year promised by the Punjab Government, the Punjab Government had given only Rs.3.6 crore for P.U. Rural Centre, Kauni.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that interview letters were sent to the candidates on the basis of their A.P.I. score. Why the Syndicate decided to verify the A.P.I. score again?

Dr. Kamaljit Singh said that at the time of recommending appointment of Principals in the Constituent Colleges, the A.P.I. scores were checked. After the condition imposed by the Syndicate, a Committee had verified the A.P.I. scores of the candidate and the file had been returned to the Dean, College Development Council.

Principal Tejinder Kaur said that she was not in favour of the proposed categorization of the affiliated Colleges.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the colleges were being categorized to improve their functioning. There were certain colleges which were not following the regulations, rules, guidelines, etc. of the University, at all.

Continuing, Principal Tejinder Kaur apprehended that the Inspection Committees sent by the University might make mistake while making recommendations, e.g. A-Category Colleges could be asked to fulfill the conditions of C-Category Colleges, etc. She, therefore, pleaded that clear-cut directions should be issued to the Inspections Committees.

The Vice-Chancellor clarified that though everything about the categorization of Colleges was ready, still he was verifying each and everything personally so that no lacuna remains there.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that the Senate had approved the establishment of those Constituent Colleges which had been approved by the University Grants Commission. If the University Grants Commission had not given its approval for the fourth college, how it can be established by the University on an assurance given by the Punjab Government. Unfortunately, the Punjab Government had also not released any money for the fourth college. In the absence this and the fact that the Syndicate and Senate had not taken any decision in this regard, whose liability would be the fourth Constituent College? What would be the status of the fourth Constituent College? Could they afford to have that luxury?

Professor Naval Kishore clarified that initially the University Grants Commission had given permission to start four Constituent Colleges. In midway, the University Grants Commission withdrew its permission for establishment of fourth Constituent College at Guru Har Sahai, District Ferozepur. In one of the meetings held in this regard the Chief Minister, Punjab, had promised that if the University Grants Commission withdrew its permission, Government of Punjab would meet recurring and non-recurring expenditure for the fourth Constituent College. They had received sanction letter from the U.G.C. regarding grant for all the four Constituent Colleges, i.e. salary part, but as far as non-recurring grant is concerned, they have got the same only in respect of three Constituent Colleges.

Shri Ashok Goyal enquired was there any provision under which the University could start a Constituent College on the request of Punjab Government?

The Vice-Chancellor said that Dr. Sunil Khosla and Dr. Bhushan Kumar Sharma, who had been appointed Principals, would be given appointment letters for the specific Constituent College. As far as starting of fourth Constituent College at Guru Har Sahai, District Ferozepur, is concerned, the matter would be got examined from a Committee.

Ms. Jasvir Kaur Chahal said that categorization of Colleges should not be done by the University as the same was already being done by a national level body, i.e. NAAC.

The Vice-Chancellor said that they were categorizing the affiliated Colleges for their own consumption.

Continuing, Ms. Jasvir Kaur Chahal suggested that first the norms for the categorization of the Colleges should be evolved and thereafter categorization done.

Dr. A.C. Vaid stated that the point raised by Shri Ashok Goyal was right because any assurance given by any Government should not be taken in the spirit that in case the U.G.C. did not approve the establishment of fourth Constituent College, the Punjab Government would provide the funds for the same. He added that due to political change in the State, the Panjab University might be in trouble. He, therefore, suggested that the U.G.C. should be again requested to approve the establishment of fourth Constituent College and in case, the U.G.C. did not approve of the same, then the fourth Constituent College should not be established.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar stated that they were not sure of the position of affiliated Colleges, Constituent Colleges, Panjab University Rural/Regional Centres and the teaching departments of the University. Tomorrow, they might face several problems in the elections of the Senate from various constituencies. He, therefore, suggested that this problem should be addressed at the earliest.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that, earlier, the Evening College and Correspondence Course were treated just like affiliated Colleges and they were not allowed to participate in the Senate elections. Now, since these had been granted the status of the departments, they were allowed to participate in the Senate elections.

Dr. V.K. Tewari welcomed the significant initiative of Govt. of Punjab led by Mr. P.S. Badal to accept the GOI/UGC Scheme to make collaborative effort to start Constituent Colleges in about 13 Educationally Backwards districts with a clear target to raise enrolment of youth in Higher Education to national level for which GOI had made budgetary provision. Thus about 17 new public-funded colleges had come up in Punjab, where the fee-fund structure is affordable for the common man. No neighboring state has reportedly done so.

He further congratulated three Vice-Chancellor's Dr. Jaspal Singh, Dr. R.C. Sobti and Dr. A.S. Brar for coming forward to accomplish the onerous task. He called on august house to defend and support the unique plan of GOI/UGC in collaboration with Punjab Govt. He urged Dr. Sobti to appoint Principals/Teachers and non-teaching staff on regular basis to ensure quality foundation for high educational standards in predominantly rural areas. Dr. Tewari desired Senate resolution of felicitation be sent to Prime Minister/Chief Minister and the Vice-Chancellor.

RESOLVED: That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-10 on the agenda**, be approved.

XI. The recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-11, C-12, C-13, C-14, C-15, C-16 and C-17 on the agenda** were read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

C-11 That the resignation of Dr. (Mrs.) Kawaljit, Assistant Professor, University Institute of Engineering & Technology, be accepted w.e.f. 1.6.2011, as she was granted permission to go abroad during vacation, 2011 with the condition that she will have to join the department on the first opening day after summer vacations, 2011. But she did not join; hence, three months salary be deducted in lieu of insufficient notice that required under Regulation 6 given at page 118 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007.

(Syndicate meeting dated 29.8.2011 Para 5)

C-12 That three non-compounded advance increments be given to Dr. Neelam Sharma, Deputy Librarian, A.C. Joshi Library, P.U., on acquiring Ph.D. Degree in the subject of Arts/Library Science, w.e.f. the date of declaration of her Ph.D. result, i.e. 24.5.2011.

(Syndicate meeting dated 29.8.2011 Para 6)

C-13 That Dr. Naresh Kumar Agnihotri, Assistant Professor, Department of UCIM, be granted voluntary retirement w.e.f. 22.02.2011, i.e. the date from which he is absent from duty without sanction of leave, and three months salary in lieu of insufficient notice be deducted under Regulation 6 given at page 118 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007. He be also sanctioned retiral benefits, under Regulations 17.5, 17.8 and 17.9 at page 133 of P.U. Calendar, Volume I, 2007.

(Syndicate meeting dated 29.8.2011 Para 7)

C-14 That –

- (i) single candidate be allowed to be called for interview in the case of Physical handicapped (for the post of Assistant Professor only) as allowed in the case of SC/ST candidates.
- (ii) all Physical handicapped candidates (eligible) be called for interview in the case of Assistant Professor only as already allowed in the case of SC/ST candidates.

NOTE: 1. The Syndicate at its meeting held on 29.8.2011 (Para 9) has resolved that one eligible Physical Handicapped candidate (Locomotor Disability), be called for interview for the post of Assistant Professor in Sociology at University School of Open Learning advertised vide No. 13/2010.

2. There is no such provision to hold interview for a **single candidate in the case of Physical Handicapped as provided for SC/ST candidate vide Senate Meeting dated 12.10.2003**

(Para XV). There is also no provision to call all eligible candidates in the case of **physically handicapped as allowed in the case of SC/ST candidates**, which needs to be allowed.

- C-15** That Mrs. Suraj Kanta Sharma, Assistant Registrar, Computer Unit, be granted voluntary retirement w.e.f. 31.10.2011, i.e. the last day of three months' notice period given by her, under Regulation 17.5 at page 133 of P.U. XIV. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-20 on the agenda** was read out, viz. –

C-20 That the following recommendations of the Committee dated 8.8.2011, constituted by the Vice-Chancellor with regard to appointment of Principals and Assistant Professors in the affiliated College in terms of the U.G.C. Regulation 2010 be approved:

1. Guidelines regarding composition of Selection Committee for the selection of Principals and Assistant Professors etc. as contained in the UGC guidelines in question, be implemented in letter and spirit;
2. The recommendation of the Selection Committee made for the selection of Principals/Assistant Professors as per the old/existence guidelines, be followed for approval till such time, the recommendation of the Committee is approved by the competent body;
3. The governing body of the affiliated Colleges constituted under the Regulation 1.2(a) appearing at page 157 of P.U. Cal. Vol. I be treated as the statutory body for the purpose of recommending names of experts on the panel for the selection of Principals and Assistant Professors in the affiliated Colleges;
4. Those Teachers who have been duly granted approval by the University according to the Syndicate decision/the then existing UGC guidelines, be considered to have been duly approved for the purpose of selection and appointment while shifting from one institution to another either in the same/or promotional capacity like; Associate Professor/ Professor. Likewise an already approved Principal of an affiliated College of P.U. shall also not need a fresh approval from the University on his shifting from one College to another College of P.U. Provided his new appointment is made through properly constituted Selection Committee;
5. Minority College/Institution be considered to be minority educational Institution only after it submits valid document of its having been declared/notified as a minority Institution.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that a teacher/Principal, whose appointment was approved by the Panjab University, stood always approved and the same had been recommended by the Committee (recommendation 4). Whenever an affiliated College of Panjab University advertised a post, it should be mentioned in the advertisement that the already approved Principals/Lecturers of Panjab University were eligible and the new guidelines were not meant for them. He pleaded that directions in this regard should be issued to the affiliated Colleges.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu endorsed the viewpoints expressed by Shri Prabhjit Singh.

The Vice-Chancellor apprehended that if the proposal of Shri Prabhjit Singh is accepted, there would be court cases.

Principal Narinder Singh Sidhu said that the advertisement should be given as per the U.G.C./Punjab Government/Panjab University norms.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that though he was not against the suggestion made by Principal Sidhu, how it would be implemented practically?

Shri Jarnail Singh said that if the approved teachers/Principals in continuity of their service wanted to shift from one college to another, new qualifications would not be applicable to them.

Shri V.K. Tewari stated that he was a member of the above-said Committee and submits before the House that the issues pertaining to once approved teacher/Principal and other related aspects of the appointment, etc. were looked into thoroughly by the Committee and accordingly the recommendations had been made. He agreed with the suggestion of the members that the requisite information in this regard should be sent to the affiliated Colleges and other concerned quarters.

RESOLVED: That the recommendations of the Syndicate contained in item 20 on the agenda, be approved with the addition that already approved teachers/Principals of P.U. are eligible to apply in other affiliated College of Panjab University and this be circulated to all the Colleges.

Initiating discussion, Dr. I.S. Sandhu pointed out that S.M.S. Karamjot College of Women, Miani (Hoshiarpur) and Swami Ganga Giri Janta Girls College, Raikot (Ludhiana) were not paying salaries to the teachers as per U.G.C./University norms. There were only two permanent teachers in Government College, Karamsar, Rara Sahib (Ludhiana). On the one hand the Colleges were not following the norms of the U.G.C./University and on the other hand, the University was giving new courses to them. He added that the Managements of the Private Colleges were pleading that first the

norms of the U.G.C./University should be implemented in Government Colleges and thereafter they should be asked for the same. He pleaded that those Colleges which are not following the U.G.C/University norms, should not be given affiliation for new courses.

The Vice-Chancellor said that Dr. I.S. Sandhu should give his viewpoints in writing to the Dean, College Development Council so that appropriate action could be taken.

Dr. Mukesh Arora stated that the plea that the norms of the U.G.C./University should be first implemented in the Government Colleges is ill-founded as majority of the Government Colleges, including SCD Government College, Ludhiana, had started paying a salary of Rs.21,600/- may be from PTA fund. He added that private Colleges say something else and pay something else, whereas the Government Colleges could not tell a lie.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu said that it was very shameful that the money of the students were being utilized for payment of salary to the teachers.

The Vice-Chancellor said that whichever courses were being given to the affiliated Colleges, they were being given by the Hon'ble members as they were members of the Inspection Committees. Why did they recommend grant of affiliation?

That Vice-Chancellor further proposed that no papers should be accepted by the University from those affiliated Colleges, which had got panels for the Selection Committee/s, but had not done the needful for filling up the post/s.

This was agreed to.

RESOLVED: That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item 22 on the agenda**, be approved.

About a year ago, he had sent a Resolution in this regard. Perhaps, a meeting of the Committee constituted to consider the issue was also held, but thereafter nothing had been heard. He pleaded that necessary direction in this regard should be issued to all the affiliated Colleges.

The Vice-Chancellor said that directions in this regard would be issued to all the affiliated Colleges soon.

Referring to deduction of Contributory Provident Fund by the affiliated Colleges, Shri Ashok Goyal said that certain Colleges started deducting C.P.F. from the date of confirmation, whereas certain Colleges started deduction of C.P.F. from the date of appointment. Certain Colleges situated in the Union Territory Chandigarh also did not extend this benefit to the teachers on probation rather in order to deny them this benefit, they extend their probation period by another year. Whereas extension of probation period depended on the conduct of the teacher/employee concerned. He pleaded that clear-cut instructions in this regard should be issued to all the affiliated Colleges and whichever College is reported to be violating this provision, should be taken to task.

The Vice-Chancellor said that a circular in this regard would be issued by his office.

NOTE: The Board of Finance dated 07.01.2008 vide Item No.4, has already approved the Institute of Nursing, Para Medical and Vocational Studies, Kauni, Muktsar from the Session 2008-2009, because of the non-viability of the above courses at Kauni, the University has decided to start B.A./B.Com/PGDCA, etc. at the Centre.

Shri V.K. Singh, IAS, Finance Secretary, Chandigarh Administration stated that instead of making change in the nomenclature of Institute of Nursing, Para Medical and Vocational Studies, Kauni Muktsar to Panjab University Rural Centre, Kauni, District Muktsar be made giving some urban name.

- (ii) a new Digital Copy Printer Model DX4545 120CPM A3 to A3 size be purchased from M/s Ricoh India Ltd., SCO 50-51, Sector 17-A, Chandigarh, at approved DGS & D Rate contract @ Rs.4,72,039.64 net (Rs.40,000/- less buy-back of old Copy Printer) out of the Budget Head "Depreciation Funds."

Officer from the India Navy, Ms. Vineeta Arora, Principal, Bhavan Vidyalaya, Chandigarh), for institution of an endowment in the memory of late Mr.

Pritish Bery Memorial Scholarship w.e.f. 2012-13, be accepted on the following terms and conditions:

1. The Endowment would be named as 'Late Mr. Pritish Bery Memorial Scholarship'.
2. Student should be pursuing MBA/MBA-HR/ MBA-IB from the University Business School, Chandigarh campus.
3. He should be physically handicapped fulfilling the criteria as prescribed by Panjab University and should have obtained admission through the quota reserved for physically handicapped students.
4. In case of more than one student being eligible, financial background of the student would be the second criteria for selection wherein the student belonging to weaker family background would be given preference. Students would be required to submit an affidavit giving the details of their family income.
5. Either individual or all donors would be involved in the process of selection of the incumbent for the scholarship every year.
6. The amount of Scholarship would be Rs.3,000/- p.m. for 10 months in view of the interest to be accrued on the endowment sum.

XXXII. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-42 on the agenda** was read out, viz. –

C.42 That –

- (i) the introduction of Road Safety subject at the College level, be approved, in principle, and the modalities be worked out later on.

(Syndicate meeting dated 29.5.2011 Para 7)

- (ii) the nomenclature of the subject of "Environment Education" be changed to "Environment Education and Road Safety" subject as a compulsory qualifying subject of 70 marks (Environment Education: 50 marks and Road Safety: 20 marks). The question paper for Road Safety should be of 20 multiple questions. The syllabus for Road Safety should be prepared on 10 topics by the Committee to discharge the functions of Board of Studies in Police Administration. The students would be required to attend 10 lectures in a College on the subject; and
- (iii) the above decision be made effective from the session 2012-13.

(Syndicate meeting dated 29.8.2011 Para 14)

Dr. Dalip Kumar said that the nomenclature of the subject should be **“Environment and Road Safety Education”** instead of Environment Education and Road Safety.

Dr. Tarlok Bandhu said that it was fair enough to club Environment Education and Road Safety and the distribution of marks should be in the ratio of 70:30.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar stated that earlier they had introduced Environmental Education subject and now Road Safety subject has been introduced. Tomorrow, they might introduce another subject. How long this process would continue? Ideally, the students should study the core subjects only; otherwise, it was wastage of time. Subjects like Environmental Education and Road Safety should be taught at the level of 10+2.

Dr. Dayal Pratap Singh Randhawa stated that if they were asked to undergo the driving skill test by the State Transport Authority, majority of them would fail. Study of Road Safety subject was the need of the hour as thousands of lives were lost in road accidents every year. The number of lives lost in road accidents was more than the lives lost in terrorism.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that every day several people were got disabled, permanently handicapped or died in road accidents. It was their duty to make them cautious about the rules of road safety. Thus, the University was going to the society to take care of their problems with the introduction of Road Safety subject.

Professor Shelley Walia welcomed the introduction of Road Safety subject at the University level. He suggested that restriction on speed limit should be put in the Campus because the boys drove the vehicles in the Campus at the terrorizing speed.

Professor Rupinder Tewari endorsed the viewpoint expressed by Professor Shelley Walia.

RESOLVED: That the recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-42 on the agenda**, be approved, with the modification that the nomenclature of the course be **“Environment and Road Safety Education”**.

XXXIII. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-43 on the agenda** was read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

C-43 That Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) be executed between University Institute of Engineering and Technology (UIET), Panjab University, Chandigarh and Post Graduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh.

(Syndicate meeting dated 29.8.2011 Para 35)

XXXIV. The recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-44 on the agenda** were read out, viz. –

C.44 That the recommendations of the Committee dated 22.7.2011 regarding certain issues related to all Colleges of Education affiliated to Panjab University, be approved.

(Syndicate meeting dated 19.11.2011 Para 46)

Dr. Dalip Kumar pleaded that the University should impress upon the affiliated Colleges of Education to fill up the posts of Principal on regular basis.

Principal S.S. Sangha stated that it had been decided that whichever College of Education did not appoint Principal on regular basis, a fine of Rs.50,000/- would be imposed. In fact, appointments of Principals are made on regular basis, but the appointees did not join. This fact was reported by a Committee, but no action had been taken by the University.

Professor Naval Kishore clarified that reports are coming from the Committees. Out of 68 Colleges reports of only 32 Colleges had been received so far.

The Vice-Chancellor proposed that the Senate should allow the Vice-Chancellor to take appropriate action against the defaulting Colleges and remedial measures, on behalf of it. If any strict action was taken by him against the defaulting College, none of them would come to him.

This was agreed to.

RESOLVED: That recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-44 on the agenda**, be approved.

At this stage, the Vice-Chancellor stated that in the previous meeting of the Senate, certain guidelines for appointments were approved. Now, it should be approved that since they are following the U.G.C. in toto, they should follow for the recruitment of Assistant Professor the template developed by the University giving due weightage to Ph.D. holders without mentioning any year of obtaining Ph.D. This meant, all Ph.D. degree holders, irrespective of the year of getting degree, are now eligible for the post of Assistant Professor. However, candidates having qualified NET would also be given due credit.

Dr. R.P.S. Josh said that some marks should also be given for teaching experience.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that NET being the mandatory qualification, credit for Ph.D. should be given to the candidates.

Dr. A.C. Vaid said that there was no dispute about NET being a qualification, but if a NET qualified candidate had done Ph.D. also before July 2010, NET being the minimum qualification, he/she should not be given credit for the NET.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu said that whosoever fulfilled the essential qualification whether NET or Ph.D., should not be given any weightage.

Dr. Dalip Kumar suggested that more weightage should be given to teaching experience.

Principal Gurdip Sharma suggested that 10 marks should be allocated for teaching experience, irrespective of graduate or postgraduate teaching experience.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that as per the template developed by the University, marks had been allocated for each qualification, including publications and teaching experience. The same should also be followed by the affiliated Colleges.

Dr. I.S. Sandhu suggested that marks for teaching experience should be given on year-wise basis. He also suggested that certain marks should be earmarked for undergraduate teaching experience and certain for postgraduate teaching experience. However, if need be, maximum limit should be fixed.

Dr. Dharinder Tayal said that the issue needed to be distinguished on two counts, i.e. eligibility and scoring problem. Even the suggestions given by the members did not completely solve the problem.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar said that the probation period of two teachers, who had not qualified NET, but had done Ph.D. under old regulations, had been extended. They had enquired whether they had to qualify UGC NET now.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.

Referring to allocation of marks for undergraduate and postgraduate teaching experience, Professor Rupinder Tewari said that if a candidate after doing B.Sc. and M.Sc. from a College/University goes abroad and comes back from Harvard after publishing one/two papers and face the interview, he would be deprived of such marks, whereas a candidate who taught in a remote area College is given 5/10 marks for teaching experience. He enquired what was the fault of candidate, who had enriched his knowledge at an Institution like Harvard?

Principal S.S. Sangha suggested that some marks should also be allocated for a candidate, who had topped the University examination.

Professor B.S. Ghuman pleaded that some credit should also be given to the Research Scholars, who are teaching as per the rules of the U.G.C.

The Vice-Chancellor proposed that the template developed by the University should be approved, in principle. However, minor changes could be made by appointing a Committee of experts that the same would stand approved by the Senate.

This was agreed to.

RESOLVED: That all the Ph.D. candidates, irrespective of the year of obtaining Ph.D., are eligible for the post of Assistant Professor in the University as well as its affiliated Colleges, but the template to be approved by the Vice-Chancellor as mentioned above, on behalf of the Senate, for the purpose be followed.

XXXV. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-45 on the agenda** was read out, viz. –

C.45 That, in order to improve the image/status of Departments of Swami Sarvanand Giri P.U. Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur, in public perception, the following Departments of Swami Sarvanand Giri P.U. Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur, be renamed as under:

Shri Jarnail Singh stated that he had no objection to the renaming of these Departments, but how the renaming of these Departments would actually improve the functioning of Swami Sarvanand Giri P.U. Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur? Swami Sarvanand Giri P.U. Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur, had been established six years ago, but until now the University had not been able to fill up the post of Director on regular basis. He pleaded that the posts of Director at Swami Sarvanand Giri P.U. Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur and P.U. Regional Centres, Ludhiana and Muktsar, should be filled up on regular basis at the earliest. According to him, simply renaming of these Departments would not improve their functioning. He suggested that the placement of the students of Swami Sarvanand Giri P.U. Regional Centre, Bajwara, Hoshiarpur, should be arranged along with the students of University Institute of Engineering & Technology.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath stated that since all the candidates are admitted on the basis of Entrance Test, migration should be allowed in 3rd, 5th and 7th Semesters.

RESOLVED: That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-45 on the agenda**, be approved.

At this stage, Ms. Anu Chatrath enquired whether the construction of the building/s had been stopped after the incident of breaking of sub-standard bricks in the House.

Principal Hardiljit Singh Gosal said that all the sub-standard bricks were removed from the site.

XXXVI. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-46 on the agenda** was read out and unanimously approved, i.e. –

C.46 That –

- (i) it be accepted as a policy matter for smooth conduct of Moot-Court Competition and the guidelines be framed in consultation with the Dean, Faculty of Law, in the light of MoU signed between University Institute of Legal Studies with Surana & Surana International Attorneys for facilitating grant of cash prizes etc.

C-98 That the recommendations dated 22.11.2011 of the Screening/Selection Committee to finalize the promotion cases of the Programmers/System Analysts etc. working in various Departments of the University, be approved.

(Syndicate meeting dated 20.12.2011 Para 8)

Referring to **Item C-81**, Shri Prabhjit Singh pointed out that promotion of Dr. B.B. Goyal and Dr. Karamjit Singh had been recommended subject to disposal of complaint received in the Registrar's Office on 21.10.2011 (in the morning). Moreover, the promotion of Dr. Karamjit Singh is also subject to clarification from the U.G.C. on a letter sent to them for counting of Selection Grade period for eligibility. He enquired when would be the complaint against them would be disposed off? He pleaded that first the complaint should be disposed of and later on promotion granted.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that he had got clarification from the office according to which Dr. Karamjeet Singh was granted Selection Grade in the year 2000, while he was working as Lecturer in S.G.G.S. College, Sector 26, Chandigarh. According to U.G.C. Regulations 2010, one becomes Associate Professor after putting in 3 years' service in the Selection Grade/Reader. Regulations 2010 makes the Senior Lecturer equivalent to Reader. Accordingly, Dr. Karamjeet Singh would have become Associate Professor w.e.f. 01.01.2006, i.e from the date the new U.G.C. Regulations 2010 come into force, which they have already accepted. Even if he would not have been selected as Reader in Panjab University, all those, who had been placed at par with Dr. Karamjeet Singh in the University or affiliated Colleges, were made Associate Professors from 1.1.2006 and they had made everybody Associate Professor here. Further, after having three years' service as Associate Professor one becomes eligible to be considered for the post of Professor. In the instant case, the date of considering Dr. Karamjeet Singh for the post of Professor is

01.01.2009, which was strictly in accordance with University Grants Commission Regulations 2010, which they had gone through in detail.

The Vice Chancellor further stated that Dr. B.B. Goyal was promoted as Reader in 2001 and was designated as Associate Professor w.e.f. 1.1.2006 in terms of U.G.C. Regulations 2010. Hence, he is eligible for the post of Professor w.e.f. 01.01.2009. This is strictly as per University Grants Commission Regulations. He added that, as per records available, he was fully satisfied with the promotion of these persons.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath enquired could the period of punishment in which the increments were stopped with cumulative effect, which is a major punishment, be counted for eligibility.

The Vice-Chancellor said that if any of the members wanted to see the records, they could see the same in his office.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath said that show him a case, where a man had been awarded a punishment with cumulative effect, had been made entitled for promotion by calculating the period for which he had been awarded punishment.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter could be examined by a Committee.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar said that the Committee should be given some specific time to submit its recommendation/s so that no more delay is occurred in the promotion of the teachers.

Continuing, Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath enquired could they change the seniority of the persons who are already in service. Could they provide him a copy of the U.G.C. Regulations which say that if somebody is working in an affiliated College in the Selection Grade and appointed in the University in 2005 and placed in the merit list at Sr. No.3, benefit for higher promotion could be given to him. On first February 2006, he was made Associate Professor, whereas he was entitled to become Associate Professor on 7th May 2008. They had to see as to what work was done by him.

RESOLVED: That the recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Items C-78, C-79, C-80, C-82, C-83, C-84, C-85, C-86, C-87, C-88, C-89, C-90, C-91, C-92, C-93, C-94, C-95, C-96, C-97 and C-98 on the agenda**, be approved.

RESOLVED FURTHER: That the recommendations of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-81 on the agenda**, be approved, except the promotion of Dr. B.B. Goyal. A Committee be constituted by the Vice-Chancellor to examine the promotion case of Dr. B.B. Goyal.

Dr. Karamjit Singh abstained when the above Items were considered.

XLII.

Considered the recommendations of the Regulations Committee dated 20.12.2011 (**Appendix-II**) (**Item C-99 on the agenda**) with regard to enhancement of age from 60 to 65 years forwarded by the Vice-Chancellor as authorized by the Syndicate dated 20.12.2011 (Para 9).

Dr. D.P.S. Randhawa stated that as per recommendations of the Regulations Committee, the term of Vice-Chancellor had been enhanced from three years to five years and the age of superannuation of teachers of the University as well as of the affiliated non-Government Colleges from 60 years to 65 years. He had certain reservations for raising the age of superannuation of teachers from 60 years to 65 years. They did not

have any valid reason for recommending these enhancements. Whether there is a shortage of eligible and trained human resources in this field? Whether the teacher of 60 years age could physically or mentally deliver up to the maximum extent? Now, they were recommended enhancement in the age of superannuation of teachers from 60 years to 65 years without any valid reason and, in future, they would recommend 65 years to 70 years. He was not against that experienced teachers were required, but those young students who were also eligible were deprived of their legitimate rights for another five years. Secondly, it would lead to unemployment and unrest amongst the youth all over the country. That was why, he strongly opposed the amendment in Regulations. They should not take any such decision for which the society might not forgive them. For seeking guidance from the experience teachers from time to time, a separate forum of teachers of 60 years to 65 years age should be formed. They should contribute towards reduction of unemployment amongst the youth so that they could be given maximum opportunities for getting jobs.

Dr. Janmit Singh said that it was right that the eligible unemployed youth were not getting sufficient job opportunities, but even the vacant positions were not being filled up due to the ban imposed by different Governments. Thus, if the age of superannuation was reduced from 60 years to 50 years, even then the eligible youth would not get employment.

The Vice-Chancellor said that as far as Panjab University was concerned, they had already filled up many vacant positions and others are in process of filling.

Dr. Dalip Kumar stated that he welcomed the recommendations of the Regulations Committee, but there was a huge gap of 7 years between the retirement age of University teachers and that of teachers of Government Colleges as they retired at the age of 58 years. For maintaining better co-ordination between the University and the affiliated Colleges, observance of 5-day week should be allowed in the affiliated Colleges.

Shri Hardiljit Singh Gosal said that the Director Public Instructions (Colleges), Punjab, had imposed a ban on new recruitments. Resultantly, numerous teaching posts were lying vacant in the Colleges. He demanded that if the age of superannuation of University teachers was increased to 65 years, the age of superannuation of teachers serving in Non-Government Colleges should also be increased so that they could be put on the similar footing.

Shri Gurdip Singh said that he agreed with the recommendation of the Regulation Committee, but he was sorry to point out that the representation of Shri Prabhjit Singh regarding enhancement of age of superannuation of non-teaching employees had not been considered by the Regulation Committee. He pleaded that the age of superannuation of non-teaching staff should also be recommended for enhancement from 60 to 65 years as had been done in the case of teachers.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar stated that he was thankful that the proposal for enhancement in the age of superannuation of teachers had come to this House. The apprehension expressed by Dr. D.P.S. Randhawa that with the enhancement in the age of superannuation of teachers would lead to unemployment and unrest amongst the youth, did not carry much weight as in most of the universities in the country the age of retirement of teachers was 65 years. Majority of the young teachers were leaving this University and joining those universities where the age of superannuation was 65 years, e.g. Central Universities, Universities situated in the States of Bihar, Andhra Pradesh, etc. In this way, the University was deprived of their valuable services. In fact, nobody was obliging the teachers by recommending enhancement in their age of superannuation. The plea that a number of eligible youth were not getting employment opportunities was

not true as they did not find qualified candidates for filling up the vacant positions in the affiliated Colleges when they went there as experts on the Selection Committees. If they wanted, a survey should be conducted to ascertain as to how much eligible human resources were available for appointment as teachers so that this step should not be considered as a populist demand across the board. They should also look at the guidelines of the Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India, wherein the age of superannuation of University teachers had been enhanced from 60 to 65 years.

The Vice-Chancellor stated that a Pay Review Committee of the University Grants Commission headed by Dr. G.K. Chadha visited various parts of the country and interacted with the teachers. After looking into all the problems of the teachers, the Committee had made its recommendations. Similarly, the Panjab University had also looked into the problems of migration of its teachers to other universities, especially to the recently established a large number of Private Universities in the region, the University had decided to recommend enhancement in the age of superannuation of teachers from 60 to 65 years so that they could keep their intelligentsia here. Once the enhancement in the age of teaching staff is approved, the matter regarding enhancement age of non-teaching staff would be taken up.

Dr. V.K. Tewari stated that Dr. D.P.S. Randhawa had made a very cogent argument. In 1996 when pay revision for University and College teachers was done, the age of superannuation was raised from 60 to 62 years which was implemented by certain States like Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and some other States, but not by the Punjab and Haryana. The Pay Revision Committee of the University Grants Commission headed by Dr. G.K. Chadha, after taking into consideration all the factors relating to academic standards in the universities and colleges, high record of vacant positions (more than 50%) and the embargo imposed by many State Governments on filling up of vacant posts of teachers, had recommended enhancement in the age of superannuation of the teachers from 60 years to 65 years. He further stated that in July 2006, when Shri Sunil Kumar, called him, he as the President, AIFUCTO, had argued with him that the enhancement in the age of superannuation to 62 years would lead to unemployment, but he had reasoned that majority of the teachers might leave the universities and colleges for joining private institutions which are coming up in large number in the States. That was the most crucial time and Government of India decided to raise the age of superannuation of the teachers of the Central Funded Institutions. Now, with respect to unemployment policy of the Government, they had to make micro level planning for raising employment opportunities. At the same time all vacant positions in the University and affiliated Colleges should be filled up. As far as enhancement in the age of superannuation from 62 to 65 years is concerned, the Punjab Government should accept it immediately.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that as far as the issue whether the age of superannuation of teachers should be enhanced from 60 to 65 years or not is concerned, probably, the Senate had already adopted the University Grants Commission Notification in toto and in pursuance of that decision, now it is only amendment of Regulation, which was the job of the Regulation Committee. As far as enhancement in the age of superannuation of College teachers was concerned, he did not know why that was not taken? Once they had taken the decision to follow the University Grants Commission in toto that included teachers of the Colleges as well. As per following provision of the Regulation 24 available at Page 33 of the P.U. Calendar Volume I, 2007, first the draft Regulations are to be considered/prepared by the Regulations Committee then the Syndicate and thereafter by the Senate:-

“24. In making Regulations under Section 31 of the Panjab University Act, 1947, the following procedure shall be followed:-

- (a) The Syndicate shall consider all amendments and draft regulations as recommended by the Regulations Committee and after making such alterations as it considers fit, shall submit the same to the Senate.
- (b) The Senate shall consider all amendments and draft regulations as recommended by Syndicate and may make such alterations as it considers fit. The decision of Senate along with the proposed amendments and regulations shall be forwarded to the Government for sanction...”

Whereas the Syndicate met today at 9.00 a.m. and the Regulations Committee at 11.00 a.m., i.e. after the meeting of the Syndicate. In this way, the Syndicate had been deprived of considering the recommendations of the Regulations Committee and making alterations/amendments therein. Moreover, the Regulations Committee had resolved that “the amendment of regulations passed by Regulations Committee in its meeting held on 3.2.2011 which is inconsonance with Section 31(i) which did not come to the Regulations Committee in its meeting held on 16.11.2011, whereas according to him those recommendations were not supposed to come again to the Regulations Committee.

On a point of order, Shri G.K. Chatrath stated that the Regulations Committee recommended amendments in the Regulations pertaining to enhancement in the age of superannuation of University teachers and Section 10(2) regarding term of the Vice-Chancellor and the same was considered and approved by the Syndicate earlier. In the meantime, a representation was received from the Principals and teachers of the non-Government affiliated Colleges that Regulation 7 at Page 172 relating to their age of superannuation should also be amended. That was the reason for calling the meeting of the Regulations Committee and the Vice-Chancellor was authorized by the Syndicate to take decision on the recommendations of the Regulations Committee, on behalf of the Syndicate.

The Vice-Chancellor said that, in order to be extra cautious so that no ambiguity remains on the issue, it was felt that the amendment should again be considered by the Regulations Committee.

The Vice-Chancellor said that a request signed by certain Fellows had been received that the Senate should resolve that the age of superannuation of Principals and Lecturers working in Punjab Government and U.T. Government Colleges should also be increased to 65 years. According to him, such a Resolution could not be passed by the Senate.

Shri Prabhjit Singh stated that the amendment in Regulations pertaining to age of superannuation from 60 to 65 years of University and College teachers should be approved, but the age of superannuation of non-teaching staff of the University and its affiliated Colleges should also be increased to 65 years.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that the Regulations Committee considered the letter written by Shri Prabhjit Singh relating to enhancement in the age of superannuation of non-teaching employees, but decided to not to make any amendment in the relevant Regulation.

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that that Regulations Committee considered his letter but did not give any reason for not making amendment in the Regulation pertaining to age of superannuation of non-teaching employees.

Shri Gopal Krishan Chatrath clarified that the University Grants Commission directives/guidelines were only for the teaching staff. He stated in the previous meeting of the Senate, the Vice-Chancellor in response of the statement of Dr. Akshaya Kumar had said that, if they wanted, the matter regarding enhancement in the age of superannuation of University teachers would be again placed before the Regulations Committee, Syndicate and Senate.

Shri Ashok Goyal stated that they should also keep in mind that Section 72 of the Punjab Reorganization Act, 1966 had also been struck down by the Punjab and Haryana High Court in the case of Sahijdhari Sikhs. It was not that he was against enhancement in the age of superannuation of University and College teachers, his only concern was that proper procedure for amendment of Regulation should be followed so that no objection could be raised by the Government at a later stage. As per existing provision, the College teachers were supposed to retire on attaining the age of 60 years, but not on the last day of the month. Now, a clause is being added that they shall retire from the service on the afternoon of the last day of the month in which his/her retirement falls. He, therefore, proposed that such a clause should also be added in the Regulations pertaining to superannuation of University teachers that they shall retire on attaining the age of 65 years but on the last day of the month. He further proposed that the age of superannuation of non-teaching staff should also be enhanced on similar pattern by giving facts and reasons, especially keeping in view the fact that the strength of the non-teaching staff is going down day-by-day as they were unable to replace them by way of recruitments. The University authorities were compelled to engage the non-teaching employees even after their retirement. The apprehension that in case they enhance the age of superannuation age of non-teaching employees, it would put hurdle in the case of teachers, is ill-founded. Because when in the year 1998, the enhancement in the age of superannuation of both teachers and non-teachers was proposed, the Government sent back the amendment in the case of non-teaching staff within few months but in the case of teachers it took more than two years. He, therefore, pleaded that the amendment in Regulations regarding enhancement in the age of superannuation of all the three sections involved should be sent to the Government collectively and they should try their level best to get the same approved by the Government.

Shri V.K. Tewari endorsed the viewpoint expressed by Shri Ashok Goyal that the age of superannuation of non-teaching employees should also be enhanced to 65 years as was being done in the case of teachers.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar said that they should not make it a populist move and let nobody get enhancement in the age of superannuation. He reminded that there are guidelines of the University Grants Commission for enhancement in the age of

superannuation of teachers and the University had already adopted them in toto. Under that particular Clause, they are seeking enhancement in the age of superannuation of teachers from 60 years to 65 years. He apprehended that in case the amendment in the age of superannuation of teachers in the University and its affiliated Colleges and non-teaching staff was sent collectively, the entire project would fall flat.

Dr. Gurmeet Singh said that whenever the proposed amendment in the Regulations pertaining to enhancement in the age of superannuation would be approved, it would be approved with the concurrence of the Punjab Government, which was not so easy.

Dr. M. Shakeel Khan pleaded that the age of superannuation of non-teaching employees should also be enhanced from 60 years to 65 years on the pattern of teachers.

RESOLVED: To recommend that amendment in Section 10(2) of the Act at page 4 and Regulation 17.3, Chapter VI(A), at page 133 and Regulation 7, Chapter VIII(E) at page 172 of Panjab University Calendar, Volume I, 2007, be made as under:

Shri Prabhjit Singh said that a Project Officer, who was not eligible, was being re-designated as Assistant Professor. Moreover, from which date he was being re-designated as Assistant Professor was not being disclosed.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the item be approved, subject to verification of records by Dr. Dinesh Talwar.

This was agreed to.

Ms. Jasvir Kaur Chahal said that since a great injustice had been done to Ms. Daizy Zarabi, her case should be considered favourably.

Principal Tejinder Kaur stated that inspite of Ms. Daizy Zarabi being appointed on probation, she was not allowed to join by the Head of the Department. Since Ms. Daizy

Zarabi had already suffered a lot, no further harassment should be meted out to her. She pleaded that her case should be considered favourably.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the matter would be looked into.

XLV. The recommendation of the Syndicate contained in **Item C-102 on the agenda** was read out, viz. –

C-102 That the change in nomenclature of the University Constituent College, Balachaur, as “Baba Balraj Panjab University Constituent College, Balachaur” be approved.

The Vice-Chancellor said that the nomenclature of the Constituent College was being changed on the direction of the Punjab Government. In future, P.U. would be prefixed in the nomenclature of all the University Institutions, except Dr. Harvansh Singh Judge Institute of Dental Sciences & Hospital where the University had signed an agreement with the donor.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar said that proper procedure should be followed for changing the nomenclature of any P.U. Institution like constituting a Committee for the purpose. If the House decided to approve the change in nomenclature of the University Constituent College, Balachaur, as “Baba Balraj Panjab University Constituent College, Balachaur”, his dissent be recorded.

RESOLVED: That the recommendation of the Syndicate contained in Item C-102 on the agenda, be approved.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar recorded his dissent with the remarks that the name of the Constituent College of the University could not be changed in such a manner.

Dr. Ravinder Kumar Sharma pleaded that the problem of Ms. Mukesh Lata, a candidate for Ph.D. degree, in the Faculty of Languages, should be solved.

Dr. Akshaya Kumar stated that he had seen all the papers, including the representation of the student and her Supervisor. Even if the supervisor of the candidate needed to be changed, it should be done only after taking into confidence the Supervisor as well as the Head of the Department. Do not by-pass the Supervisor; otherwise, the entire system would be sabotized.

On a point of order, Dr. D.P.S. Randhawa stated that the girl was running pillar to post for the last one year to get her Ph.D. thesis submitted in the office of the University. But the Supervisor of the candidate was using her and some other students for political reasons for making complaint against certain other staff members. Why the poor girl, whose father is a cancer patient and presently admitted in the P.G.I.M.E.R., Chandigarh, was being harassed by the Supervisor?

The Vice-Chancellor stated that, the moment he got the complaint, the student also came to him and he called the Supervisor. He talked to the Supervisor and tried to persuade him, but the Supervisor said that he was not going to check her thesis. Thereafter, he along with Dean of University Instruction, talked to the Chairperson and

tried their level best to persuade the Supervisor, but no solution could be found out. He, however, hoped that, keeping in view the sentiments of the members, they along with President, PUTA, would again try and might be able to sort out the problem. But the question was that the Supervisor says that since the girl had not worked, how he could sign her progress reports, whereas the girl says that she had worked under him. As per Regulations/Rules of the University, the candidate was supposed/required to submit six monthly progress reports. Why the six monthly progress reports were not submitted after every six months?

Dr. Akshaya Kumar suggested that a Committee comprising senior Senators and Head of the Department should be constituted to thrash out the problem. He added there were instances where the students had harassed the Supervisors by black-mailing them.

Professor Rupinder Tewari said that in view of the treatment meted out to the girl, if she committed something wrong, who would be responsible. He, therefore, suggested that the issue should be solved within a stipulated time without going into the details as to who was at fault.

Professor Pam Rajput said that since a girl is involved in this case, a female member should be appointed as a member of the Committee.

Professor Shelley Walia said that they could not take a decision after listening to the girl alone. Many times, the students did not work. As such, they should also listen to the viewpoints of the Supervisor concerned.

After some further discussion, it was –
